AN ACT to amend chapter 54 of the laws of 2017 enacting the Capital Projects budget, in relation to making technical corrections thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 54 of the laws of 2017, enacting the  
2 Capital Projects budget, is amended by adding to such section the items  
3 underscored in this section.

9 Water Resources Purpose

10 The sum of \$2,500,000,000 is hereby appro-  
11 priated for the capital costs of clean  
12 water infrastructure projects, including  
13 services, expenses, and indirect costs, as  
14 follows: not less than \$1,000,000,000 to  
15 the environmental facilities corporation  
16 for projects authorized by the New York  
17 state water infrastructure improvement act  
18 of 2017; not less than \$150,000,000 to the  
19 environmental facilities corporation for  
20 New York state intermunicipal water  
21 infrastructure projects pursuant to  
22 section 1285-s of the public authorities  
23 law; not less than \$245,000,000 for water  
24 quality improvement projects, including

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1 nonagricultural nonpoint source abatement  
2 and control projects, municipal wastewater  
3 treatment projects, and municipal separate  
4 storm sewer system projects, and including  
5 up to \$25,000,000 of such amount for  
6 projects for the proper management of road  
7 salt; up to \$50,000,000 for green infras-  
8 tructure projects; \$110,000,000 for land  
9 acquisition projects for source water  
10 protection pursuant to title 33 of article  
11 15 of the environmental conservation law,  
12 including suballocation to the department  
13 of agriculture and markets; up to  
14 \$50,000,000 for suballocation to the  
15 department of agriculture and markets for  
16 state assistance payments, services, and  
17 expenses to soil and water conservation  
18 districts for the cost of water quality  
19 protection projects awarded on a compet-  
20 itive basis prioritizing financial need  
21 and hardship, intended to assist concen-  
22 trated animal feeding operations; up to  
23 \$130,000,000 for transfer to the hazardous  
24 waste remedial fund for the remediation of  
25 sites; not less than \$20,000,000 for  
26 suballocation to the department of health  
27 for replacement of lead drinking water  
28 service lines pursuant to section 1114 of  
29 the public health law; \$200,000,000 for  
30 New York City for water quality projects  
31 located within the New York City  
32 watershed; not less than \$75,000,000 to  
33 the environmental facilities corporation  
34 for a program to upgrade or replace septic  
35 systems and cesspools pursuant to section  
36 1285-u of the public authorities law; up  
37 to \$10,000,000 to the environmental facil-  
38 ities corporation for water infrastructure  
39 emergency assistance pursuant to section  
40 1285-t of the public authorities law;  
41 \$100,000,000 to the environmental facili-  
42 ties corporation to support municipal  
43 water quality infrastructure programs  
44 which may otherwise not qualify for state  
45 support, or may require additional state  
46 support; not less than \$50,000,000 for the  
47 exploration and development of a new  
48 source of drinking water for the village  
49 of Hoosick Falls and the town of Peters-  
50 burgh; and up to \$10,000,000 for the  
51 development of information technology  
52 systems related to water quality pursuant  
53 to section 3-0315 of the environmental  
54 conservation law (09CW1757) ..... 2,500,000,000  
55 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately; and shall be deemed to  
56 have been in full force and effect on and after April 1, 2017.
