AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to the powers and duties of the veterans' affairs commission

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Legislative intent. The legislature hereby recognizes that 1 2 New York state's veterans, particularly those who suffered service-related disabilities, have unique needs as a result of the sacrifices they made during their military service. It is also hereby acknowledged by 5 the legislature that due to the complexity of their needs, such individuals require accessible, coordinated, and specialized services within 7 their communities from multiple state and local agencies. The legislature finds that there is an immediate need for a statewide comprehensive program to coordinate such services. 9

10 § 2. Subdivision 5 of section 352 of the executive law, as amended by 11 chapter 501 of the laws of 1993, is amended and a new subdivision 6 is 12 added to read as follows:

 - (i) assist the state director in the formulation of policies affecting veterans: [and in the]
- 17 (ii) assist the state director in coordination of all operations of 18 state agencies relating to veterans' affairs[-];
- 19 (iii) promote the implementation of a comprehensive statewide program 20 of coordinated services for service-disabled veterans that includes: (a) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services and 22 facilities, (b) health, medical and rehabilitation services, (c) employ-

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1 ment and re-employment services, (d) housing options, (e) transportation options, (f) long term care options, (g) personal care, (h) day program service options, (i) family outreach and (j) other essential services 3 4 that maximize existing resources;

- (iv) to disseminate general information about available services to service-disabled veterans and how such services may be accessed; and
- (v) to conduct on an ongoing evaluation of the needs of service disabled veterans.
- 6. The chairperson shall provide a report to the governor and the senate committee on veterans, homeland security and military affairs, 10 and the assembly committee on veterans' affairs annually by March first. 11
- § 3. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 12 13 have become a law; provided, however, that effective immediately, the 14 addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary 15 for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized 16 and directed to be made and completed on or before such effective date.
