AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to creating the empire state internship program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative findings. The legislature hereby finds and 2 declares that secondary school students who may be interested in specif-3 ic careers have little or no opportunity to explore those interests 4 beyond the classroom.

5 The legislature also finds that students who gain practical work expe-6 rience through internships generally become more committed to their 7 academic fields, more serious about their course work, and more 8 constructive contributors in the classroom.

9 The legislature further finds that internships provide exposure to 10 advanced technologies and equipment not available in the classroom. 11 Students learn about the competitive nature of job markets and what is 12 needed to prepare themselves to make career choices.

13 Therefore, the legislature declares that students interested in 14 exploring opportunities related to their specific career interests be 15 eligible for internships and deserve recognition that exemplifies the 16 students' scholastic achievement.

17 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new article 12-B to read 18 as follows:

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S 571. RULES AND REGULATIONS. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PROMULGATE RULES 7 8 AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.

9 S 3. This act shall take effect September 1, 2011.
