AN ACT to amend the penal law and the general business law, in relation to establishing a waiting period before a firearm, shotgun or rifle may be delivered to a person

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Subdivision 12 of section 400.00 of the penal law, as 1 Section 1. 2 amended by chapter 1 of the laws of 2013, is amended to read as follows: 3 12. Records required of gunsmiths and dealers in firearms. Any person 4 licensed as gunsmith or dealer in firearms shall keep a record book 5 approved as to form, except in the city of New York, by the superintenб dent of state police. In the record book shall be entered at the time of 7 every transaction involving a firearm the date, name, age, occupation 8 and residence of any person from whom a firearm is received or to whom a 9 firearm is delivered, and the calibre, make, model, manufacturer's name serial number, or if none, any other distinguishing number or iden-10 and tification mark on such firearm. Before delivering a firearm to any 11 person, the licensee shall require him to produce either a license valid 12 13 under this section to carry or possess the same, or proof of lawful authority as an exempt person pursuant to section 265.20 OF THIS CHAPTER 14 15 AND EITHER (A) THE NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM (NICS) OR ITS SUCCESSOR HAS ISSUED A "PROCEED" RESPONSE TO THE LICENSEE, 16 17 (B) TEN BUSINESS DAYS HAVE ELAPSED SINCE THE DATE THE LICENSEE OR 18 CONTACTED NICS TO INITIATE A NATIONAL INSTATE CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK 19 AND NICS HAS NOT NOTIFIED THE LICENSEE THAT THE TRANSFER OF THE FIREARM 20 TO SUCH PERSON SHOULD BE DENIED. In addition, before delivering a 21 firearm to a peace officer, the licensee shall verify that person's status as a peace officer with the division of state police. After 22 completing the foregoing, the licensee shall 23 remove and retain the 24 attached coupon and enter in the record book the date of such license, 25 number, if any, and name of the licensing officer, in the case of the 26 holder of a license to carry or possess, or the shield or other number, 27 any, assignment and department, unit or agency, in the case of an if

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exempt person. The original transaction report shall be forwarded to the 1 2 division of state police within ten days of delivering a firearm to anv 3 person, and a duplicate copy shall be kept by the licensee. The super-4 intendent of state police may designate that such record shall be 5 completed and transmitted in electronic form. A dealer may be granted a б waiver from transmitting such records in electronic form if the super-7 intendent determines that such dealer is incapable of such transmission 8 to technological limitations that are not reasonably within the due 9 control of the dealer, or other exceptional circumstances demonstrated 10 the dealer, pursuant to a process established in regulation, and at by the discretion of the superintendent. Records assembled or collected for 11 purposes of inclusion in the database created pursuant to section 400.02 12 13 of this article shall not be subject to disclosure pursuant to article 14 six of the public officers law. The record book shall be maintained on 15 the premises mentioned and described in the license and shall be open at all reasonable hours for inspection by any peace officer, acting pursu-16 to his special duties, or police officer. In the event of cancella-17 ant tion or revocation of the license for gunsmith or dealer in firearms, or 18 discontinuance of business by a licensee, such record book shall 19 be 20 immediately surrendered to the licensing officer in the city of New 21 York, and in the counties of Nassau and Suffolk, and elsewhere in the 22 state to the executive department, division of state police.

23 S 2. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 400.20 to read 24 as follows:

25 S 400.20 WAITING PERIOD IN CONNECTION WITH THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF A 26 RIFLE OR SHOTGUN.

27 WHEN A NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK IS REQUIRED PURSUANT 28 LAW TO BE CONDUCTED THROUGH THE NATIONAL INSTANT ТΟ STATE OR FEDERAL 29 CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM (NICS) OR ITS SUCCESSOR IN CONNECTION SALE OR TRANSFER OF A RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO ANY PERSON, BEFORE 30 THE WITH DELIVERING A RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO SUCH PERSON, EITHER (A) NICS HAS ISSUED 31 32 A "PROCEED" RESPONSE TO THE SELLER OR TRANSFEROR, OR (B) TENBUSINESS 33 THEDAYS SHALL HAVE ELAPSED SINCE DATE THESELLER OR TRANSFEROR 34 CONTACTED NICS TO INITIATE A NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK 35 AND NICS HAS NOT NOTIFIED THE SELLER OR TRANSFEROR THAT THE TRANSFER OF THE RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO SUCH PERSON SHOULD BE DENIED. 36

37 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 897 of the general business law, as added by chapter 189 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows: 38 1. A national instant criminal background check shall be conducted and 39 40 no person shall sell or transfer a firearm, rifle or shotgun at a gun show, except in accordance with the provisions of 41 18 U.S.C. 922(t), THAT BEFORE DELIVERING A FIREARM, 42 RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO ANY PROVIDED PERSON, EITHER (A) THE NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM 43 44 (NICS) OR ITS SUCCESSOR HAS ISSUED A "PROCEED" RESPONSE TO THE SELLER OR 45 TRANSFEROR, OR (B) TEN BUSINESS DAYS SHALL HAVE ELAPSED SINCE THE DATE 46 OR TRANSFEROR CONTACTED NICS TO INITIATE A NATIONAL INSTANT THE SELLER 47 CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK AND NICS HAS NOT NOTIFIED THE SELLER OR 48 TRANSFEROR THAT THE TRANSFER OF THE FIREARM, RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO SUCH 49 PERSON SHOULD BE DENIED.

50 S 4. Subdivisions 1 and 2 of section 898 of the general business law, 51 as added by chapter 1 of the laws of 2013, are amended to read as 52 follows:

1. In addition to any other requirements pursuant to state and feder-4 al law, all sales, exchanges or disposals of firearms, rifles or shot-55 guns shall be conducted in accordance with this section unless such 56 sale, exchange or disposal is conducted by a licensed importer, licensed

manufacturer or licensed dealer, as those terms are defined in 18 USC S 1 2 922, when such sale, exchange or disposal is conducted pursuant to that 3 person's federal firearms license or such sale, exchange or disposal is 4 between members of an immediate family. WHEN A SALE, EXCHANGE OR 5 DISPOSAL IS CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO A PERSON'S FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSE, 6 BEFORE DELIVERING A FIREARM, RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO ANY PERSON, EITHER (A) 7 THE NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK SYSTEM (NICS) OR ITS 8 SUCCESSOR HAS ISSUED A "PROCEED" RESPONSE TO THE FEDERAL FIREARMS LICEN-TEN BUSINESS DAYS SHALL HAVE ELAPSED SINCE THE DATE THE 9 SEE, OR (B) 10 FEDERAL FIREARMS LICENSEE CONTACTED NICS TO INITIATE A NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK AND NICS HAS NOT NOTIFIED THE FEDERAL FIREARMS 11 12 THAT THE TRANSFER OF THE FIREARM, RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO SUCH LICENSEE For purposes of this section, "immediate fami-13 PERSON SHOULD BE DENIED. 14 ly" shall mean spouses, domestic partners, children and step-children. 15 2. Before any sale, exchange or disposal pursuant to this article, a

national instant criminal background check must be completed by a dealer 16 17 consents to conduct such check, and upon completion of such backwho ground check, shall complete a document, the form of which 18 shall be 19 approved by the superintendent of state police, that identifies and confirms that such check was performed. BEFORE A DEALER WHO CONSENTS TO 20 CONDUCT A NATIONAL INSTANT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK DELIVERS A FIREARM, 21 22 RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO ANY PERSON, EITHER (A) NICS ISSUED A "PROCEED" 23 THE DEALER, OR (B) TEN BUSINESS DAYS SHALL HAVE ELAPSED RESPONSE то 24 SINCE THE DATE THE DEALER CONTACTED NICS TO INITIATE A NATIONAL INSTANT 25 BACKGROUND CHECK AND NICS HAS NOT NOTIFIED THE DEALER THAT THE CRIMINAL 26 TRANSFER OF THE FIREARM, RIFLE OR SHOTGUN TO SUCH PERSON SHOULD BE 27 DENIED.

28 S 5. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 29 have become a law.
