AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to authorizing school districts to establish policies prohibiting the wearing of gang-related apparel, markings or symbols

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 305 of the education law is amended by adding a new subdivision 42 to read as follows:

THE COMMISSIONER IS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DEVELOP RULES AND THE BOARD OF ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ADOPT A REGULATIONS AUTHORIZING POLICY THAT PROHIBITS STUDENTS FROM WEARING GANG-RELATED APPAREL, 6 INGS OR SYMBOLS IF THE BOARD OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT DETERMINES THAT THE POLICY IS NECESSARY FOR THE HEALTH AND SAFETY, OR SECURITY OF THE SCHOOL 7 8 ENVIRONMENT. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, GANG-RELATED SYMBOLS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT NECESSARILY BE LIMITED TO, 9 MARKINGS AND CLOTHING THAT CONTAINS A NAME OR IDENTIFYING SIGN, A SYMBOL 10 A CRIMINAL STREET GANG, OR A TATTOO OR OTHER PHYSICAL MARKING 11 PROMOTES THAT IS NOT COVERED WITH CLOTHING, OR STYLE OF DRESS 12 THAT13 CRIMINAL STREET GANG. SUCH SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICY MAY AUTHORIZE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT TO MANDATE 14 COUNSELING OR COMMUNITY IN 15 SERVICE, BOTH, IN ORDER TO CONTINUE ATTENDANCE THE SCHOOL OR 16 DISTRICT, PROVIDED THAT SUCH POLICY CONTAINS A PROCEDURE THAT COMPLIES 17 WITH DUE PROCESS REQUIREMENTS REGARDING STUDENT SUSPENSION PROVIDED IN 18 SECTION THIRTY-TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN OF THIS CHAPTER.

S 2. Severability. If any provision of this act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the provision of this act, or in its
