WHEREAS, A man of singular distinction, Stephen Holden III has continually demonstrated extreme competence, extraordinary intelligence and diligent leadership in his unwavering service to his community and profession and consequently has been designated for this most prestigious honor; and

WHEREAS, Following law school, Stephen Holden III returned to White Plains to practice law with his father and uncle at Holden Brothers, P.C., where he continues to work today; a very successful attorney, he has also been active professionally with the American Bar Association, as well as the New York State and Westchester County Bar Association; and

WHEREAS, Despite his busy professional life, Stephen Holden III has been called upon to contribute his time and talents to countless civic and charitable endeavors and has always given of himself unstintingly; and

WHEREAS, Stephen Holden III is actively involved with the Salvation Army, being a past member of the New York State Advisory Board and Chairman of both the Westchester County and White Plain Boards; additionally, he is a member of the Board of the Thomas H. Slater Center; he is also the past president of the White Plains Rotary Club and previously active with the Leukemia Society and Boy Scouts of America; and

WHEREAS, Throughout the entire period of his community service, a period of constructive involvement, Stephen Holden III has stood constant in dignity, good grace and humor; and
