AN ACT to amend the correction law and the penal law, in relation to the early release of incarcerated individuals

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

## 1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "earned 2 time act". 3 § 2. The correction law is amended by adding a new section 802 to read 4 as follows: 5 § 802. Data collection. The department shall report annually to the governor and the legislature with respect to each instance in which time б 7 allowance credit has been withheld, forfeited or cancelled. The report 8 shall provide the following information: the name, department identifi-9 cation number and race of each incarcerated individual who has been denied credit and the amount of credit involved, the reason or reasons 10 11 for the denial, including, where applicable, a description of the bad behavior or institutional rule violation or violations (including the 12 13 corresponding numerical code in the department's inmate rule handbook), 14 and, where applicable, a description of the assigned duty and/or iden-15 tification of assigned treatment program in which the incarcerated person was determined to have failed to perform properly. The report 16 shall additionally specify the department facility in which the recom-17 mendation to withhold, forfeit or cancel good time was made and the names of the department personnel on such facility's time allowance 18 19 20 committee who made such recommendation.

§ 3. Section 803 of the correction law, as amended by chapter 3 of the laws of 1995, paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of subdivision 1 and subdivisions 3, 4, and 5 as amended by section 37 of subpart B of part C of chapter 62 of the laws of 2011, paragraph (d) of subdivision 1 and subdivision 2-a as added by chapter 738 of the laws of 2004, subpara-

6 § 803. Good behavior allowances against indeterminate and determinate 7 sentences. 1. (a) Every person confined in an institution of the depart-8 ment or a facility in the department of mental hygiene serving an inde-9 terminate or determinate sentence of imprisonment, except a person serv-10 ing a sentence with a maximum term of life imprisonment, [may] shall 11 receive <u>a</u> time allowance against the term or maximum term of his or her 12 sentence imposed by the court. Such allowances [may be granted for good behavior and efficient and willing performance of duties assigned or progress and achievement in an assigned treatment program, and may be 13 14 withheld, forfeited or canceled in whole or in part for bad behavior, 15 violation of institutional rules or failure to perform properly in the 16 17 duties or program assigned] shall be credited toward a person's sentence on an annual pro rata basis, and any credit awarded over the course of 18 the calendar year shall vest on the final day of the calendar year. Once 19 20 vested, such credit shall not be withheld, forfeited, or canceled.

21 (a-1) Time allowances that have not yet been credited toward a 22 person's sentence may be withheld, forfeited or canceled in whole or in part for violation of institutional rules, as demonstrated at a hearing 23 by a preponderance of the evidence. Such restrictions shall be limited 24 25 to the pro rata share of credit within the calendar year that the offense is committed. If such time allowance is withheld, forfeited or 26 27 canceled in whole or in part, further allowances, not to exceed the 28 allowances set forth in paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subdivision, may 29 be reinstated for good behavior and efficient and willing performance of 30 duties assigned or progress and achievement in an assigned treatment 31 program. Following any final determination withholding, forfeiting, or 32 canceling a time allowance, the incarcerated person shall have the right 33 to take an administrative appeal to the central office of the department 34 and shall be advised of the right to seek legal assistance in the taking of such appeal. The department shall adopt regulations in accordance 35 36 with this provision.

37 (b) A person serving an indeterminate sentence of imprisonment [may]
38 shall receive a time allowance against the maximum term of his or her
39 sentence [not to exceed one-third] of one-half of the maximum term
40 imposed by the court.

(c) A person serving a determinate sentence of imprisonment [may] **shall** receive <u>a</u> time allowance against the term of his or her sentence **a** [not to exceed one-seventh] of one-half of the term imposed by the
court.

(d) (i) [Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, every] Every person under the custody of the department or confined in a facility in the department of mental hygiene serving an indeterminate sentence of imprisonment with a minimum period of one year or more or a determinate sentence of imprisonment of one year or more [imposed pursuant to section 70.70 or 70.71 of the penal law,] may earn a merit time allowance.

52 (ii) [Such merit time allowance shall not be available to any person 53 serving an indeterminate sentence authorized for an A-I felony offense, 54 other than an A-I felony offense defined in article two hundred twenty 55 of the penal law, or any sentence imposed for a violent felony offense 56 as defined in section 70.02 of the penal law, manslaughter in the second 1

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vehigular manslaughter degree, in the second degree, vehicular manslaughter in the first degree, criminally negligent homicide, an offense defined in article one hundred thirty of the penal law, incest, an offense defined in article two hundred sixty-three of the penal law, or aggravated harassment of an employee by an incarcerated individ-(iii) The merit time allowance credit against the minimum period of the indeterminate sentence shall be [one-sixth] one-half of the minimum period imposed by the court [except that such credit shall be one-third of the minimum period imposed by the court for an A-I felony offense defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal law]. In the case of such a determinate sentence, in addition to the time allowance credit authorized by paragraph (c) of this subdivision, the merit time allowance credited against the term of the determinate sentence pursuant to this paragraph shall be [one-seventh] one-quarter of the term imposed by the court. [(iii) Such merit time allowance [may] shall be granted when an incarcerated individual successfully participates in the work and treatment program assigned pursuant to section eight hundred five of this article [and], when such incarcerated individual obtains a general equivalency diploma, an alcohol and substance abuse treatment certificate, a vocational trade certificate following at least six months of

22 23 vocational programming, at least eighteen credits in a program registered by the state education department from a degree-granting higher 24 25 education institution or performs at least four hundred hours of service 26 as part of a community work crew, or successfully completes one or more 27 "significant programmatic accomplishments" as defined in paragraph (c) 28 of subdivision one of section eight hundred three-b of this article. 29 Once granted, such allowances shall not be withheld, forfeited, or 30 cancelled. Where the institution in which the incarcerated individual is 31 confined does not provide opportunities for every incarcerated individ-32 ual to earn merit time allowances, such merit time allowance shall be 33 automatically credited against the incarcerated individual's sentence 34 according to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph.

35 [Such allowance shall be withheld for any serious disciplinary infrac-36 tion or upon a judicial determination that the person, while an incarcerated individual, commenced or continued a civil action, proceeding or 37 claim that was found to be frivolous as defined in subdivision (c) of 38 39 section eight thousand three hundred three-a of the civil practice law and rules, or an order of a federal court pursuant to rule 11 of the 40 federal rules of civil procedure imposing sanctions in an action 41 commenced by a person, while an incarcerated individual, against a state 42 43 agency, officer or employee.

(iv) The provisions of this paragraph shall apply to persons in 44 45 custody serving [an] a determinate or indeterminate sentence on the effective date of this paragraph as well as to persons sentenced to [an] 46 47 a determinate or indeterminate sentence on and after the effective date 48 of this paragraph [and prior to September first, two thousand five and to persons sentenced to a determinate sentence prior to September first, 49 two thousand eleven for a felony as defined in article two hundred twen-50 ty or two hundred twenty-one of the penal law]. The time allowances set 51 52 forth in this paragraph shall apply retroactively and shall be credited toward every incarcerated individual's sentence within ninety days of 53 54 the chapter of the laws of two thousand twenty-one that amended this 55 <u>paragraph</u>.

1 2. If a person is serving more than one sentence, the authorized 2 allowances may be granted separately against the term or maximum term of 3 each sentence or, where consecutive sentences are involved, against the aggregate maximum term. Such allowances shall be calculated as follows: 4 5 (a) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences which run б concurrently [may] shall receive a time allowance [not to exceed one-7 third] of one-half of the indeterminate sentence which has the longest 8 unexpired time to run. 9 (b) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences which run 10 consecutively [may] shall receive a time allowance [not to exceed one-11 third] of one-half of the aggregate maximum term. 12 (c) A person serving two or more determinate sentences which run concurrently [may] shall receive a time allowance [not to exceed one-13 14 seventh] of one-half of the determinate sentence which has the longest 15 unexpired time to run. 16 (d) A person serving two or more determinate sentences which run 17 consecutively [may] shall receive a time allowance [not to exceed one**geventh**] of **<u>one-half of</u>** the aggregate maximum term. 18 (e) A person serving one or more indeterminate sentence and one or 19 20 more determinate sentence which run concurrently [may] shall receive a 21 time allowance [not to exceed one-third] of one-half of the indetermi-22 nate sentence which has the longest unexpired term to run or [one geventh] one-half of the determinate sentence which has the longest unex-23 pired time to run, whichever allowance is greater. 24 25 (f) A person serving one or more indeterminate sentence and one or 26 more determinate sentence which run consecutively [may] shall receive a 27 time allowance [not to exceed] of the sum of [one-third] one-half of the 28 maximum or aggregate maximum of the indeterminate sentence or sentences 29 [one-seventh] one-half of the term or aggregate maximum of the and 30 determinate sentence or sentences. 31 2-a. If a person is serving more than one sentence, the authorized 32 merit time allowances may be granted against the period or aggregate 33 minimum period of the indeterminate sentence or sentences, or against 34 term or aggregate term of the determinate sentence or sentences, or the 35 where consecutive determinate and indeterminate sentences are involved, 36 against the aggregate minimum period as calculated pursuant to subpara-37 graph (iv) of paragraph (a) of subdivision one of section 70.40 of the 38 penal law. Such allowances shall be calculated as follows: 39 (a) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences which run concurrently may receive a merit time allowance not to exceed [one-40 **sixth**] one-half of the minimum period of the indeterminate sentence 41 imposed [for an offense other than an A-I felony offense defined in 42 article two hundred twenty of the penal law, or one-third of the minimum 43 period of the indeterminate sentence imposed for an A-I felony offense 44 defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal law, whichever allow-45 46 ance results in the longest unexpired time to run] by the court. 47 (b) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences which run 48 consecutively may receive a merit time allowance not to exceed the amount of [one-third] one-half of the minimum or aggregate minimum peri-49 50 od of the sentences imposed [for an A-I felony offense defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal law, plug one-sixth of the minimum 51 52 or aggregate minimum period of the sentences imposed for an offense other than such A-I felony offense] by the court. 53 (c) A person serving two or more determinate sentences [for an offense 54 55 defined in article two hundred twenty or two hundred twenty-one of the 56 **penal law**] which run concurrently may receive a merit time allowance not

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to exceed [one-seventh] one-quarter of the term of the determinate 1 sentence which has the longest unexpired time to run. 2 3 (d) A person serving two or more determinate sentences [for an offense 4 defined in article two hundred twenty or two hundred twenty-one of the 5 penal law] which run consecutively may receive a merit time allowance б not to exceed [one-geventh] one-guarter of the aggregate term of such 7 determinate sentences. 8 (e) A person serving one or more indeterminate sentences and one or more determinate sentences [for an offense defined in article two hundred twenty or two hundred twenty-one of the penal law] which run 9 10 11 concurrently may receive a merit time allowance not to exceed [one-12 **sixth**] <u>one-half</u> of the minimum period of the indeterminate sentence imposed [for an offense other than an A-I felony offense defined in 13 article two hundred twenty of the penal law, one-third of the minimum 14 15 period of the indeterminate sentence imposed for an A-I felony offense defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal law, or [one-sev-16 17 enth] one-quarter of the term of the determinate sentence, whichever allowance results in the largest unexpired time to run. 18 19 (f) A person serving one or more indeterminate sentences and one or 20 more determinate sentences which run consecutively may receive a merit 21 time allowance not to exceed the sum of [one-sixth] one-half of the 22 minimum or aggregate minimum period of the indeterminate sentence or sentences imposed [for an offense other than an A-I felony offense 23 defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal law, one-third of the 24 25 minimum or aggregate minimum period of the indeterminate sentence or sentences imposed for an A-I felony offense defined in article two 26 27 hundred twenty of the penal law] and [one-geventh] one-guarter of the 28 term or aggregate term of the determinate sentence or sentences. (g) The provisions of this subdivision shall apply to persons in 29 30 custody serving [an] a determinate or indeterminate sentence on the 31 effective date of this subdivision as well as to persons sentenced to 32 [an] a determinate or indeterminate sentence on and after the effective 33 date of this subdivision [and prior to September first, two thousand 34 five and to persons sentenced to a determinate sentence prior to September first, two thousand eleven for a felony as defined in article two 35 36 hundred twenty or two hundred twenty one of the penal law]. The merit 37 time allowances set forth in this subdivision shall apply retroactively, and shall be credited toward every incarcerated individual's sentence 38 39 within ninety days of the effective date of the chapter of the laws of 40 two thousand twenty-one that amended this subdivision. [2-b. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if a person is serving more than 41 one indeterminate gentence, at least one of which is imposed for a class 42 A-I felony offenge defined in article two hundred twenty of the penal 43 44 law, the authorized merit time allowance granted pursuant to paragraph 45 (d) of subdivision one of this section shall be calculated as follows: 46 (a) In the event a person is serving two or more indeterminate 47 sentences with different minimum periods which run concurrently, the merit time allowance shall be based upon the sentence with the longest 48 unexpired minimum period. If the sentence with the longest unexpired 49 minimum period was imposed for a class A-I felony, the merit time credit 50 51 shall be one-third of such sentence's minimum period; if such sentence was imposed for an offense other than a class A-I felony, such merit time credit shall be one-sixth of such sentence's minimum period. 52 53 54 Provided, however, that where the minimum period of any other concurrent indeterminate sentence is greater than such reduced minimum period, the 55 56 minimum period of such other concurrent indeterminate sentence shall

1 also be reduced but only to the extent that the minimum period of such 2 other concurrent sentence, as so reduced, is equal to the reduced mini-3 mum period of such sentence with the longest unexpired minimum period to 4 run.

5 (b) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences with the same 6 minimum periods which run concurrently, and no concurrent indeterminate 7 sentence with any greater minimum period, shall have the minimum period 8 of each such sentence reduced in the amount of one-third of such minimum 9 period if all such sentences were imposed for a class A-I felony.

10 (c) A person serving two or more indeterminate sentences that run 11 consecutively shall have the aggregate minimum period of such sentences 12 reduced in the amount of one-third of such aggregate minimum period of 13 the sentences imposed for a class A-I felony, plus one-sixth of such 14 aggregate minimum period of the sentences imposed for an offense other 15 than a class A-I felony.

3. The commissioner of corrections and community supervision shall 16 17 promulgate rules and regulations for the **fair and equitable** granting, withholding, forfeiture, cancellation and restoration of allowances 18 19 authorized by this section in accordance with the criteria herein speci-20 fied. Such rules and regulations shall specify procedures to ensure that 21 similarly situated incarcerated persons are treated similarly with 22 respect to the granting, withholding, forfeiture or cancellation of allowances, and include provisions designating the person or committee 23 24 in each correctional institution delegated to make discretionary determinations with respect to the allowances, the books and records to be 25 kept, and a procedure for review of the institutional determinations by 26 27 the commissioner.

4. [No person shall have the right to demand or require the allowances authorized by this section. The decision of the commissioner of corrections and community supervision as to the granting, withholding, forfeiture, cancellation or restoration of such allowances shall be final and shall not be reviewable if made in accordance with law.

33 5.] Time allowances granted prior to any release to community super-34 vision shall be forfeited and shall not be restored if the released person is returned to an institution under the jurisdiction of the state 35 36 department of corrections and community supervision for violation of 37 community supervision or by reason of a conviction for a crime committed while on community supervision. A person who is so returned may, howev-38 39 er, subsequently receive time allowances against the remaining portion of his or her term, maximum term or aggregate maximum term pursuant to 40 this section [and provided such remaining portion of his or her term, 41 42 maximum term, or aggregate maximum term is more than one year].

43 [6.] 5. Upon commencement of an indeterminate or a determinate 44 sentence the provisions of this section shall be furnished to the person 45 serving the sentence and the meaning of same shall be fully explained to 46 him by a person designated by the commissioner to perform such duty. 47 § 4. Section 804 of the correction law, as added by chapter 680 of the

48 laws of 1967, subdivisions 1 and 2 as amended by chapter 145 of the laws of 1976, and subdivision 6 as amended by section 39 of subpart B of part 49 C of chapter 62 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows: 50 51 § 804. Good behavior allowances against definite sentences. 1. Every 52 person confined in an institution serving a definite sentence of imprisonment [may] shall receive a time [allowances as discretionary 53 54 reductions of the term of his sentence not to exceed in the aggregate **one-third**] **allowance of one-half** of the term imposed by the court. Such 55 56 allowances [may be granted for good behavior and efficient and willing A. 8462

The sheriff shall adopt regulations in 23 accordance with this provision. 2. If a person is serving more than one sentence, the authorized 24 25 allowances may be granted separately against the term of each sentence or, where consecutive sentences are involved, against the aggregate 26 27 term. Allowances based upon sentences of less than one month may be 28 granted, and in such case the maximum allowance shall be one day for every [three] two days of the sentence. The decision of the sheriff, superintendent, warden or other person in charge of the institution, or where such 35 institution is under the jurisdiction of a county or city department the 36 decision of the head of such department, as to the granting, withhold-37 ing, forfeiture, cancellation or restoration of such allowances shall be 38 final and shall not be reviewable if made in accordance with law. 39 4.] A person who has earned a reduction of sentence pursuant to this 40 section and who has been conditionally released under subdivision two of 41 42 section 70.40 of the penal law shall not forfeit such reduction by 43 reason of conduct causing his return to the institution. Provided, nevertheless, that such reduction may be forfeited by reason of subse-44 45 quent conduct while serving the remainder of his term. 46 [5.] 4. The state commission of correction shall promulgate record 47 keeping rules and regulations for the fair and equitable granting, with-48 holding, forfeiture, cancellation and restoration of allowances author-49 ized by this section. Such rules and regulations shall specify procedures to ensure that similarly situated incarcerated persons are treated 50 similarly with respect to the granting, withholding, forfeiture or 51 52 cancellation of allowances. 53 [5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, in

any case where a person is serving a definite sentence in an institution so under the jurisdiction of the state department of corrections and commu-

nity supervision, [subdivisions] subdivision three [and four] of section 1 eight hundred three of this chapter shall apply. 2 3 [7.] 6. Upon commencement of any definite sentence the provisions of 4 this section shall be furnished to the person serving the sentence and 5 the meaning of same shall be fully explained to him by an officer desig-6 nated in the regulation to perform such duty. 7 § 5. Section 804-a of the correction law, as added by chapter 220 of 8 the laws of 1987, is amended to read as follows:

9 § 804-a. Good behavior allowances for certain civil commitments. 1. 10 Every person confined in an institution serving a civil commitment for a 11 fixed period of time, whose release is not conditional upon any act 12 within his power to perform, [may] shall receive time allowances as discretionary reductions of the term of his commitment not to exceed, in 13 14 the aggregate, [one-third] one-half of the term imposed by the court. 15 Such allowances [may be granted for good behavior and efficient and willing performance of duties assigned or progress and achievement in an 16 17 assigned treatment program, and may be withheld, forfeited or cancelled in whole or in part for bad behavior, violation of institutional rules 18 19 or failure to perform properly in the duties or program assigned ] shall 20 be credited toward a person's sentence on an annual pro rata basis, and 21 any credit awarded over the course of the calendar year shall vest on 22 the final day of the calendar year. Once vested, such credit shall not 23 be withheld, forfeited, or canceled.

24 1-a. Time allowances that have not yet been granted toward a person's 25 sentence may be withheld, forfeited or canceled in whole or in part for violation of institutional rules, as demonstrated at a hearing by a 26 27 preponderance of the evidence. Such restrictions shall be limited to the 28 pro rata share of credit within the calendar year that the offense is committed. If such time allowance is withheld, forfeited or canceled in 29 30 whole or in part, further allowances, not to exceed one-half of the term 31 imposed by the court, may be reinstated for good behavior and efficient 32 and willing performance of duties assigned or progress and achievement 33 in an assigned treatment program. Following any final determination 34 withholding, forfeiting, or canceling a time allowance, the incarcerated person shall have the right to take an administrative appeal to the 35 36 central office of the department and shall be advised of the right to 37 seek legal assistance in the taking of such appeal. The department shall 38 adopt regulations in accordance with this provision.

39 2. Allowances based upon commitments of less than one month may be 40 granted, and in such case the maximum allowances shall be one day for 41 every [three] two days of the commitment. In no case, however, shall the 42 total of all allowances granted to any such person exceed [one-third] 43 <u>one-half</u> of the time he would be required to serve, computed without 44 regard to this section.

45 3. [No person shall have the right to demand or require the allowances 46 authorized by this section. The decision of the sheriff, superintendent, 47 warden or other person in charge of the institution, or where such 48 institution is under the jurisdiction of a county or city department the 49 decision of the head of such department, as to the granting, withhold-50 ing, forfeiture, cancellation, or restoration of such allowances shall 51 be final and shall not be reviewable if made in accordance with law. 52 4.] The state commission of correction shall promulgate record keeping

53 rules and regulations for the granting, withholding, forfeiture, cancel-54 lation and restoration of allowances authorized by this section. 55 [5-] <u>4.</u> Upon commencement of any civil commitment as described in

56 subdivision one of this section, the provisions of this section shall be

furnished to the person serving the commitment and the meaning of same 1 shall be fully explained to him by an officer designated in the regu-2 3 lation to perform such duty. § 6. Section 865 of the correction law, as added by chapter 261 of the 4 5 laws of 1987, subdivisions 1 and 2 as amended by chapter 322 of the laws 6 of 2021, is amended to read as follows: 7 § 865. Definitions. As used in this article, [the following terms 8 mean: 1. "Eligible incarcerated individual" means a person sentenced to an 9 indeterminate term of imprisonment who will become eligible for release 10 on parole within three years or sentenced to a determinate term of 11 imprisonment who will become eligible for conditional release within 12 three years, who has not reached the age of fifty years, who has not 13 14 previously been convicted of a violent felony as defined in article 15 seventy of the penal law, or a felony in any other jurisdiction which includes all of the essential elements of any such violent felony, upon 16 17 which an indeterminate or determinate term of imprisonment was imposed and who was between the ages of sixteen and fifty years at the time of 18 commission of the crime upon which his or her present sentence was 19 based. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no person who is convicted of any 20 of the following crimes shall be deemed eligible to participate in this 21 22 program: (a) a violent felony offense as defined in article seventy of the penal law; provided, however, that a person who is convicted of 23 burglary in the second degree as defined in subdivision two of section 24 25 140.25 of the penal law, or robbery in the second degree as defined in subdivision one of section 160.10 of the penal law, or an attempt there-26 27 of, is eligible to participate, (b) an A-I felony offense, (c) any homicide offense as defined in article one hundred twenty-five of the penal 28 law, (d) any felony sex offense as defined in article one hundred thirty 29 30 of the penal law and (e) any escape or absconding offense as defined in 31 article two hundred five of the penal law.

32  $2 \cdot$ ] "Shock incarceration program" means a program pursuant to which 33 eligible incarcerated individuals are selected to participate in the 34 program and serve a period of six months in a shock incarceration facil-35 ity, which shall provide rigorous physical activity, intensive regimen-36 tation and discipline and rehabilitation therapy and programming. Such 37 incarcerated individuals may be selected either: (i) at a reception center; or (ii) at a general confinement facility [when the otherwise 38 eligible incarcerated individual then becomes eligible for release on 39 parole within three years in the case of an indeterminate term of impri-40 sonment, or then becomes eligible for conditional release within three 41 years in the case of a determinate term of imprisonment]. 42

43 § 7. Section 867 of the correction law, as amended by chapter 322 of 44 the laws of 2021, is amended to read as follows:

§ 867. Procedure for selection of participants in shock incarceration program. 1. An [eligible] incarcerated individual may make an application to the shock incarceration screening committee for permission to participate in the shock incarceration program.

49 2. If the shock incarceration screening committee determines that an 50 incarcerated individual's participation in the shock incarceration 51 program is consistent with the safety of the community, the welfare of 52 the applicant and the rules and regulations of the department, the 53 committee shall forward the application to the commissioner or his 54 designee for approval or disapproval.

55 2-a. Subdivisions one and two of this section shall apply to a judi-56 cially sentenced shock incarceration incarcerated individual only to the

extent that the screening committee may determine whether the incarcer-1 ated individual has a medical or mental health condition that will 2 3 render the incarcerated individual unable to successfully complete the 4 shock incarceration program, and the facility in which the incarcerated 5 individual will participate in such program. Notwithstanding subdivi-6 sion five of this section, an incarcerated individual sentenced to shock 7 incarceration shall promptly commence participation in the program [when 8 such incarcerated individual is an eligible incarcerated individual 9 pursuant to subdivision one of section eight hundred sixty-five of this 10 article].

11 3. Applicants cannot participate in the shock incarceration program 12 unless they agree to be bound by all the terms and conditions thereof 13 and indicate such agreement by signing the memorandum of the program 14 immediately below a statement reading as follows:

15 "I accept the foregoing program and agree to be bound by the terms and 16 conditions thereof. I understand that my participation in the program is 17 a privilege that may be revoked at any time at the sole discretion of the commissioner. I understand that I must successfully complete the 18 19 entire program to obtain a certificate of earned eligibility upon the 20 completion of said program, and in the event that I do not successfully 21 complete said program, for any reason, I will be transferred to a 22 nonshock incarceration correctional facility to continue service of my 23 sentence."

24 4. An incarcerated individual who has successfully completed a shock 25 incarceration program shall be eligible to receive such a certificate of earned eligibility pursuant to section eight hundred five of this chap-26 27 ter. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an incarcerated indi-28 vidual sentenced to a determinate sentence of imprisonment who has 29 successfully completed a shock incarceration program shall be eligible 30 to receive such a certificate of earned eligibility and shall be imme-31 diately eligible to be conditionally released.

5. Participation in the shock incarceration program shall be a privilege. Nothing contained in this article may be construed to confer upon any incarcerated individual the right to participate or continue to participate therein.
