AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to establishing a long term care worker training pilot program; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon the expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The elder law is amended by adding a new section 218-a to 2 read as follows:

3 218-A. LONG TERM CARE WORKER TRAINING PILOT PROGRAM. 1. THE DIREC-TOR, WITHIN AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED THEREFOR, SHALL ESTABLISH A LONG 5 CARE WORKER TRAINING PILOT PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPANDING ACCESS 6 TO ENHANCED EDUCATION AND TRAINING ACROSS THE CONTINUUM OF CARE 7 AND SOCIAL SERVICES PRACTITIONERS WHO PROVIDE SERVICES TO HEALTH CARE ELDERLY PERSONS AS DEFINED BY PARAGRAPH (B) OF 8 SUBDIVISION ONE SECTION TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN OF THIS TITLE. EMPHASIS SHALL BE PLACED ON 9 10 TRAINING TRAINERS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, TRAINERS FROM 11 UNIVERSITY AND BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES FACULTY, AND 12 STAFF OF PROVIDER AGENCIES IN HIGH NEEDS AREAS, AS SET FORTH IN THIS 13 SECTION, WHO PROVIDE EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR HOME CARE, NURSE AIDES, PERSONAL CARE AIDES, CASE MANAGERS IN THE EXPANDED IN-HOME SERVICES 14 THE ELDERLY PROGRAM, INFORMATION AND REFERRAL SPECIALISTS INCLUDING, BUT 15 NOT LIMITED TO, THOSE WORKING FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATIONS, MUNICIPAL 16 GOVERNMENTS, NEW YORK CONNECTS-CHOICES FOR LONG TERM CARE, SOCIAL ADULT 17 18 DAY CARE, ADULT DAY CARE AND OTHER CAREGIVERS WITH HANDS-ON RESPONSIBIL-

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [ ] is old law to be omitted.

ITIES FOR ELDERLY CLIENTS. THE GOAL SHALL BE TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF

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CARE PROVIDED TO THE ELDERLY, TO ENSURE THAT INDIVIDUALS WORKING WITH THE ELDERLY AND THEIR FAMILIES HAVE CORE COMPETENCIES IN GERIATRICS, IMPROVE RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION, AND TO ASSIST PROVIDERS TO MEET TRAINING NEEDS, INCLUDING REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY REGULATORY AGEN-5 CIES. THE DIRECTOR SHALL COORDINATE SUCH EFFORTS IN CONJUNCTION WITH 6 ONGOING TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION SERVICES AND REQUIREMENTS OF THE 7 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; OFFICE OF MENTAL HEALTH; OFFICE OF ALCOHOLISM AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES; STATE COMMISSION ON QUALITY OF CARE AND ADVO-CACY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES; EDUCATION DEPARTMENT; STATE UNIVER-9 10 SITY OF NEW YORK; OFFICE OF TEMPORARY AND DISABILITY ASSISTANCE AND SUCH OTHER AGENCIES AS APPROPRIATE. SUCH TRAINING SHALL BE COORDINATED WITH 11 12 COMMUNITY BASED AGENCIES INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, COUNTY HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENTS; COUNTY OFFICES FOR THE 13 14 AGING; COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES; BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES; LONG TERM CARE PROVIDERS; AREA HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS; RURAL 15 16 HEALTH NETWORKS; AND SUCH OTHER AGENCIES AS APPROPRIATE. THE DIRECTOR 17 SHALL PROVIDE A METHOD FOR ONGOING EVALUATION AND REPORTING ON THE SUCCESS OF THIS PILOT PROGRAM IN MEETING ITS STATED GOALS. 18 19

THE DIRECTOR, WITHIN AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED THEREFOR, AND IN CONSULTATION WITH THE AGENCIES THE DIRECTOR IS REQUIRED TO COORDINATE WITH PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION, SHALL CONTRACT WITH ONE OR MORE COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES WITH A RECOGNIZED INSTITUTE ON GERONTOLOGY, TO ASSIST IN THE DESIGN, IMPLEMENTATION AND EVALUATION OF THE LONG TERM CARE WORKER TRAINING PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING THE IDENTIFICATION OF HIGH NEEDS AREAS WHERE A SHORTAGE OF GERIATRIC TRAINING RESOURCES AND DIFFICULTIES IN ACCESSING SUCH TRAINING ARE DOCUMENTED.

ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST OF SEPTEMBER OF THE CALENDAR YEAR NEXT SUCCEEDING THE YEAR IN WHICH THE CHAPTER OF THE LAWS OF TWO 28 NINE WHICH ADDED THIS SECTION TAKES EFFECT, AND EVERY SECOND YEAR THERE-29 AFTER, THE DIRECTOR SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE ON 30 THE ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN TO DESIGN, IMPLEMENT AND EVALUATE THE LONG 31 32 TERM CARE WORKER TRAINING PILOT PROGRAM. SUCH REPORT SHALL INCLUDE DATA RELATING TO PROGRAM ACTIVITIES, OUTCOMES AND OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION 33 NECESSARY TO EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IN ACCOM-34 PLISHING ITS STATED GOALS. 35
- 36 S 2. This act shall take effect on the first of April of the calendar 37 year next succeeding the year in which it shall have become a law, and 38 shall expire and be deemed repealed 6 years after it shall take effect.
