2 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The
3 Senate will come to order.

4 I'd ask that everyone present
5 please rise and repeat with me the Pledge of
6 Allegiance.

7 (Whereupon, the assemblage recited

9 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: With us
10 this afternoon we have Reverend Young, of the
11 Mother Teresa Community in Albany, who will give
12 the invocation.

13 REVEREND YOUNG: Thank you,
14 Senator.

15 Ever-living God, we gather here in
16 this Senate chamber as members representing our
17 constituents to provide leadership for our
18 New York State citizens.

19 Let Your spirit enlighten our minds
20 and guide our actions, that we may be united in
21 love and bring to fulfillment the work of
22 government for the greater honor and glory of
23 our citizens and of God.

24 As we look forward five days ahead
25 to the month of May, and we look to the better

1 weather report, by being a Senator we have to be
2 optimistic. And being a Senator, you have been
3 accepted into the leadership position so that you
4 can more fully serve the people of New York.

5 In the spirit of community, our
6 prayer today will be to better achieve the goal
7 of dedicated representation in the power that is
8 entrusted to all of our legislative leadership.
9 May we attain your satisfaction in your services
10 to your constituency and be blessed by God.

12 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Reading of

4 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The
5 substitution is so ordered.

12 Senator DeFrancisco.

13 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Thank you,
14 Mr. President. It's nice seeing you up there.
15 You've risen fast in the system.

16 Mr. President, on page number 13 I
17 offer the following amendments to Calendar Number
18 112, Senate Print 1636, and ask that said bill
19 retain its place on the Third Reading Calendar.

20 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: So
21 ordered.

22 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: In addition,
23 on page 23, I offer the following amendments to
24 Calendar 255, Senate Print 3461, and ask that
25 that also retain its place on the Third Reading

2 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: So

2 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
3 is passed.

23 SENATOR GIANARIS: Lay it aside.

24 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Lay the
25 bill aside.

1 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number
2 162, by Senator Hannon, Senate Print 1111, an act
3 to amend the Public Health Law.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Read the
5 last section.

6 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This
7 act shall take effect on the 120th day.

8 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Call the
9 roll.

10 (The Secretary called the roll.)

11 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
12 Hannon to explain his vote.

13 SENATOR HANNON: Yes,
14 Mr. President. I just want to comment, on
15 explaining my vote, that this streamlines the
16 Certificate of Need process for hospital and
17 related construction applications by applying the
18 existing federally qualified health systems' time
19 frames to these others, so we cease needlessly
20 delaying progress in this state with new
21 facilities.

22 Thank you. I vote aye.

23 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
24 Hannon, you will be recorded in the affirmative.

25 Announce the result.

1 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54.

2 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
3 is passed.

4 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number
5 198, by Senator Marchione, Senate Print 3738A, an
6 act to amend the County Law.

8 last section.

4 (The Secretary called the roll.)

5 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54.

6 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
7 is passed.

8 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number
9 266, by Senator Ranzenhofer, Senate Print 877, an
10 act to amend the Elder Law.

11 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Read the
12 last section.

13 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This
14 act shall take effect immediately.

15 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Call the
16 roll.

17 (The Secretary called the roll.)

18 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54.

19 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
20 is passed.

21 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number
22 305, by Senator Gallivan, Senate Print 85, an act
23 to amend the Social Services Law.

24 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Read the
25 last section.

1 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This
2 act shall take effect on the 60th day.

3 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Call the
4 roll.

5 (The Secretary called the roll.)

6 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54.

7 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
8 is passed.

9 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number
10 320, substituted earlier by Member of the
11 Assembly Goldfeder, Assembly Print 5620B, an act
12 to amend the Real Property Tax Law.

13 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Read the
14 last section.

15 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This
16 act shall take effect immediately.

17 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Call the
18 roll.

19 (The Secretary called the roll.)

20 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55.

21 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
22 Sanders to explain his vote.

23 SENATOR SANDERS: Thank you,
24 Mr. President.

25 I want to explain that as a Senator

1 who is still recovering personally and represents
2 the people of the Sandy-damaged areas, I think
3 that this is an excellent bill. And I'm sad that
4 I can't tell the sponsor immediately, but I will.

5 We are not through. We're not out
6 of the woods down there. We're still catching a
7 lot of Hades on the ground. And this is a step
8 towards making sure that the good hardworking
9 people of my district can recover and rejoin the
10 family of New York State.

11 Thank you very much, sir.

12 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator,
13 you will be recorded in the affirmative.

14 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 56.

15 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The bill
16 is passed.

17 Senator DeFrancisco, that concludes
18 the reading of the noncontroversial calendar.

19 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Can we now
20 have the controversial reading of the one bill on
21 that calendar.

22 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The
23 Secretary will ring the bell.

24 The Secretary will read.

25 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number

1 150, by Senator Gallivan, Senate Print 70, an act
2 to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

3 SENATOR KRUEGER: Explanation.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Very good.
5 Senator Gallivan for an explanation.

6 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I'm sorry, did
7 Senator Krueger ask for an explanation?

8 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: I believe
9 she did.

10 Senator Krueger?

11 SENATOR KRUEGER: Yes.

12 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Yes,
13 Mr. President. This bill would permit tandem
14 trailers to travel from Exit 49 of the New York
15 State Thruway for approximately half a mile to
16 a shipping and receiving location.

17 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
18 Mr. President, if the sponsor would yield.

19 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
20 sponsor yield?

21 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I do.

22 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
23 Krueger.

24 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

25 Has the sponsor spoken with DOT and

1 the Thruway Authority about allowing this
2 exception to state law?

3 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I'm sorry, I
4 didn't hear the question.

5 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator,
6 can you repeat the question, please?

7 SENATOR KRUEGER: Certainly.

8 Has the sponsor spoken with the
9 Department of Transportation and the Thruway
10 Authority about this legislation, which would be
11 an exemption from state law?

12 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
13 Gallivan.

14 SENATOR GALLIVAN: When our office
15 was doing its due diligence in researching this
16 law, we did find out that this will add another
17 designated route to the current list of 22
18 exemptions.

19 And we did speak with the Department
20 of Transportation. I'm not sure if anybody from
21 my office spoke with the Thruway Authority or
22 not.

23 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

24 Through you, Mr. President, if the
25 sponsor would continue to yield.

1 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
2 Senator continue to yield?

3 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Yes.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
5 Krueger.

6 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

7 Is the sponsor aware that this was a
8 former Superfund site? And I'm asking because I
9 wonder if we know if the cargo being transported
10 along this route designated by the legislation
11 might include any kind of hazardous material
12 being transported to or from this area.

13 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Mr. President,
14 through you, this bill deals with a designated
15 route. I'm not aware that the state road and the
16 local road, whether or not they were on the
17 Superfund site or not.

18 The bill does not mean this is going
19 to happen. The bill would then direct the
20 Department of Transportation to do an engineering
21 or a safety study to determine whether it was
22 safe or not. And ultimately the local
23 jurisdiction would have to approve or disapprove
24 of any business use of the particular property at
25 the end of the route.

1 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
2 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to
3 yield.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
5 sponsor continue to yield?

6 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will.

7 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
8 Krueger.

9 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.
10 Is the sponsor aware there's a
11 specific trucking company along this route on
12 Pfohl Road? And what kinds of -- what do they
13 truck from and to this location?

14 SENATOR GALLIVAN: At this point in
15 time -- is Senator Krueger asking about what they
16 will truck if this bill is approved?

17 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
18 Krueger.

19 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, yes.

20 To clarify, I'm assuming they do
21 truck now but they don't use tandem trailers, but
22 they'd wish to use tandem trailers. So I'm
23 wondering what it is they truck or intend to
24 truck when and if they get permission to use
25 tandem trailers.

1 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Tandem trailers
2 are not currently provided -- are not allowed on
3 this designated route. The DOT would make the
4 ultimate determination whether or not tandem
5 trailers could travel this route safely. I
6 believe that that would include they would
7 consider what they were carrying or not.

8 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
9 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to
10 yield.

11 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
12 sponsor continue to yield?

13 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will, yes.

14 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
15 Krueger.

16 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

17 So my understanding is there's one
18 trucking facility on this road. And so I'm
19 wondering what it is they truck in and out even
20 without the tandems now.

21 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Is that a
22 question, Senator?

23 SENATOR KRUEGER: Yes, it is, sir.

24 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
25 Gallivan.

1 SENATOR GALLIVAN: My understanding
2 is that -- the initial call to our office came
3 from a local businessman who was interested in
4 establishing a business but current law stood in
5 his way. So I am not aware of the particular
6 business that Senator Krueger is talking about.

7 But I would also point out that this
8 route will be approximately one-half of a mile
9 from the Thruway. It will cover two different
10 roads. And there are businesses located at least
11 on one of the roads that I'm aware of that would
12 be permitted to use this as well.

13 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
14 Mr. President, will the sponsor continue to
15 yield?

16 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
17 sponsor yield?

18 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will.

19 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
20 Krueger.

21 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

22 So as I look at the Senator's bill,
23 it would be the Thruway to Highway 78, also known
24 as the Transit Road, to P-F-O-H-L Road. I'm not
25 sure how to pronounce it; I'll take a guess at

1 "Foal" Road.

2 I only see one facility on that
3 road, so I'm wondering if there are other
4 companies on some other roads. But I don't
5 believe they would be included in this
6 legislation.

7 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
8 Gallivan.

9 SENATOR GALLIVAN: This legislation
10 was -- the language in this particular
11 legislation, which would provide for a
12 subdivision -- I'm sorry, a paragraph V of
13 Subdivision 16 of Section 385 of the Vehicle and
14 Traffic Law, was taken from subdivision U, which
15 was passed by the Senate in 2008. Senator
16 Krueger voted aye on this bill.

17 The language in 2008, S6184, that
18 language was patterned after section T of
19 Subdivision 16 of Section 385 that was passed in
20 2006, Senate Bill 6971. Senator Krueger voted
21 aye on that.

22 We are looking to accomplish the
23 same thing, subject, of course, to the State
24 Department of Transportation doing a traffic
25 study and determining whether it is safe to do so

1 or not. Anything related to businesses would be
2 determined by the local governing authority.

3 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
4 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to
5 yield, please.

6 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
7 sponsor continue to yield?

8 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will.

9 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
10 Krueger.

11 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. So I
12 appreciate the sponsor's answers. And just to
13 make sure I understood the end of the last
14 question/answer, the local board would have to --
15 even if we pass this into state law, it would
16 still require a local board to approve this
17 route.

18 One, did I correctly understand the
19 sponsor saying that? And, two, what is the local
20 board that would have to approve this route?

21 SENATOR GALLIVAN: No, the
22 Department of Transportation would do a safety
23 study and make the determination, if we were to
24 pass this, whether or not a tandem trailer could
25 safely travel that route.

1 Anything related to businesses that
2 access that route or travel that route on the
3 private property, that's subject to whatever the
4 rules are locally. This legislation does not
5 deal with any specific business. It only deals
6 with the route.

7 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you,
8 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to
9 yield.

10 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will.

11 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
12 Krueger.

13 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

14 So again, my understanding is
15 there's a role for us in the Legislature, there's
16 a role for the State Department of
17 Transportation. Is there a role -- these are
18 either county or town roads, I'm not actually
19 sure. Is there a role where the county and/or
20 town has to approve this? Because the concern,
21 my understanding about tandem trucks is that they
22 are much heavier and can do more damage to roads,
23 which then require perhaps more repair.

24 So is there something within the
25 section of law that this bill is amending that

1 gives the power to the county and/or town,
2 depending on whether this route includes county
3 or town roads, that allows them to say yes or no?

4 SENATOR GALLIVAN: No.

5 SENATOR KRUEGER: No. Thank you.

6 Through you, Mr. President, if the
7 sponsor would continue to yield.

8 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Will the
9 sponsor yield?

10 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I will.

11 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
12 Krueger.

13 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

14 So when you look at a map of the
15 area, there are several other companies that are
16 involved in trucking on other roads very nearby
17 but not in the express route described in Senator
18 Gallivan's bill. If --

19 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator,
20 are you on the bill now or is this a question?

21 SENATOR KRUEGER: No, it's a
22 detailed question. Thank you.

23 So has the sponsor yielded? I want
24 to make sure he yielded.

25 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Yes.

1 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you.

2 So this bill is for an explicit
3 route that it appears only one company that's
4 involved with trucking could take advantage of.
5 But there's several other trucking companies on
6 very nearby roads, and I'm wondering whether
7 there should be any concern that the trucking
8 companies who are right off of Transit Road and
9 right off of Aero Drive might object or even sue
10 over the fact that one company was allowed to use
11 these double tandem trucks but they are not.

12 SENATOR GALLIVAN: I am not aware
13 of any other -- any concerns that other
14 businesses have.

15 And it would also be my
16 understanding that the tandem trailers traveling
17 along this route would be able to access anything
18 along the route up until the end point of the
19 designation.

20 SENATOR KRUEGER: On the bill,
21 Mr. President.

22 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
23 Krueger on the bill.

24 SENATOR KRUEGER: I want to thank
25 the sponsor for taking the time to help me

1 understand the bill.

2 And I'm left with the dilemma that I
3 am concerned that even though there are any
4 number of I believe he said 22 other exemptions
5 in law -- and I don't have any of the history of
6 any of those memorized -- my concern here is,
7 one, there are other companies in the immediate
8 area that I do not believe this legislation would
9 apply to. And so I have a concern that it would
10 be viewed as an unfair prioritizing of one
11 trucking company over other trucking companies.

12 Two, because we don't know what they
13 plan on trucking to and from this facility in the
14 double tandems -- but I have to believe it's
15 something they can't do now in the existing
16 trucks that are legal -- I have concerns about
17 what they might be trucking and whether we should
18 have added concerns because it's within the area
19 of a Superfund area that had very high
20 radioactivity until cleanup was taking place.

21 Three, I'm concerned, even though
22 it's not my town, it's not my county, that the
23 reason New York State has a policy, by and large,
24 of not allowing the double tandem trucks is
25 because they are heavier, with cargo, and they

1 can do more damage to local roads, county roads.
2 And I'm concerned that because this bill isn't
3 written in a way that the town or county impacted
4 has the right to say no, that we are giving them
5 a new cost in repairing their roads without
6 giving them an opportunity to opt out.

7 So I'll be voting no, Mr. President.
8 Thank you.

9 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: The
10 Senator will be recorded in the negative.

11 Senator DeFrancisco.

12 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: We're still
13 on the bill, right?

14 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: On the
15 bill.

16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Would Senator
17 Krueger yield to a question?

18 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Senator
19 Krueger, will you yield?

20 SENATOR KRUEGER: Absolutely.

21 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Would you
22 reconsider that negative vote if you understood
23 or knew that the truck was transporting
24 marijuana?

25 (Laughter.)

1 SENATOR KRUEGER: Well, I wouldn't
2 be concerned about a toxic accident because I
3 actually don't think a marijuana spill would lead
4 to any toxicity or danger in the area. But if I
5 knew it was natural gas, I might be more
6 concerned.

7 But I think the issues would pretty
8 much be the same. Let's say there were three
9 trucking companies trucking marijuana in that
10 area but we only allow the exception for one. I
11 think that would be unfair.

12 And while I don't think marijuana is
13 particularly heavy, I would have the same
14 concerns about the impact on local and county
15 roads without giving them permission.

16 So while I fear my friend and
17 colleague might be a little tongue-in-cheek with
18 this question, yes, I would actually have to vote
19 no as well.

20 Thank you, Mr. President.

21 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Thank you,
22 Senator Krueger.

23 Are there any other members wishing
24 to be heard on this issue?

25 Seeing none, debate is closed. The

1 Secretary will ring the bell.

2 Read the last section.

3 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This
4 act shall take effect immediately.

5 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Call the
6 roll.

7 (The Secretary called the roll.)

8 ACTING PRESIDENT CROCI: Announce
9 the results.

10 THE SECRETARY: In relation to
11 Calendar Number 150, those recorded in the
12 negative are Senators Krueger and Sanders.
