AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to a voter claiming to live within an election district in which the voter seeks to vote being advised of the proper polling place and election district and being allowed to vote in said election district

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The section heading and subdivision 1 of section 4-128 of
2 the election law, subdivision 1 as amended by chapter 91 of the laws of
3 1992, are amended to read as follows:
4 Supplies; furnished by board of elections or [city,] town [or village]
5 clerk.
6 1. The board of elections of each county shall provide the requisite
7 number of official and facsimile ballots, two cards of instruction to
8 voters in the form prescribed by the state board of elections, at least
9 one copy of the instruction booklet for inspectors, A SUFFICIENT NUMBER
10 OF MAPS, STREET FINDERS OR OTHER DESCRIPTIONS OF ALL OF THE POLLING
11 PLACES AND ELECTION DISTRICTS WITHIN THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE POLLING
12 PLACE IS LOCATED TO ENABLE THE ELECTION INSPECTORS AND POLL CLERKS TO
13 DETERMINE THE CORRECT ELECTION DISTRICT AND POLLING PLACE FOR EACH
14 STREET ADDRESS WITHIN THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE POLLING PLACE IS LOCATED,
15 distance markers, tally sheets and return blanks, pens, black ink, or
16 ball point pens with black ink, pencils having black lead, envelopes for
17 the ballots of voters whose registration poll records are not in the
18 ledger or whose names are not on the computer generated registration
19 list, envelopes for returns, identification buttons, badges or emblems
20 for the inspectors and clerks in the form prescribed by the state board

1 of elections and such other articles of stationery as may be necessary
2 for the proper conduct of elections, except that when a town[, city or
3 village] holds an election not conducted by the board of elections, the
4 clerk of such town[, city or village,] shall provide such official and
5 facsimile ballots and the necessary blanks, supplies and stationery for
6 such election.

7 S 2. The opening paragraph of section 4-132 of the election law, as
8 amended by chapter 164 of the laws of 1985, is amended and a new subdivi-
9 sion d is added to read as follows:

10 [In the cities of New York and Buffalo, and cities and towns of the
11 counties of Monroe, Nassau and Suffolk, respectively, the] THE board of
12 elections [and in any other city] or [in any other town,] the town [or
13 city] clerk shall provide in each polling place, as required, the
14 following articles:

15 D. A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF MAPS, STREET FINDERS OR OTHER DESCRIPTIONS
16 OF ALL OF THE POLLING PLACES AND ELECTION DISTRICTS WITHIN THE COUNTY IN
17 WHICH THE POLLING PLACE IS LOCATED TO ENABLE THE ELECTION INSPECTORS AND
18 POLL CLERKS TO DETERMINE THE CORRECT ELECTION DISTRICT AND POLLING PLACE
19 FOR EACH STREET ADDRESS WITHIN THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE POLLING PLACE IS
20 LOCATED.

21 S 3. The opening paragraph of paragraph (e) of subdivision 3 of
22 section 8-302 of the election law, as amended by chapter 200 of the laws
23 of 1996, is amended to read as follows:

24 Whenever a voter presents himself OR HERSELF and offers to cast a
25 ballot, and [the address at which] he OR SHE claims to live [is] in the
26 election district in which he OR SHE seeks to vote but no registration
27 poll record can be found for him OR HER in the poll ledger or his OR HER
28 name does not appear on the computer generated registration list or his
29 OR HER signature does not appear next to his OR HER name on such comput-
30 er generated registration list or his OR HER registration poll record or
31 the computer generated registration list does not show him OR HER to be
32 enrolled in the party in which he OR SHE claims to be enrolled, [he] A
33 POLL CLERK OR ELECTION INSPECTOR SHALL CONSULT A MAP, STREET FINDER OR
34 OTHER DESCRIPTION OF ALL OF THE POLLING PLACES AND ELECTION DISTRICTS
35 WITHIN THE COUNTY IN WHICH SAID ELECTION DISTRICT IS LOCATED AND ADVISE
36 THE VOTER OF THE CORRECT POLLING PLACE AND ELECTION DISTRICT WITHIN THE
37 COUNTY FOR THE RESIDENCE ADDRESS PROVIDED BY THE VOTER TO SUCH POLL
38 CLERK OR ELECTION INSPECTOR. THEREAFTER, SUCH VOTER shall be permitted
39 to vote IN SAID ELECTION DISTRICT only as hereinafter provided:

40 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
