Introduced by Sen. BENJAMIN -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Crime Victims, Crime and Correction

AN ACT to amend the correction law and the executive law, in relation to providing for the return of any identification materials to an individual upon release from custody

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 125 of the correction law, as  
2 amended by 476 of the laws of 1970, is amended to read as follows:

3 1. The superintendent, or an employee covered by bond who is desig-  
4 nated by the superintendent, of each correctional facility shall take  
5 charge of all moneys and other articles which may be brought to the  
6 facility by the inmates, including but not limited to any identification  
7 materials, and shall cause the same, immediately upon the receipt there-  
8 of, to be entered among the receipts of the facility; which money and  
9 other articles, including but not limited to any identification materi-  
10 als, whenever the inmate from whom the same was received shall be  
11 discharged from the custody of the department, or the same shall be  
12 otherwise legally demanded, shall be returned by the said superintendent  
13 to such inmate or other person legally entitled to the same, and vouch-  
14 ers shall be taken therefor. The commissioner shall promulgate rules and  
15 regulations concerning the custody and transfer of such money and other  
16 articles, including but not limited to any identification materials in  
17 cases where inmates are transferred from one facility to another.

18 § 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 837-w to  
19 read as follows:

20 § 837-w. Return of identification materials. 1. The member of a police  
21 department, county sheriff's office, the state police or other law  
22 enforcement officer designated to release an individual from custody

1 shall return to such individual any identification materials such indi-  
2 vidual was in possession of when taken into custody.

3 2. As used in this section, the term "law enforcement officer" means  
4 any public servant who is authorized to conduct an investigation, prose-  
5 cute or make an arrest for a criminal offense.

6 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
