AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to applied behavior analysis

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 8802 of the education law, as
2 added by chapter 554 of the laws of 2013, is amended to read as follows:

3 1. The practice of applied behavior analysis by a "licensed behavior
4 analyst" shall mean the design, implementation and evaluation of envi-
5 ronmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to
6 produce socially significant improvement in human behavior, including
7 the use of direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of
8 the relationship between environment and behavior, pursuant to a diagno-
9 sis and prescription or [~~order from a person who is licensed or other-~~
10 ~~wise authorized to provide such diagnosis and prescription or ordering~~
11 ~~services pursuant to a profession enumerated in this title, for the~~

American Psychiatric Association, or an equivalent classification system as determined by the department. In addition, licensed behavior analysts providing services pursuant to a prescription or order, as authorized by this section, shall provide a report at least annually regarding the status of the individual served to the licensed person prescribing or ordering such service or more frequently, if needed, in order to report significant changes in the condition of the individual.

§ 2. This act shall take effect eighteen months after it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized and directed to be made on or before such effective date.
