AN ACT providing for the state board of elections to undertake a study on the feasibility of permitting voting by mail, telephone and/or the internet and to establish pilot projects relating thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The state board of elections shall undertake a study on the feasibility of permitting voting by mail, telephone and/or the internet. Such study shall include but not be limited to evaluation of the ability of verifying votes by mail, telephone and/or the internet and the impact 5 on the number of the electorate voting in primary and general elections. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, at any 7 primary or general election during the undertaking of such study, the state board of elections may provide a pilot program permitting voting 8 by mail, telephone and/or the internet. The state board of elections 9 shall submit such study including recommendations to the governor and 10 state legislature within twenty-four months of the effective date of 11 12 this act.

13 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
