AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to granting the attorney-general jurisdiction to investigate and prosecute police misconduct

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 63 of the executive law is amended by adding a new subdivision 17 to read as follows:

2 3 17. Investigate the alleged commission of any criminal offense or offenses by a police officer as defined in subdivision seven of section eight hundred thirty-five of this chapter, whether or not in connection with the performance of his or her official duties, and prosecute any such person or persons believed to have committed such criminal offense 8 or offenses. In all such proceedings, the attorney-general may appear in 9 person, or by his or her deputy or assistant, before any court or grand jury thereof and exercise all of the powers and perform all of the 10 duties with respect to such actions or proceedings which a district 11 attorney would otherwise be authorized or required to exercise or 12 13 perform, provided however that the court and/or grand jury not be 14 located within the county where the criminal offense is alleged to have occurred. In any of such actions or proceedings, the district attorney 15 for the county where the criminal offense is alleged to have occurred 16 and the district attorney for the county in which the court is located 17 18 shall only exercise such powers and perform such duties as are required 19 of him or her by the attorney-general or the deputy or assistant attor-20 ney-general so attending. In all such proceedings, all expenses incurred 21 by the attorney-general, including the salary or other compensation of all deputies and assistants employed, shall be a charge against the 22 23 county where the matter would otherwise have been prosecuted.

24 § 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 25 have become a law.
