AN ACT to amend the education law and the public health law, in relation to registration in the donate life registry

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 209-b
2	to read as follows:

4	try. The regents shall provide a space on each student's initial regis-
5	tration form so that the student may register in the New York state

21	§ 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 262-a to

Such organ, eye and tissue registration of consent to make an 8 (a) 9 anatomical gift can be made through: (i) indication made on the applica-10 tion or renewal form of a driver's license, (ii) indication made on a 11 non-driver identification card application or renewal form, (iii) indication made on a voter registration form pursuant to subdivision five of 12 13 section 5-210 of the election law, (iv) indication made on the applica-14 tion for health care coverage offered through the state health benefit exchange, (v) enrollment through the donate life registry website, (vi) 15 16 paper enrollment submitted to the donate life registry, [or] (vii) indi-17 cation made on the initial registration for a SUNY or CUNY school pursuant to section two hundred nine-b of the education law; (viii) indi-18 19 cation made on the application for a library card pursuant to section 20 two hundred sixty-two-a the education law, or (ix) through any other 21 method identified by the commissioner. The department shall establish a means by which to register the consent given by individuals who are 22 sixteen or seventeen years of age in the donate life registry, and shall 23 24 make registration available by any of the methods provided in subpara-25 graphs (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v) [and], (vi), (vii), and (viii) of 26 this paragraph.

An interagency work group, composed of the commissioner, the 28 commissioner of the department of motor vehicles, a chair of the board 29 elections, a regent of The State University of New York, or their of designees, and such other individuals as may be designated by the 30 31 commissioner, shall be established to meet with the contractor annually 32 and as needed to review the status of the donate life registry, to exam-33 ine the steps that might be taken by state agencies to enhance its 34 performance and to make recommendations to the contractor.

This act shall take effect immediately, provided that the amendments to paragraph (a) of subdivision 5 of section 4310 of the public 51 52 health law made by section four of this act shall be subject to the 53 expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 6 of 54 chapter 465 of the laws of 2012, as amended, when upon such date the 55 provisions of section five of this act shall take effect.
