AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to a veteran health care navigator program

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1	Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 361-a
2	to read as follows:
3	<u>§ 361-a. Veteran health care navigator program. 1. The division shall</u>
4	undertake a study regarding development and implementation of a veteran
5	health care navigator program as provided in this section. Such study
б	shall be completed and reported to the legislature on or before December
7	<u>thirty-first, two thousand twenty-two.</u>
8	2. The veteran health care navigator program shall employ an adequate
9	number of veteran health care navigators. Navigators shall be defined as
10	full-time employees of the division who have direct knowledge of the
11	veteran communities they serve. Their role shall include efforts to:
12	(a) increase access by veterans and their families to health care
13	<u>coverage and services;</u>
14	(b) leverage existing resources and structures in areas where veterans
15	and their families are able to easily access such resources;
16	(c) ensure the needs of veterans and their families are incorporated
17	in all state efforts to expand access to affordable, quality health
18	care; and
19	(d) ensure veterans and their families have access to mental health
20	treatment, including for post-traumatic stress disorder, depression, and
21	suicide prevention.
22	3. The program, when implemented, shall provide the following duties
23	<u>for veteran health care navigators:</u>
24	(a) identifying all federal and other health benefits, coverage, and
25	<u>services available to veterans and their families;</u>

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1	(b) coordinating with other local, state, and federal departments and
2	agencies, health care providers, and health insurance programs to help
3	veterans and their beneficiaries apply for coverage under such programs,
4	including helping veterans overcome barriers within the health care
5	system, to ensure enrollment in health plans and effective delivery and
6	coordination of health services;
7	(c) ensuring that access to mental health coverage, services, and
8	treatment is a primary focus of their activities under the program;
9	(d) connecting veterans to trained mental health care providers,
10	including those trained in veteran suicide prevention; and
11	(e) carrying out such other duties as the state director may assign
12	under the program.
13	4. Upon implementation of the program under this section, when carry-
14	ing out their duties under the program, the division and the veteran
15	health care navigators shall coordinate and collaborate with other rele-
16	vant local, state and federal departments and agencies, including, but
17	not limited to state and local veteran's service agencies and local
18	veterans' committees, and the U.S. department of health and human
19	services.
20	5. As part of the study, the division shall also, in consultation with
21	the federal department of health and human services, conduct an examina-
22	tion of all existing health care and veterans' programs to:
23	(a) evaluate whether the needs of veterans and their families are met
24	by such programs;
25	(b) determine any necessary and appropriate steps that could be taken
26	to increase access to affordable, quality health care, including by rule
27	and regulation pursuant to existing statutory authority, or through new
28	legislation; and
29	(c) evaluate how the veteran health care navigator program proposed
30	under this section could improve access to affordable, quality health
31	care for veterans and their families
