AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to certain crime victim
compensation benefits for elderly victims

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 6 of section 627 of the execu-
2 tive law, as added by chapter 148 of the laws of 2000, is amended to
3 read as follows:
4 (a) Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of this article, claims
5 with respect to a livery operator victim OR AN ELDERLY VICTIM shall be
6 considered by a single board member on an expedited basis. A decision
7 shall be made within thirty days of the date upon which the claim was
8 accepted for filing, OR FORTY-FIVE DAYS IN THE CASE OF AN ELDERLY
9 VICTIM.
10 S 2. Subdivision 9 of section 631 of the executive law, as amended by
11 section 30 of part E of chapter 58 of the laws of 1998, is amended to
12 read as follows:
13 9. [Any] EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF MEDICALLY NECESSARY LIFE-SUSTAINING
14 EQUIPMENT FOR AN ELDERLY VICTIM WHICH WAS LOST OR DAMAGED AS THE DIRECT
15 RESULT OF A CRIME, ANY award made for the cost of repair or replacement
16 of essential personal property, including cash losses of essential
17 personal property, shall be limited to an amount of five hundred
18 dollars, except that all cash losses of essential personal property
19 shall be limited to the amount of one hundred dollars.
20 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-
21 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
