WHEREAS, After leaving school at the young age of 17, Doris O. Dusharm worked part-time at the Harrisville Paper Mill; on January 13, 1936, she happily married her husband, Vernon Dusharm, and together the couple had five wonderful children; and

WHEREAS, This exceptional centenarian, with her zest for life, has inspired and enhanced the lives of her family and friends; and

WHEREAS, With her throughout has been her son and next-door neighbor, Paul, nine grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, and three great-great-grandchildren, as well as numerous nieces and nephews, all of whom feel privileged to be a part of her life and rejoice in her accomplishments; and

WHEREAS, This distinguished woman has experienced the incredible joys and sorrows characteristic of and reserved for those with the stamina and courage to savor a full life; and
