AN ACT to amend the education law and the social services law, in relation to the practice of school psychology

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new article 167 to

14 S 8720. INTRODUCTION. THIS ARTICLE APPLIES TO THE PROFESSION AND PRAC-
15 TICE OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY AND TO THE USE OF THE TITLE "LICENSED SCHOOL
16 PSYCHOLOGIST". THE GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL PROFESSIONS CONTAINED IN
17 ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY OF THIS TITLE APPLY TO THIS ARTICLE.

18 S 8721. PRACTICE OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY AND USE OF THE TITLE "SCHOOL
19 PSYCHOLOGIST". ONLY A PERSON LICENSED OR EXEMPT UNDER THIS ARTICLE

1 SHALL PRACTICE SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY OR USE THE TITLE "LICENSED SCHOOL
2 PSYCHOLOGIST".

3 S 8722. DEFINITION OF THE PRACTICE OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY. THE PRACTICE
4 OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY IS:

5 1. THE ASSESSMENT, INCLUDING PSYCHO-EDUCATIONAL, DEVELOPMENTAL AND
6 VOCATIONAL ASSESSMENT, EVALUATION AND INTERPRETATION OF INTELLIGENCE,
7 COGNITIVE PROCESSES, APTITUDES, INTERESTS, ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT,
8 ADJUSTMENT, PERSONALITY FACTORS AND MOTIVATIONS, OR ANY OTHER ATTRI-
9 BUTES, IN INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS, THAT RELATE TO LEARNING, EDUCATION OR
10 ADJUSTMENT NEEDS;

11 2. THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF EDUCATIONALLY-RELATED
12 PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC AND BEHAVIORAL APPROACHES TO INCREASE SCHOOL ADJUST-
13 MENT AND ACADEMIC SUCCESS, COUNSELING AND INTERPRETIVE SERVICES TO
14 REDUCE EDUCATION-RELATED PROBLEMS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, VERBAL
15 INTERACTION, INTERVIEWING, BEHAVIOR TECHNIQUES, DEVELOPMENTAL AND VOCA-
16 TIONAL INTERVENTION, ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT AND GROUP PROCESSES;

17 3. CONSULTATION WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF SCHOOLS, AGENCIES AND ORGAN-
18 IZATIONS, FAMILIES OR INDIVIDUALS, INCLUDING PSYCHO-EDUCATIONAL, DEVEL-
19 OPMENTAL AND VOCATIONAL ASSISTANCE OR DIRECT EDUCATIONAL SERVICES,
20 RELATED TO LEARNING PROBLEMS AND ADJUSTMENTS TO THOSE PROBLEMS; AND

21 4. THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROGRAMMING, INCLUDING DESIGNING, IMPLEMENTING
22 OR EVALUATING EDUCATIONALLY AND PSYCHOLOGICALLY SOUND LEARNING ENVIRON-
23 MENTS AND THE FACILITATION OF PSYCHO-EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF INDIVID-
24 UALS, FAMILIES OR GROUPS.

25 S 8723. REQUIREMENTS FOR A PROFESSIONAL LICENSE. TO QUALIFY FOR A
26 LICENSE AS A LICENSED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST, AN APPLICANT SHALL FULFILL
27 THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

28 1. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT;

29 2. EDUCATION: COMPLETE A MINIMUM OF SIXTY GRADUATE CREDITS AND FULFILL
30 THE REQUIREMENTS OF A MASTER'S OR DOCTORAL DEGREE IN SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY
31 FROM A PROGRAM REGISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT, OR DETERMINED BY THE
32 DEPARTMENT TO BE THE SUBSTANTIAL EQUIVALENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
33 COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS. THE GRADUATE COURSEWORK SHALL INCLUDE, BUT
34 NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

35 (I) BIOLOGICAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL BASES OF DEVELOPMENT;

36 (II) PSYCHOPATHOLOGY AND EXCEPTIONALITY IN LEARNING AND BEHAVIOR;

37 (III) ASSESSMENT AND APPRAISAL OF LEARNERS IN HOME AND SCHOOL
38 CONTEXTS;

39 (IV) CONSULTATION AND COLLABORATION IN FAMILY, SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY
40 SYSTEMS;

41 (V) EFFECTIVE INSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF COGNITIVE AND ACADEMIC
42 SKILLS;

43 (VI) PREVENTION AND TREATMENT OF BEHAVIORAL AND EMOTIONAL DISORDERS
44 AND DEFICITS;

45 (VII) SCHOOL ORGANIZATION, CURRICULUM, POLICY AND LAW;

46 (VIII) RESEARCH AND PROGRAM EVALUATION;

47 (IX) PROFESSION AND ETHICAL PRACTICE OF PSYCHOLOGY IN SCHOOLS; AND

48 (X) COMPLETION OF A TWELVE HUNDRED HOUR SUPERVISED INTERNSHIP IN
49 SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY, WITH NO LESS THAN SIX HUNDRED HOURS COMPLETED WITHIN
50 A SCHOOL SETTING.

51 3. EXPERIENCE: COMPLETE A MINIMUM OF TWO THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED HOURS
52 OF POST-MASTER'S SUPERVISED EXPERIENCE RELEVANT TO THE PRACTICE OF
53 SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
54 COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS, SUCH SUPERVISED EXPERIENCE WHICH MAY INCLUDE
55 ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED HOURS COMPLETED AS PART OF A PROGRAM IN SCHOOL
56 PSYCHOLOGY;

1 4. EXAMINATION: PASS AN EXAMINATION SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN
2 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS;

3 5. AGE: BE AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE;

4 6. CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-
5 MENT; AND

6 7. FEES: PAY A FEE OF TWO HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR
7 ADMISSION TO A DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED EXAMINATION AND FOR AN INITIAL
8 LICENSE; A FEE OF EIGHTY-FIVE DOLLARS FOR EACH REEXAMINATION; A FEE OF
9 ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS FOR AN INITIAL LICENSE FOR PERSONS NOT
10 REQUIRING ADMISSION TO A DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED EXAMINATION AND A FEE OF
11 ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY DOLLARS FOR EACH TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION PERIOD.

12 S 8724. BOUNDARIES OF PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY. 1. IT SHALL BE DEEMED
13 PRACTICING OUTSIDE THE BOUNDARIES OF HIS OR HER PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE
14 FOR A PERSON LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE, IN THE CASE OF TREATMENT
15 OF ANY SERIOUS MENTAL ILLNESS, TO PROVIDE ANY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES
16 FOR SUCH ILLNESS ON A CONTINUOUS AND SUSTAINED BASIS WITHOUT A MEDICAL
17 EVALUATION OF THE ILLNESS BY, AND CONSULTATION WITH, A PHYSICIAN REGARD-
18 ING SUCH ILLNESS. SUCH MEDICAL EVALUATION AND CONSULTATION SHALL BE TO
19 DETERMINE AND ADVISE WHETHER ANY MEDICAL CARE IS INDICATED FOR SUCH
20 ILLNESS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "SERIOUS MENTAL ILLNESS" MEANS
21 SCHIZOPHRENIA, SCHIZOAFFECTIVE DISORDER, BIPOLAR DISORDER, MAJOR
22 DEPRESSIVE DISORDER, PANIC DISORDER AND OBSESSIVE-COMPULSIVE DISORDER.
23 NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PREVENT, LIMIT OR IMPAIR
24 CONSULTATION WITH ANY OTHER HEALTH OR MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL. NOTH-
25 ING HEREIN CONTAINED SHALL LIMIT, MODIFY, RESTRICT OR OTHERWISE AFFECT
26 THE DEFINITION OF THE PRACTICE OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY AS PROVIDED IN
27 SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-TWO OF THIS ARTICLE.

28 2. ANY INDIVIDUAL WHOSE LICENSE OR AUTHORITY TO PRACTICE DERIVES FROM
29 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE PROHIBITED FROM:

30 (A) PRESCRIBING OR ADMINISTERING DRUGS AS DEFINED IN THIS CHAPTER AS A
31 TREATMENT, THERAPY, OR PROFESSIONAL SERVICE IN THE PRACTICE OF HIS OR
32 HER PROFESSION; OR

33 (B) USING INVASIVE PROCEDURES AS A TREATMENT, THERAPY, OR PROFESSIONAL
34 SERVICE IN THE PRACTICE OF HIS OR HER PROFESSION. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS
35 SUBDIVISION, "INVASIVE PROCEDURE" MEANS ANY PROCEDURE IN WHICH HUMAN
36 TISSUE IS CUT, ALTERED, OR OTHERWISE INFILTRATED BY MECHANICAL OR OTHER
37 MEANS. INVASIVE PROCEDURE INCLUDES SURGERY, LASERS, IONIZING RADIATION,
38 THERAPEUTIC ULTRASOUND, OR ELECTROCONVULSIVE THERAPY.

39 3. NOTHING IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE DEEMED TO AUTHORIZE, GRANT OR
40 EXTEND HOSPITAL PRIVILEGES TO INDIVIDUALS LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

41 S 8725. LIMITED PERMITS. 1. THE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE A LIMITED PERMIT
42 TO AN APPLICANT WHOSE QUALIFICATIONS HAVE BEEN APPROVED FOR ADMISSION TO
43 THE EXAMINATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREFOR.

44 2. LIMITED PERMITS SHALL BE FOR ONE YEAR AND BE RENEWED, AT THE
45 DISCRETION OF THE DEPARTMENT, FOR ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR.

46 3. THE FEE FOR EACH LIMITED PERMIT AND FOR EACH RENEWAL SHALL BE
47 SEVENTY DOLLARS.

48 S 8726. EXEMPTIONS. NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE
49 CONSTRUED TO:

50 1. APPLY TO THE PRACTICE, CONDUCT, ACTIVITIES, SERVICES OR USE OF ANY
51 TITLE BY ANY PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE MEDI-
52 CINE WITHIN THE STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-ONE OF THIS
53 TITLE OR BY ANY PERSON REGISTERED TO PERFORM SERVICES AS A PHYSICIAN
54 ASSISTANT WITHIN THE STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-ONE-B
55 OF THIS TITLE OR BY ANY PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO PRAC-
56 TICE PSYCHOLOGY WITHIN THIS STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED

1 FIFTY-THREE OF THIS TITLE OR BY ANY PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHOR-
2 IZED TO PRACTICE AS A LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER WITHIN THIS STATE
3 PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR OF THIS TITLE, OR BY ANY
4 PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE NURSING AS A REGIS-
5 TERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE WITHIN THIS STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE
6 HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE OF THIS TITLE, OR BY ANY PERSON LICENSED OR OTHER-
7 WISE AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING, MARRIAGE AND FAMI-
8 LY THERAPY, CREATIVE ARTS THERAPY, OR PSYCHOANALYSIS WITHIN THE STATE
9 PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-THREE OF THIS TITLE; PROVIDED,
10 HOWEVER, THAT NO PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN'S ASSISTANT, REGISTERED PROFES-
11 SIONAL NURSE, PSYCHOLOGIST, LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER, LICENSED
12 MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELOR, LICENSED MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST,
13 LICENSED CREATIVE ARTS THERAPIST OR LICENSED PSYCHOANALYST MAY USE THE
14 TITLE UNLESS LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE;

15 2. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT ANY INDIVIDUAL WHO IS CREDENTIALLED UNDER ANY LAW,
16 INCLUDING ATTORNEYS, RAPE CRISIS COUNSELORS, CERTIFIED ALCOHOLISM COUN-
17 SELORS AND CERTIFIED SUBSTANCE ABUSE COUNSELORS FROM PROVIDING MENTAL
18 HEALTH SERVICES WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE ESTABLISHED AUTHORITIES;

19 3. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT THE PRACTICE OF A PROFESSION LICENSED PURSUANT
20 TO THIS ARTICLE BY A STUDENT, INTERN OR RESIDENT IN, AND AS A PART OF, A
21 SUPERVISED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM IN AN INSTITUTION APPROVED BY THE DEPART-
22 MENT;

23 4. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT THE PROVISION OF PASTORAL COUNSELING SERVICES BY
24 ANY MEMBER OF THE CLERGY OR CHRISTIAN SCIENCE PRACTITIONER, WITHIN THE
25 CONTEXT OF HIS OR HER MINISTERIAL CHARGE OR OBLIGATION;

26 5. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT INDIVIDUALS, CHURCHES, SCHOOLS, TEACHERS, ORGAN-
27 IZATIONS, OR NOT-FOR-PROFIT BUSINESSES, FROM PROVIDING INSTRUCTION,
28 ADVICE, SUPPORT, ENCOURAGEMENT, OR INFORMATION TO INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES,
29 AND RELATIONAL GROUPS; OR

30 6. PROHIBIT OR LIMIT AN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST FROM PERFORMING WORK
31 CONSISTENT WITH ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX OF THIS TITLE.

32 S 8727. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. 1. ANY NONEXEMPT PERSON PRACTICING THE
33 PROFESSION OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY SHALL APPLY FOR A LICENSE OF SUCH
34 PROFESSION WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION.

35 (A) IF SUCH PERSON DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSE ESTAB-
36 LISHED WITHIN THIS ARTICLE, SUCH PERSON MAY MEET ALTERNATIVE CRITERIA
37 DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO BE THE SUBSTANTIAL EQUIVALENT OF SUCH
38 CRITERIA.

39 (B) IF SUCH PERSON MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSE ESTABLISHED
40 WITHIN THIS ARTICLE, EXCEPT FOR EXAMINATION, AND HAS BEEN CERTIFIED OR
41 REGISTERED BY A NATIONAL CERTIFYING OR REGISTERING BODY HAVING CERTIF-
42 ICATION OR REGISTRATION STANDARDS ACCEPTABLE TO THE COMMISSIONER, THE
43 DEPARTMENT SHALL LICENSE WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

44 2. NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN HUNDRED
45 TWENTY-THREE OF THIS ARTICLE, AND FOR A PERIOD OF TIME NOT TO EXCEED TWO
46 YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL MAY BE
47 LICENSED AS A SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST PROVIDED SUCH PERSON HAS EITHER:

48 (A) MET THE EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS AS DEFINED IN SECTION EIGHTY-SEV-
49 EN HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE OF THIS ARTICLE AND PERFORMED THE DUTIES OF A
50 SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST FOR TWO OF THE PAST FIVE YEARS PRIOR TO THE EFFEC-
51 TIVE DATE OF THIS ARTICLE; OR

52 (B) PERFORMED THE DUTIES OF A SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST FOR AT LEAST FIVE
53 YEARS PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ARTICLE.

54 3. ANY PERSON LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE MAY USE ACCEPTED CLAS-
55 SIFICATIONS OF SIGNS, SYMPTOMS, DYSFUNCTIONS AND DISORDERS, AS APPROVED

1 IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE DEPARTMENT, IN THE
2 PRACTICE OF SUCH LICENSED PROFESSION.

3 S 2. Paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 6507 of the education
4 law, as amended by chapter 356 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read
5 as follows:

6 a. Establish standards for preprofessional and professional education,
7 experience and licensing examinations as required to implement the arti-
8 cle for each profession. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
9 commissioner shall establish standards requiring that all persons apply-
10 ing, on or after January first, nineteen hundred ninety-one, initially,
11 or for the renewal of, a license, registration or limited permit to be a
12 physician, chiropractor, dentist, registered nurse, podiatrist, optome-
13 trist, psychiatrist, psychologist, LICENSED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST,
14 licensed master social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed
15 creative arts therapist, licensed marriage and family therapist,
16 licensed mental health counselor, licensed psychoanalyst, or dental
17 hygienist shall, in addition to all the other licensure, certification
18 or permit requirements, have completed two hours of coursework or train-
19 ing regarding the identification and reporting of child abuse and
20 maltreatment. The coursework or training shall be obtained from an
21 institution or provider which has been approved by the department to
22 provide such coursework or training. The coursework or training shall
23 include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of
24 child abuse and maltreatment and the statutory reporting requirements
25 set out in sections four hundred thirteen through four hundred twenty of
26 the social services law, including but not limited to, when and how a
27 report must be made, what other actions the reporter is mandated or
28 authorized to take, the legal protections afforded reporters, and the
29 consequences for failing to report. Such coursework or training may also
30 include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of
31 the abuse of individuals with mental retardation and other developmental
32 disabilities and voluntary reporting of abused or neglected adults to
33 the office of mental retardation and developmental disabilities or the
34 local adult protective services unit. Each applicant shall provide the
35 department with documentation showing that he or she has completed the
36 required training. The department shall provide an exemption from the
37 child abuse and maltreatment training requirements to any applicant who
38 requests such an exemption and who shows, to the department's satisfac-
39 tion, that there would be no need because of the nature of his or her
40 practice for him or her to complete such training;

41 S 3. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 413 of the social
42 services law, as separately amended by chapters 323 and 366 of the laws
43 of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

44 (a) The following persons and officials are required to report or
45 cause a report to be made in accordance with this title when they have
46 reasonable cause to suspect that a child coming before them in their
47 professional or official capacity is an abused or maltreated child, or
48 when they have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is an abused or
49 maltreated child where the parent, guardian, custodian or other person
50 legally responsible for such child comes before them in their profes-
51 sional or official capacity and states from personal knowledge facts,
52 conditions or circumstances which, if correct, would render the child an
53 abused or maltreated child: any physician; registered physician assist-
54 ant; surgeon; medical examiner; coroner; dentist; dental hygienist;
55 osteopath; optometrist; chiropractor; podiatrist; resident; intern;
56 psychologist; SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST; registered nurse; social worker;

1 emergency medical technician; licensed creative arts therapist; licensed
2 marriage and family therapist; licensed mental health counselor;
3 licensed psychoanalyst; hospital personnel engaged in the admission,
4 examination, care or treatment of persons; a Christian Science practi-
5 tioner; school official, which includes but is not limited to school
6 teacher, school guidance counselor, school psychologist, school social
7 worker, school nurse, school administrator or other school personnel
8 required to hold a teaching or administrative license or certificate;
9 social services worker; day care center worker; school-age child care
10 worker; provider of family or group family day care; employee or volun-
11 teer in a residential care facility defined in subdivision four of
12 section four hundred twelve-a of this title or any other child care or
13 foster care worker; mental health professional; substance abuse counse-
14 lor; alcoholism counselor; all persons credentialed by the office of
15 alcoholism and substance abuse services; peace officer; police officer;
16 district attorney or assistant district attorney; investigator employed
17 in the office of a district attorney; or other law enforcement official.

18 S 4. Section 7602 of the education law, as added by chapter 987 of the
19 laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:

20 S 7602. State board for psychology. A state board for psychology
21 shall be appointed by the board of regents on recommendation of the
22 commissioner for the purpose of assisting the board of regents and the
23 department on matters of professional licensing and professional conduct
24 in accordance with section sixty-five hundred eight of this title. The
25 board shall be composed of not less than eleven [psychologists licensed
26 in this state] MEMBERS, A NUMBER OF WHOM SHALL BE LICENSED SCHOOL
27 PSYCHOLOGISTS SUFFICIENT TO ASSURE MEANINGFUL PARTICIPATION IN BOARD
28 ACTIVITIES. An executive secretary to the board shall be appointed by
29 the board of regents upon the recommendation of the commissioner and
30 shall be a psychologist, licensed in this state.

31 S 5. Severability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part
32 of this act shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to
33 be invalid, the judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the
34 remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause,
35 sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the
36 controversy in which the judgment shall have been rendered.

37 S 6. This act shall take effect January 1, 2011; provided that the
38 department of education is authorized to promulgate any and all rules
39 and regulations and take any other measure necessary to implement this
40 act on or before its effective date, including, but not limited to, the
41 appointment of the state board for psychology, the acceptance and proc-
42 essing of applications for licensure and the issuance of licenses;
43 provided further that the provisions of article 167 of the education
44 law, as added by section one of this act, requiring a license or limited
45 permit to practice under such article shall not be enforced until Janu-
46 ary 1, 2012.
