AN ACT to amend the legislative law, in relation to limiting the amount  
of time any member of the legislature may serve as temporary president  
of the senate, speaker of the assembly, minority leader of the senate,  
minority leader of the assembly or chairman of a legislative committee

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-  
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. The legislative law is amended by adding two new sections  
2     5-b and 5-c to read as follows:  
3     S 5-B. LIMITATION ON TENURE OF TEMPORARY PRESIDENT, SPEAKER AND MINOR-  
4     ITY LEADERS. NO MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATURE SHALL HOLD THE OFFICE OF  
5     TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, MINORITY  
6     LEADER OF THE SENATE OR MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY FOR MORE THAN  
7     EIGHT YEARS.  
8     S 5-C. LIMITATION ON TENURE OF LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN. NO  
9     MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATURE SHALL BE THE CHAIRMAN OF ANY SINGLE LEGISLA-  
10    TIVE COMMITTEE, EXCEPT THE COMMITTEE ON RULES, FOR MORE THAN SIX YEARS.  
11    S 2. This act shall take effect only in the event that the amendments  
12    to the constitution proposed in "CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND  
13    ASSEMBLY proposing an amendment to section 1 of article 4 of the consti-  
14    tution, in relation to term limits for the office of governor; and  
15    proposing an amendment to section 1 of article 5 of the constitution, in  
16    relation to term limits for the offices of comptroller and attorney-gen-  
17    eral" have been enacted pursuant to section 1 of article 19 of the  
18    constitution. Upon such enactment, this act shall take effect on the  
19    first of January next succeeding the enactment of such constitutional  
20    amendments, and shall apply to offices in the legislature which commence  
21    on or after such effective date.
