AN ACT to amend the military law, in relation to authorizing additional
paid leave for state correctional officers who are absent on military
duty

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 5 of section 242 of the military law, as
2 amended by chapter 161 of the laws of 1984, is amended to read as
3 follows:
4 5. Pay for military duty. (A) Every public officer or employee, EXCEPT
5 STATE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS WHO SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF
6 PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION, shall be paid his OR HER salary or
7 other compensation as such public officer or employee for any and all
8 periods of absence while engaged in the performance of ordered military
9 duty, and while going to and returning from such duty, not exceeding a
10 total of thirty days or twenty-two working days, whichever is greater,
11 in any one calendar year and not exceeding thirty days or twenty-two
12 working days, whichever is greater, in any one continuous period of such
13 absence.
14 (B) EVERY STATE CORRECTIONAL OFFICER SHALL BE PAID HIS OR HER SALARY
15 FOR ANY AND ALL PERIODS OF ABSENCE WHILE ENGAGED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF
16 ORDERED MILITARY DUTY, AND WHILE GOING TO AND RETURNING FROM SUCH DUTY,
17 NOT EXCEEDING A TOTAL OF SIXTY DAYS OR FIFTY-TWO WORKING DAYS, WHICHEVER
18 IS GREATER, IN ANY ONE CALENDAR YEAR AND NOT EXCEEDING SIXTY DAYS OR
19 FIFTY-TWO WORKING DAYS, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, IN ANY ONE CONTINUOUS
20 PERIOD OF SUCH ABSENCE.
21 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
