Introduced by M. of A. GORDON -- (at request of the Department of Public Service) -- read once and referred to the Committee on Energy

AN ACT to amend the general business law and the public service law, in relation to the protection and excavation of underground facilities and penalties for gas safety violations

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraphs a and b of subdivision 1 of section 765 of the  
2 general business law, as amended by chapter 685 of the laws of 1994, are  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 a. Failure to comply with any provision of this article shall subject  
5 an excavator or an operator to a civil penalty of up to [one] TWO thou-  
6 sand FIVE HUNDRED dollars for the first violation and up to an addi-  
7 tional [seven] TEN thousand [five hundred] dollars for each succeeding  
8 violation [which] THAT occurs [in connection with the entire self-same  
9 excavation or demolition activity] within a [two] TWELVE month period.

10 b. The penalties provided for by this article shall not apply to an  
11 excavator who damages an underground facility due to the failure of the  
12 operator to comply with any of the provisions of this article nor shall  
13 in such instance the excavator be liable for repairs as prescribed in  
14 subdivision [five] FOUR of this section.

15 S 2. Subdivision 3 of section 25 of the public service law, as added  
16 by chapter 665 of the laws of 1980 and paragraph (a) as amended by chap-  
17 ter 375 of the laws of 1986, is amended to read as follows:

18 3. (A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision two of this  
19 section, any such public utility company, corporation or person and the  
20 officers, agents and employees thereof that knowingly fails or neglects  
21 to obey or comply with a provision of this chapter, or an order or regu-  
22 lation adopted under the authority of this chapter, adopted specifically  
23 for the protection of human safety OR PREVENTION OF SIGNIFICANT DAMAGE  
24 TO REAL PROPERTY, including but not limited to the commission's code of

1 gas safety regulations shall, if it is determined by the commission that  
2 such safety violation caused or constituted a contributing factor in  
3 bringing about: (I) a death or personal injury; (II) DAMAGE IN EXCESS OF  
4 FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS TO REAL PROPERTY; OR (III) A REPEATED GAS PIPE-  
5 LINE SAFETY VIOLATION WITHIN TWENTY-FOUR MONTHS, forfeit to the state of  
6 New York a sum not to exceed the greater of:

7 [(a) two] (A) FIVE hundred [and fifty] thousand dollars constituting a  
8 civil penalty for each separate and distinct offense[; provided, howev-  
9 er, that for], EXCEPT THAT THE MAXIMUM PENALTY FOR A REPEATED GAS PIPE-  
10 LINE SAFETY VIOLATION WITHIN A TWENTY-FOUR MONTH PERIOD SHALL BE ONE  
11 MILLION DOLLARS. FOR purposes of this paragraph each day of a continuing  
12 violation shall not be deemed a separate and distinct offense. The total  
13 period of a continuing violation, as well as every distinct violation,  
14 shall be similarly treated as a separate and distinct offense for  
15 purposes of this paragraph; or

16 [(b)] (B) the maximum forfeiture determined in accordance with subdi-  
17 vision two of this section.

18 (B) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, A "REPEATED GAS PIPELINE SAFETY  
19 VIOLATION" SHALL MEAN A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, WITHIN  
20 TWENTY-FOUR MONTHS, OF AN ORDER OR REGULATION RELATING TO CATHODIC  
21 PROTECTION OF PIPELINE FACILITIES, UPGRADES TO OR MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE  
22 SYSTEM OPERATING PRESSURE, GAS ODORIZATION, SYSTEM OVERPRESSURE  
23 PROTECTION, PERIODIC LEAK SURVEYS, PIPELINE VALVE INSPECTIONS, MAINTE-  
24 NANCE AND REPLACEMENT OF PIPELINES, OR GAS LEAK INVESTIGATIONS, CLASSI-  
25 FICATION, SURVEILLANCE AND REPAIR.

26 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to all  
27 violations occurring on or after such effective date.
