Introduced by M. of A. BENDETT -- read once and referred to the Committee on Agriculture

AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to including a town, through its dog control officers acting at the behest of a police officer, as an impounding organization

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 6 of section 373 of the agriculture and markets law, as amended by chapter 289 of the laws of 2018, is amended to read as follows:

4 a. If any animal is seized and impounded pursuant to the provisions of
5 this section, section three hundred fifty-three-d of this article or
6 section three hundred seventy-five of this article for any violation of
7 this article, upon arraignment of charges, or within a reasonable time
8 thereafter, the duly incorporated society for the prevention of cruelty
9 to animals, humane society, pound, animal shelter or any authorized
10 agents thereof, or a town through its dog control officers who act at
11 the behest of a police officer to seize an animal, hereinafter referred
12 to for the purposes of this section as the "impounding organization",
13 may file a petition with the court in which criminal charges have been
14 filed requesting that the person from whom an animal is seized or the
15 owner of the animal be ordered to post a security. The district attorney
16 prosecuting the charges may file and obtain the requested relief on
17 behalf of the impounding organization if requested to do so by the
18 impounding organization. The security shall be in an amount sufficient
19 to secure payment for all reasonable expenses expected to be incurred by
20 the impounding organization in caring and providing for the animal pending
21 disposition of the charges. Reasonable expenses shall include, but
22 not be limited to, estimated medical care and boarding of the animal for
23 at least thirty days. The amount of the security, if any, shall be
24 determined by the court after taking into consideration all of the facts

1 and circumstances of the case including, but not limited to the recom-
2 mendation of the impounding organization having custody and care of the
3 seized animal and the cost of caring for the animal. If a security has
4 been posted in accordance with this section, the impounding organization
5 may draw from the security the actual reasonable costs to be incurred by
6 such organization in caring for the seized animal.
7 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
