AN ACT to amend the executive law and the criminal procedure law, in relation to requiring a police officer or peace officer who discharges his or her weapon under circumstances where a person could be struck by a bullet to immediately report the incident

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 231 to 2 read as follows:
- 231. REPORT OF DISCHARGE OF WEAPON. 1. ANY POLICE OFFICER WHO DISCHARGES HIS OR HER WEAPON WHILE ON DUTY OR OFF DUTY UNDER 5 WHEREIN A PERSON COULD BE STRUCK BY A BULLET FROM THE WEAPON, 6 INCLUDING SITUATIONS WHEREIN SUCH OFFICER DISCHARGES HIS OR HER 7 THE DIRECTION OF A PERSON OR AN ANIMAL, SHALL VERBALLY REPORT THE INCIDENT TO HIS OR HER SUPERIORS WITHIN SIX HOURS OF THE 8 OCCURRENCE 9 THE INCIDENT AND SHALL PREPARE AND FILE A WRITTEN REPORT OF THE INCIDENT 10 WITHIN FORTY-EIGHT HOURS OF THE OCCURRENCE OF THE INCIDENT. NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION SHALL PREVENT ANY POLICE OFFICER FROM INVOKING 11 HIS OR HER CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO AVOID SELF-INCRIMINATION.
