AN ACT to amend the public officers law, in relation to eliminating the residency requirement for the chief animal law enforcement officer of a society for the prevention of cruelty to animals and for the peace officers employed thereby

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 3-b of the public officers law is amended by adding
2 a new subdivision 8 to read as follows:
3 8. Neither the provisions of this section or of any general, special
4 or local law, charter, code, ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation,
5 requiring a person to be a resident of the political subdivision or
6 municipal corporation of the state by which he or she is employed, shall
7 apply to a person employed by a duly incorporated society for the
8 prevention of cruelty to animals as the chief animal law enforcement
9 officer and persons duly appointed as peace officers of such society for
10 the prevention of cruelty to animals.
11 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
