AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to tanning facilities

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3550 of the public health law, as added by chapter 378 of the laws of 1990, is amended to read as follows:

3 § 3550. Definitions. When used in this article, the following words 4 and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:

5 1. "Tanning facility" shall mean any establishment where one or more 6 ultraviolet radiation device is used, offered, or made available for use 7 by any human being, [for which] whether or not a fee is charged, direct-8 ly or indirectly, but shall not include any facility where any such 9 device is used by a qualified health care professional for treatment of 10 medical conditions.

11 2. "Ultraviolet radiation device" shall mean any equipment which is 12 designed to emit electromagnetic radiation in the wavelength interval of 13 two hundred to four hundred nanometers in air, and which is intended to 14 induce tanning of the human skin through irradiation, including, but not 15 limited to, a sunlamp, tanning booth, or tanning bed.

16 3. "Person" shall mean an individual, corporation, partnership, joint 17 venture, or any business entity.

18 § 2. Section 3555 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 105 19 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

20 § 3555. Restrictions on the use of ultraviolet radiation devices. 1. 21 No owner, operator, or employee of a tanning facility shall permit the 22 use of the tanning facility by a person eighteen years of age or older 23 until such person provides a driver's license or other photographic

identification card issued by a government entity or educational insti-1 2 tution indicating that the individual is at least eighteen years of age and the facility has on file a signed written statement, in a form 3 4 prescribed by the commissioner, acknowledging that such person has read 5 the warnings required under subdivision two of section thirty-five б hundred fifty-four of this article and agrees to wear safety goggles 7 before using an ultraviolet radiation device. Such signed statement of 8 acknowledgment may be retained by the tanning facility off premises 9 provided that an electronic image or facsimile of the original signed 10 statement of acknowledgment is readily available by the owner or employ-11 ee responsible for the operation of the ultraviolet radiation device of 12 such facility.

13 2. No owner, operator, or employee of a tanning facility shall permit 14 the use of an ultraviolet radiation device by a person [seventeen to] under eighteen years of age [until such person provides the tanning 15 16 facility with the written consent, in a form prescribed by the commissioner, of a parent or legal guardian to use such tanning facility. The 17 parent or legal guardian shall sign such consent form in the presence of 18 the owner of the tanning facility or an employee responsible for the 19 20 operation of the ultraviolet radiation device of such facility indicat-21 ing that such parent or guardian has read the warnings required under 22 subdivision two of section thirty-five hundred fifty-four of this artiele and that the person seventeen to eighteen years of age agrees to 23 wear safety goggles before using an ultraviolet radiation device. Such 24 25 original written consent shall be retained by the tanning facility for a 26 period of twelve months and may be retained off premises provided that an electronic image or facsimile of the original signed consent form is 27 28 readily available by the owner or employee responsible for the operation 29 of the ultraviolet radiation device of such facility.

30 3. A written consent form signed by a parent or legal guardian pursu-31 ant to subdivision two of this section shall expire twelve months from the date it is signed by the parent or legal guardian. Upon the expira-32 33 tion of a written congent form, a new written congent shall be provided in the manner prescribed in subdivision two of this section prior to the 34 35 use of an ultraviolet radiation device by any person seventeen to eigh-36 teen years of age. 4. No owner, operator, or employee of a tanning facility shall permit 37 38 the use of an ultraviolet radiation device by persons sixteen years of

39 age and under].

40 3. This section shall be exclusive and shall preempt any contrary 41 local law or ordinance, except that this section shall not preempt or 42 supersede local laws or ordinances imposing additional stricter 43 restrictions on the use and operation of ultraviolet radiation devices 44 at tanning facilities which are in effect prior to the effective date of 45 this section.

46 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
