AN ACT providing that a student enrolled in an individualized education program during certain school years may continue to receive educational services until the student completes the services pursuant to the individualized education program or the end of the school year during which the student turns twenty-two years old, whichever is sooner; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon the expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule or regulation to
2 the contrary, a school district shall provide educational services in
3 the 2024-25 school year to a student who turned twenty-one years old
4 during the 2023-24 school year and was enrolled in the school district
5 and receiving special education services pursuant to an individualized
6 education program. Such student may continue to receive such educational
7 services until the student completes the services pursuant to the indi-
8 vidualized education program or the end of the school year during which
9 the student turns twenty-two years old, whichever is sooner.
10 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be
11 deemed repealed June 30, 2025.
