Introduced by M. of A. STEC -- read once and referred to the Committee on Higher Education

AN ACT to authorize certain health care professionals licensed to practice in other jurisdictions to practice in this state in connection with an event sanctioned by the World Triathlon Corporation; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, any  
2 person who is licensed or certified to practice as a physician, physi-  
3 cian's assistant, massage therapist, physical therapist, chiropractor,  
4 dentist, optometrist, nurse, nurse practitioner, emergency medical tech-  
5 nician or podiatrist in another state or territory, who is in good  
6 standing in such state or territory and who has been appointed by the  
7 World Triathlon Corporation to provide professional services at an event  
8 in this state sanctioned by the World Triathlon Corporation, may provide  
9 such professional services to athletes and team personnel registered to  
10 train at a location in this state or registered to compete in an event  
11 conducted under the sanction of the World Triathlon Corporation in the  
12 state without first being licensed pursuant to the provisions of title 8  
13 of the education law or certified pursuant to the provisions of the  
14 public health law, as may be applicable. Such services shall be provided  
15 only four days before through one day after each of the following  
16 events:  
17 a. Ironman Lake Placid scheduled to be held on July 22, 2018; and  
18 b. Ironman 70.3 Lake Placid scheduled to be held on September 9, 2018.  
19 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be  
20 deemed repealed September 11, 2018.
