AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to authorizing any registered voter to vote by absentee ballot

## The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1, paragraph (c) of subdivision 2 and subdivi-2 sions 3 and 4 of section 8-400 of the election law, subdivision 1 as 3 amended by chapter 63 of the laws of 2010, paragraph (c) of subdivision 4 1 as amended by chapter 375 of the laws of 2015, paragraph (c) of subdi-5 vision 2 as separately amended by chapters 273 and 746 of the laws of 2021, subdivisions 3 and 4 as amended by chapter 63 of the laws of 2010, б 7 and subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (c) of subdivision 3 as amended by 8 chapter 375 of the laws of 2015, are amended to read as follows: 9 1. [A qualified voter may vote as an absentee voter under this chapter if, on the occurrence of any village election conducted by the board of 10 11 elections, primary election, special election, general election or New York city community school board district or city of Buffalo school 12 13 district election, he or she expects to be: 14 (a) absent from the county of his or her residence, or, if a resident 15 of the city of New York absent from said city; or 16 (b) unable to appear personally at the polling place of the election 17 district in which he or she is a qualified voter because of illness or 18 physical disability or duties related to the primary care of one or more individuals who are ill or physically disabled, or because he or she 19 20 will be or is a patient in a hospital; or 21 (c) a resident or patient of a veterans health administration hospi-22 tal; or (d) absent from his or her voting residence because he or she is 23 24 detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting trial, or 25 confined in jail or prison after a conviction for an offense other than

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a felony, provided that he or she is qualified to vote in 1 district of his or her residence. ] (a) Any person who is registered to 2 vote may vote by absentee ballot. 3 4 (b) A registered voter may not vote in person if the voter filed an 5 application to vote by absentee ballot. б (c) All applications requesting an absentee ballot by mail or through 7 the electronic absentee ballot application transmittal system must be received by the board of elections not later than the fifteenth day 8 9 before the election for which a ballot is first requested. Applications 10 for an absentee ballot that will be delivered in person at the board of 11 elections to the voter or to an agent of the voter must be received by 12 such board not later than the day [before] of such election. 3. The application for an absentee ballot when filed must contain in 13 14 each instance the following information: 15 (a) Applicant's full name, date of birth, and residence address, 16 including the street and number, if any, rural delivery route, if any, 17 mailing address if different from the residence address and his or her town or city and an address to which the ballot shall be mailed. 18 (b) A statement that the applicant is a qualified and registered 19 20 voter. 21 (c) [A statement, as appropriate, that on the day of such election the 22 applicant expects in good faith to be in one of the following catego-23 ries: (i) absent from the county of his or her residence, or if a resident 24 25 of the city of New York absent from said city; provided, however, if the applicant expects to be absent from such county or city for a duration 26 27 covering more than one election and seeks an absentee ballot for each 28 election, he or she shall state the dates when he or she expects to 29 begin and end such absence; or 30 (ii) unable to appear at a polling place because of illness or phys-31 ical disability or duties related to the primary care of one or more 32 individuals who are ill or physically disabled; or 33 (iii) a resident or patient of a veterans health administration hospi-34 tal; or (iv) detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury or awaiting 35 36 trial or confined in jail or prison after a conviction for an offense 37 other than a felony and stating the place where he or she is so detained 38 or confined. 39 (d) Such application shall permit the applicant to apply for an 40 absentee ballot for either a primary election or the general election in any year and for those persons who will be continuously absent from 41 42 their county of residence during the period between the fall primary 43 election and the general election in any year to apply for ballots for 44 both such elections in such year. A voter who applies for an absentee 45 ballot shall be sent an absentee ballot for any special election or 46 winter primary that occurs during the period of absence specified in the 47 application. 48 4. [A voter who claims permanent illness or physical disability] Any 49 voter may make application for an absentee ballot and the right to receive an absentee ballot for each election thereafter as provided 50 51 herein without further application[<del>, by filing with the board of</del> elections an application which shall contain a statement to be executed 52 53 by the voter]. Upon filing of such application the board of elections 54 shall cause the registration records of the voter to be marked ["Perma-55 **nently Disabled**] **<u>"permanent absentee"</u> and thereafter shall send an** 56 absentee ballot for each succeeding primary, special or general election

1 to such voter at his or her last known address by first class mail with 2 a request to the postal authorities not to forward such ballot but to 3 return it in five days in the event that it cannot be delivered to the 4 addressee. The mailing of such ballot for each election shall continue 5 until such voter's registration is cancelled. 6 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
