AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to the dates to file a designating petition; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- Section 1. Section 6-158 of the election law is amended by adding a new subdivision 1-a to read as follows:
- 1-a. Notwithstanding the time fixed in subdivision one of this 4 section, for the year two thousand twenty-three, such designating petition required to be filed by such subdivision shall be filed not earlier 6 than the thirteenth Monday before, and not later than the twelfth Monday preceding the primary election.
- § 2. Section 6-134 of the election law is amended by adding a new 9 subdivision 4-a to read as follows:
- 4-a. Notwithstanding the time fixed in subdivision four of this 10 section, for the year two thousand twenty-three, a signature made earli-11 er than forty-one days before the last day to file designating petitions 12 for the primary election, or a signature made later than the twelfth 14 Thursday preceding the primary election, shall not be counted.
- § 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire December 15 31, 2023 when upon such date the provisions of this act shall be deemed 17 repealed.
