AN ACT to amend the public health law, the social services law, and the general business law, in relation to children's non-regulated camps

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2 1394-d to read as follows:

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§ 1394-d. Requirement to check sex offender registry. Every person, 4 firm, limited liability company, association and corporation which operates a children's non-regulated camp as defined in section three hundred ninety-eight-f of the general business law shall be required to ascertain whether an employee or volunteer is listed on the state sex offender registry pursuant to article six-C of the correction law prior to the day such employee or volunteer commences work at such camp and annually thereafter prior to their arrival at such camp.

- § 2. Subdivision 1 of section 424-a of the social services law is 11 12 amended by adding a new paragraph (d-2) to read as follows:
- 13 (d-2) Every person, firm, limited liability company, association and 14 operation which operates a camp that falls under the provisions of article thirteen-B of the public health law or a children's non-regulated 15 camp as defined in section three hundred ninety-eight-f of the general 16 17 business law, for every employee or volunteer, prior to the employment 18 start date, shall inquire of the office of children and family services, 19 and the office shall, upon receipt of such inquiry and subject to the 20 provisions of paragraph (b) or (e) of this subdivision inform such and 21 the subject of the inquiry whether any person who is actively being 22 considered for employment and who will have the potential for regular 23 and substantial contact with children is the subject of an indicated

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child abuse and maltreatment report on file with the statewide central register of child abuse and maltreatment.

- § 3. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 398-f of the general business law, as added by chapter 103 of the laws of 2019, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) No person, firm, corporation or association shall enroll or allow participation of a child in a children's non-regulated camp unless the parent or guardian of the child has been provided with the following written notice on the application or enrollment form:
- 10 "This camp is not regulated or inspected by the New York State Depart-11 ment of Health and is not required to obtain a Department of Health 12 permit. This camp is not required to follow Department of Health regulations, including, [ehecking the state sex offender registry prior to 13 14 hiring staff; maintaining minimum staff-to-child ratios; hiring medical 15 personnel; or reporting injuries or illnesses to the Department of 16 Health."
- § 4. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 18 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-19 tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and 20 21 completed on or before such effective date.
