AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to notice of delinquency requirements

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 600 of the general business law is amended by adding a new subdivision 4 to read as follows:

- 4. "CO-SIGNER" MEANS A NATURAL PERSON WHO (I) IN THE CASE OF A CONSUM-CREDIT TRANSACTION BECOMES OBLIGATED ON THE TRANSACTION AS A CO-SIG-NER, CO-MAKER, GUARANTOR, ENDORSER OR SURETY, BUT WHO DOES NOT RECEIVE THE PROPERTY, SERVICES, OR MONEY THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THE TRANSACTION. TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE A SELLER, HOLDER OR LENDER WHO BECOMES OBLI-THE GATED TO AN ASSIGNEE OF SUCH PARTY'S RIGHTS; OR (II) IN THE CASE CONSUMER CREDIT ACCOUNT BECOMES OBLIGATED UNDER THE AGREEMENT AS A CO-SIGNER, CO-MAKER, GUARANTOR, ENDORSER OR SURETY WITH RESPECT 10 ALL PURCHASES AND LOANS, OR A SPECIFIED MAXIMUM DOLLAR AMOUNT OF PURCHASES AND LOANS THAT WILL BE OBTAINED FROM TIME TO TIME PURSUANT AGREEMENT WHETHER OR NOT IT IS CONTEMPLATED THAT THE CO-SIGNER MAY RECEIVE ANY OF THE PROPERTY, SERVICES OR MONEY TO BE OBTAINED. THE DOES NOT INCLUDE A SELLER, HOLDER OR LENDER WHO BECOMES OBLIGATED TO AN ASSIGNEE OF SUCH PARTY'S RIGHTS OR A JOINT APPLICANT FOR CREDIT WHO INTENDED TO BE PRIMARILY LIABLE UNDER THE AGREEMENT.
  - S 2. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 601-a to read as follows:
- 20 S 601-A. NOTICE OF DELINOUENCY. EVERY PRINCIPAL CREDITOR OR HIS OR HER AGENT SHALL SEND A NOTICE TO THE LAST KNOWN ADDRESS OF THE DEBTOR ADVIS-21 THE DEBTOR OF A DELINQUENCY ON HIS OR HER ACCOUNT. A COPY OF SUCH 22 23 NOTICE SHALL ALSO BE SENT TO THE CO-SIGNER OF SUCH ACCOUNT.
- 24 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-25 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
