AN ACT to amend the criminal procedure law, in relation to designating uniformed officers of the fire marshal's office of the town of Huntington as peace officers; to amend the executive law and the criminal procedure law, in relation to peace officers; and to repeal section 845-a of the executive law and section 2.30 of the criminal procedure law relating thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 63 of section 2.10 of the criminal procedure
2 law, as amended by chapter 638 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read
3 as follows:
4 63. Uniformed members of the fire marshal's office in the town of
5 Southampton [and], the town of Riverhead AND THE TOWN OF HUNTINGTON,
6 when acting pursuant to their special duties in matters arising under
7 the laws relating to fires, the extinguishment thereof and fire perils;
8 provided, however that nothing in this subdivision shall be deemed to
9 authorize such officer to carry, possess, repair or dispose of a firearm
10 unless the appropriate license therefor has been issued pursuant to
11 section 400.00 of the penal law.
12 S 2. Section 845-a of the executive law is REPEALED.
13 S 3. Section 845 of the executive law, as added by chapter 482 of the
14 laws of 1979, is amended to read as follows:
15 S 845. Central state registry of police officers AND PEACE OFFICERS.
16 1. The division shall collect information to maintain, on a current
17 basis, a registry of all police officers AND PEACE OFFICERS in the

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1 state. Such registry shall contain, with respect to each police AND
2 PEACE officer, his OR HER name, date of birth, social security number,
3 rank or title, [department] EMPLOYER, and whether he OR SHE is employed
4 full-time or part-time.

5 2. Each head of a state or local agency, unit of local government,
6 state or local commission, [or] public authority OR OTHER ORGANIZATION
7 which employs police officers OR PEACE OFFICERS shall transmit to the
8 division, no later than the fifteenth day of January, [nineteen hundred
9 eighty] ANNUALLY, AND IN A FORM AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DIVISION, a
10 list containing the name of every police officer OR PEACE OFFICER
11 employed by his OR HER agency, government, commission, authority or
12 organization [on the first day of January, nineteen hundred eighty,]
13 indicating with respect to each [police] officer his OR HER date of
14 birth, social security number, rank or title, [department] EMPLOYER, AND
15 whether he OR SHE is employed full-time or part-time. [Each such head
16 shall thereafter, no later than the tenth day of each January and July,
17 transmit to the division a list of those police officers who have been
18 appointed, have had a change of rank, or have ceased to serve in the
19 preceding six calendar months and, in the instance of new appointees,
20 shall include all the information required to be furnished in the
21 initial listing.] IN ADDITION TO SUCH ANNUAL LIST, EACH SUCH HEAD SHALL
22 TRANSMIT TO THE DIVISION ADDITIONAL LISTS CONTAINING THE NAMES OF OFFI-
23 CERS WHO HAVE BEEN NEWLY APPOINTED, HAVE HAD A CHANGE IN RANK OR HAVE
24 CEASED TO SERVE, WHICH LISTS SHALL BE TRANSMITTED WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF
25 THE EVENTS LISTED, AND WHICH SHALL INCLUDE ALL THE INFORMATION REQUIRED
26 TO BE FURNISHED IN THE ANNUAL LISTING.

27 3. [Each such head shall have the option to enter into an agreement
28 with the division whereby the required semi-annual updating of registry
29 information may be regularly done on a more frequent basis.] THE DIVI-
30 SION SHALL ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR A PERMANENT
31 SYSTEM OF IDENTIFICATION FOR EACH POLICE AND PEACE OFFICER, WHICH SHALL
32 INCLUDE PROCEDURES FOR UPDATING THE REGISTRY UPON AN OFFICER'S FAILURE
33 TO COMPLETE REQUIRED TRAINING WITHIN THE TIME LIMITATIONS ESTABLISHED IN
34 LAW OR REGULATION.

35 4. UPON THE FAILURE OR REFUSAL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF
36 SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSIONER MAY APPLY TO THE
37 SUPREME COURT FOR AN ORDER, DIRECTED TO THE PERSON RESPONSIBLE, REQUIR-
38 ING COMPLIANCE. UPON SUCH APPLICATION, THE COURT MAY ISSUE SUCH ORDER AS
39 MAY BE JUST.

40 5. THE DIVISION SHALL COOPERATE WITH THE DIVISION OF STATE POLICE IN
41 MAKING THE INFORMATION IN THE CENTRAL REGISTRY OF POLICE AND PEACE OFFI-
42 CERS AVAILABLE FOR THE PURPOSE OF VERIFYING TRANSACTIONS INVOLVING
43 FIREARMS.

44 S 4. Section 2.30 of the criminal procedure law is REPEALED and a new
45 section 2.30 is added to read as follows:

46 S 2.30 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR PEACE OFFICERS.

47 1. EVERY PEACE OFFICER APPOINTED AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
48 SECTION MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE A PEACE OFFICER BASIC TRAINING
49 PROGRAM PRESCRIBED BY REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE GOVERNOR PURSUANT
50 TO SECTION EIGHT HUNDRED FORTY OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW. SUCH REGULATIONS
51 MAY PRESCRIBE DIFFERENT BASIC TRAINING PROGRAMS AS MAY BE DEEMED APPRO-
52 PRIATE FOR PARTICULAR AGENCIES OR CATEGORIES OF PEACE OFFICERS. IT IS
53 THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERY EMPLOYER OF PEACE OFFICERS TO PROVIDE THE
54 PEACE OFFICER BASIC TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION. EACH
55 PEACE OFFICER SATISFACTORILY COMPLETING A PEACE OFFICER BASIC TRAINING
56 PROGRAM SHALL BE AWARDED A CERTIFICATE BY THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL

1 JUSTICE SERVICES ATTESTING TO THAT EFFECT. EVERY PERSON APPOINTED AS
2 PEACE OFFICER AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION SHALL FORFEIT HIS
3 OR HER POSITION UNLESS HE OR SHE HAS RECEIVED A CERTIFICATE OF SATISFAC-
4 TORY COMPLETION OF THE PEACE OFFICER BASIC TRAINING PROGRAM WITHIN THE
5 TIME PRESCRIBED BY THE REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE GOVERNOR PURSUANT
6 TO SECTION EIGHT HUNDRED FORTY-TWO OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW.

7 2. EVERY PEACE OFFICER EMPLOYER MUST ALSO PROVIDE AN ORIENTATION
8 PROGRAM FOR ITS PEACE OFFICERS COMPRISED OF SUBJECTS RELATING TO THE
9 SPECIAL NATURE OF THE DUTIES OF THE PEACE OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY IT.

10 3. NO EMPLOYER SHALL ALLOW ANY PEACE OFFICER TO CARRY OR USE A WEAPON
11 DURING ANY PHASE OF THE OFFICER'S ON-DUTY EMPLOYMENT UNLESS SUCH OFFICER
12 HAS SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED A COURSE OF TRAINING APPROVED BY THE MUNIC-
13 IPAL POLICE TRAINING COUNCIL IN THE USE OF DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE AND
14 FIREARMS AND OTHER WEAPONS, AND ANNUALLY RECEIVES TRAINING IN THE USE OF
15 DEADLY PHYSICAL FORCE AND FIREARMS AND OTHER WEAPONS.

16 4. EVERY EMPLOYER OF PEACE OFFICERS SHALL ANNUALLY REPORT TO THE DIVI-
17 SION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES, IN SUCH FORM AND AT SUCH TIME AS THE
18 DIVISION MAY BY REGULATION REQUIRE, THE NAMES OF ALL PEACE OFFICERS WHO
19 HAVE, DURING THE COURSE OF THE YEAR, SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED ANY OF THE
20 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS PRESCRIBED BY THIS SECTION.

21 5. UPON THE FAILURE OR REFUSAL TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
22 SECTION, THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES
23 MAY APPLY TO THE SUPREME COURT FOR AN ORDER, DIRECTED TO THE PERSON
24 RESPONSIBLE, REQUIRING COMPLIANCE. UPON SUCH APPLICATION, THE COURT MAY
25 ISSUE SUCH ORDER AS MAY BE JUST.

26 6. A CERTIFICATE ATTESTING TO SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF THE TRAINING
27 REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION AWARDED TO ANY PEACE OFFICER BY
28 THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL
29 REMAIN VALID DURING THE HOLDER'S CONTINUOUS SERVICE AS A PEACE OFFICER
30 AND FOR FIVE YEARS AFTER THE DATE OF THE COMMENCEMENT OF AN INTERRUPTION
31 IN SUCH SERVICE. AS USED IN THIS SUBDIVISION, THE TERM "INTERRUPTION"
32 SHALL MEAN A PERIOD OF SEPARATION FROM EMPLOYMENT AS A PEACE OFFICER BY
33 REASON OF SUCH OFFICER'S LEAVE OF ABSENCE, RESIGNATION, OR REMOVAL,
34 OTHER THAN REMOVAL FOR CAUSE.

35 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that sections
36 two, three and four of this act shall take effect one year after this
37 act shall have become a law.
