WHEREAS, Dr. Antoinette S. Jennings holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communication and is currently pursuing an MS in Organizational Leadership, exemplifying her dedication to lifelong learning and personal growth, while also mentoring young people through programs such as the Play Street program in Harlem and the Love Over Violence Every-time Harlem Unit; and
