AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to notice and expedited re-application in cases of the termination of medical assistance eligibility

PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 8 of section 22 of the social services law, added by chapter 473 of the laws of 1978, is amended to read as follows: The department shall promulgate such regulations, not inconsistent with federal or state law, as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this section. Such regulations shall require that a copy of all decisions made concerning appeals pursuant to this section shall be sent to each party to such appeals and their representatives, if any. SUCH REGULATIONS SHALL ALSO REQUIRE THAT PERSONS WHOSE ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IS TERMINATED BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF SUCH TERMINATION AT LEAST TEN BUSINESS DAYS PRIOR TO SUCH EFFEC-11 TIVE DATE.

- 12 S 2. Section 366-a of the social services law is amended by adding a 13 new subdivision 3-a to read as follows:
- 14 THE CASE OF ANY PERSON WHOSE ELIGIBILITY FOR MEDICAL ASSIST-15 ANCE IS TERMINATED, SUCH PERSON, UPON RECEIPT OF WRITTEN NOTICE THEREOF, 16 SHALL BE PERMITTED TO RE-APPLY FOR MEDICAL ASSISTANCE, AND SHALL OR HER ELIGIBILITY THEREFOR DETERMINED BY THE APPROPRIATE SOCIAL 17
- SERVICES OFFICIAL WITHIN TEN BUSINESS DAYS OF SUBMISSION OF 18 APPLICATION THEREFOR. NOTICE OF SUCH DECISION AND PROVISION OF THE APPROPRIATE IDEN-19
- 20 TIFICATION CARD SHALL BE AS PROVIDED FOR IN SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS 21 SECTION.
- 22 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
