AN ACT to amend the military law, in relation to in-state tuition continuity for spouses and children of active duty service members

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 8 of section 1 of the military law, as amended
2 by chapter 112 of the laws of 1989, is amended to read as follows:

3 8. The terms "active military service of the United States" and "in
4 the armed forces of the United States" shall mean full time duty in the
5 army, navy (including marine corps), air force (including space force)
6 or coast guard of the United States.

7 § 2. Section 253 of the military law, as amended by chapter 473 of the
8 laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

9 § 253. Military service by parent; effect on child custody
10 proceedings; in-state tuition continuity. 1. Notwithstanding any law,
11 rule or regulation to the contrary, child custody proceedings filed in a
12 court of competent jurisdiction in this state, involving a parent who is
13 activated, deployed, or temporarily assigned to military service shall
14 be governed by subdivision (f) of section six hundred fifty-one of the
15 family court act, section seventy-five-1 or paragraph (a-2) of subdivi-
16 sion one of section two hundred forty of the domestic relations law.

17 2. A spouse or child of a member of the active military service of the
18 United States who has been assigned to duty elsewhere immediately
19 following assignment to duty in New York shall be deemed to be an
20 in-state resident for the purposes of determining tuition and fees at
21 all state institutions of higher learning, and is entitled to pay the
22 tuition fees and other fees or charges provided for New York residents
23 as long as the spouse or child resides continuously in New York and
24 remains enrolled at such institution.

25 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
