Introduced by M. of A. THIELE -- read once and referred to the Committee on Election Law

AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to the number of signatures needed for a designating petition for a candidate for delegate to a constitutional convention

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Section 6-136 of the election law is amended by adding a new subdivision 4 to read as follows:
- 4. THE NUMBER OF SIGNATURES ON A PETITION TO DESIGNATE A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF DELEGATE-AT-LARGE TO A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION NEED NOT EXCEED SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED SIGNATURES, AND TO DESIGNATE A DISTRICT DELEGATE THE NUMBER NEED NOT EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED SIGNATURES.
- 7 S 2. Section 6-142 of the election law is amended by adding a new 8 subdivision 3 to read as follows:
- 9 3. AN INDEPENDENT NOMINATING PETITION FOR A CANDIDATE OF OFFICE OF 10 DELEGATE-AT-LARGE TO A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION MUST BE SIGNED BY AT 11 LEAST SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED VOTERS AND A NOMINATING PETITION FOR 12 OFFICE OF DISTRICT DELEGATE MUST BE SIGNED BY AT LEAST ONE THOUSAND FIVE 13 HUNDRED VOTERS.
- 14 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
