AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to requiring curriculum related to human trafficking awareness to be included in alcohol training awareness programs

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 10 of section 18 of the alcoholic beverage 2 control law, as added by chapter 118 of the laws of 2012, is amended to 3 read as follows:

10. (a) To develop and establish minimum criteria for alcohol training awareness programs which may be given and administered by schools; other entities including trade associations whose members are engaged in or involved in the retail sale of alcoholic beverages; national and regional franchisors who have granted at least five franchises in the state which are licensed to sell beer at retail for off-premises 10 consumption; licensees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail 11 for off-premises consumption operating five or more licensed premises; and persons interested, whether as an individual proprietor or partner or officer or member of a limited liability company, in five or more 13 14 licensees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for off-premises consumption. The authority shall provide for the issuance of 16 certificates of approval to all certified alcohol training awareness programs. Certificates of approval may be revoked by the authority for 17 failure to adhere to the authority's rules and regulations. Such rules 18 and regulations shall afford those who have been issued a certificate of 19 20 approval an opportunity for a hearing prior to any determination of 21 whether such certificate should be revoked.

22 <u>(b)</u> No licensee shall be required to apply for any such certificate or 23 renewal certificate and the licensee may voluntarily surrender such a 24 certificate or renewal certificate at any time. A fee in the amount of

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1 nine hundred dollars shall be paid to the authority with each application for a certificate of approval or renewal certificate. The authority shall promptly refund such fee to an applicant whose application was 3 denied. Each certificate of approval and renewal thereof shall be issued for a period of three years. To effectuate the provisions of this subdivision, the authority is empowered to require in connection with an application the submission of such information as the authority may 7 direct; to prescribe forms of applications and of all reports which it 9 deems necessary to be made by any applicant or certificate holder; to 10 conduct investigations; to require the maintenance of such books and 11 records as the authority may direct; to revoke, cancel, or suspend for cause any certificate provided for in this subdivision. Each entity 12 13 authorized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program 14 shall issue certificates of completion to all licensees and employees 15 who successfully complete such an approved alcohol training awareness 16 program. Such entity shall regularly transmit to the authority the 17 names, addresses and dates of attendance of all the licensees and employees of licensees who successfully complete an approved alcohol 18 19 training awareness program. Such transmittal shall be in a form and 20 manner prescribed by the authority. The authority shall adopt rules and 21 regulations to effectuate the provisions of this subdivision, including the minimum requirements for the curriculum of each such training 22 program and the regular ongoing training of employees holding certif-23 icates of completion or renewal certificates. Such rules and regulations 24 25 shall include the minimum requirements for a separate curriculum for 26 licensees and their employees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at 27 retail for off-premises consumption, minimum requirements for a separate curriculum for licensees and their employees authorized to sell alcohol-28 29 ic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption, and the form of a 30 certificate of completion or renewal thereof to be issued in respect to 31 each such type of program. Such rules and regulations shall include a 32 requirement that all curriculums include training related to human traf-33 ficking awareness. Such human trafficking awareness training curriculum shall be developed in conjunction with, and approved by, the New York 34 35 state interagency task force on human trafficking. Such human traffick-36 ing awareness training program shall be implemented by each entity 37 authorized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program. 38 Any such entity that does not implement a human trafficking awareness program as part of its curriculum shall no longer be authorized to 39 40 administer any alcohol training awareness program and shall not be 41 eligible to be certified as a state liquor authority school. Any alco-42 hol training awareness program that is currently certified by the state 43 liquor authority shall lose its certification if such program fails to 44 include human trafficking awareness training as part of its curriculum. 45 (c) A certificate of completion or renewal thereof issued by an entity 46 authorized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program 47 pursuant to this subdivision to licensees and their employees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for off-premises consumption shall 48 not be invalidated by a change of employment to another such licensee. A 49 certificate of completion or renewal thereof issued by an entity author-50 51 ized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program pursu-52 ant to this subdivision to licensees and their employees authorized to 53 sell alcoholic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption shall not

54 be invalidated by a change of employment to another such licensee. 55 Attendance at any course established pursuant to this section shall be

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in person, through distance learning methods, or through an internet based online program.

- 2. Subdivision 12 of section 17 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 549 of the laws of 2001, the closing paragraph as amended by chapter 435 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- 12. (a) To develop and establish minimum criteria for alcohol training awareness programs which may be given and administered by schools; other entities including trade associations whose members are engaged in or involved in the retail sale of alcoholic beverages; national and regional franchisors who have granted at least five franchises in the 11 state which are licensed to sell beer at retail for off-premises 12 13 consumption; licensees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail 14 for off-premises consumption operating five or more licensed premises; and persons interested, whether as an individual proprietor or partner or officer or member of a limited liability company, in five or more licensees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for off-premises consumption. The authority shall provide for the issuance of certificates of approval to all certified alcohol training awareness 19 20 programs. Certificates of approval may be revoked by the authority for 21 failure to adhere to the authority's rules and regulations. Such human trafficking awareness training program shall be implemented by each entity 7 8 authorized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program. 9 Any such entity that does not implement a human trafficking awareness program as part of its curriculum shall no longer be authorized to 10 11 administer any alcohol training awareness program and shall not be eligible to be certified as a state liquor authority school. Any alco-12 13 hol training awareness program that is currently certified by the state 14 liquor authority shall lose its certification if such program fails to 15 include human trafficking awareness training as part of its curriculum. 16 (c) A certificate of completion or renewal thereof issued by an entity 17 authorized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program 18 pursuant to this subdivision to licensees and their employees authorized to sell alcoholic beverages at retail for off-premises consumption shall 19 20 not be invalidated by a change of employment to another such licensee. A 21 certificate of completion or renewal thereof issued by an entity author-22 ized to give and administer an alcohol training awareness program pursu-23 ant to this subdivision to licensees and their employees authorized to 24 sell alcoholic beverages at retail for on-premises consumption shall not
