AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to establishing a task force on safety in school transportation; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 3639  
2 to read as follows:

3 § 3639. Task force on safety in school transportation. 1. There is  
4 hereby created a task force on safety in school transportation with the  
5 purpose of reviewing and promoting safety in school transportation.

6 2. The task force shall consist of eighteen members appointed as  
7 follows: five members appointed by the governor, five members appointed  
8 by the temporary president of the senate, and five members appointed by  
9 the speaker of the assembly. The task force shall also include the  
10 commissioner or the commissioner's designee; the commissioner of trans-  
11 portation or such commissioner's designee; and the commissioner of the  
12 department of motor vehicles or such commissioner's designee. The  
13 members appointed to the task force shall include, but not be limited  
14 to: education and community stakeholders; parents; teachers; adminis-  
15 trators; and school bus drivers and other school bus personnel who are  
16 members of a labor union.

17 3. It shall be the duty of the task force to study and issue recommen-  
18 dations related to student safety in school transportation. The task  
19 force shall review and make recommendations on:

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1 a. existing state laws, regulations, and programs that address school  
2 bus safety, and make recommendations for their improvement, including  
3 any recommendations necessary to ensure pedestrian safety and the safety  
4 of students;

5 b. examining the possibility of requiring a state department or office  
6 to conduct a biannual review of all aspects of school bus safety and to  
7 issue recommendations for additional action or oversight, as appropri-  
8 ate;

9 c. developing a plan to phase in any school bus safety measures recom-  
10 ended by the task force through retrofitting and prospective vehicle  
11 purchases, and identify the potential application of vehicle sensor  
12 technology to improve school bus safety;

13 d. identifying best practices for the designation of school bus stops;

14 e. the current safety status of students who walk to and from school  
15 and identify strategies that support safe pedestrian behavior by  
16 students between their homes and schools, including as they walk to and  
17 from bus stops and board and exit buses;

18 f. identifying safety protocols to be followed by school bus drivers  
19 and school bus aides, including safeguards to ensure that protocols are  
20 followed when a substitute driver or school bus aide is assigned to a  
21 school bus;

22 g. developing recommendations to curb illegal passing of school buses;  
23 and

24 h. determining if there is a need for additional public education  
25 programs that promote school bus safety.

26 4. Vacancies in the membership of the task force shall be filled in  
27 the same manner as the original appointments were made. The members of  
28 the task force shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed  
29 for necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

30 5. The task force shall organize as soon as is practical upon the  
31 appointment of a majority of its members. The chair of the task force  
32 shall be designated by a simple majority vote of all members of the task  
33 force.

34 6. The department shall provide staff and related support services to  
35 the task force. The task force shall also be entitled to call upon the  
36 services of any state, county, or municipal department, board, commis-  
37 sion or agency, as may be available to it for these purposes, and to  
38 incur such traveling and other miscellaneous expenses as it may deem  
39 necessary for the proper execution of its duties and as may be within  
40 the limit of funds appropriated or otherwise made available to it for  
41 these purposes. The task force may meet and hold hearings at such places  
42 as it shall designate.

43 7. The task force shall create a final report regarding all findings  
44 and recommendations to be delivered no later than eighteen months after  
45 the effective date of this section, to the governor, the temporary pres-  
46 ident of the senate, the speaker of the assembly, the chair of the  
47 senate education committee, the chair of the assembly education commit-  
48 tee, the chair of the senate transportation committee and the chair of  
49 the assembly transportation committee.

50 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be  
51 deemed repealed twenty-four months after it shall have become a law.
