AN ACT to amend the public health law and the social services law, in relation to providing Medicaid reimbursement for interpretation services provided by hospital inpatient and outpatient departments

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2807-c of the public health law is amended by adding a new subdivision 34 to read as follows:

- 34. INTERPRETATION SERVICES. (A) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW, RULE OR REGULATION TO THE CONTRARY, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADJUST TIENT MEDICAL ASSISTANCE RATES OF PAYMENT TO PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT FOR 6 THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES FOR 7 RECEIPT OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE WHO HAVE LIMITED ENGLISH PATIENTS IN 8 PROFICIENCY. REIMBURSEMENT SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES AT ALL LOCATIONS DURING 9 ALL TIMES THAT PATIENT CARE IS AVAILABLE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO 10 BILLING AND MAKING APPOINTMENTS. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR 11 HEALTH CARE, REIMBURSEMENT, THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES 12 MUST 13 MENTED INSUCH A MANNER AS TO ENABLE REPORTING TO AND AUDIT BY THE 14 COMMISSIONER.
 - (B) SUCH ADJUSTMENT SHALL BE MADE FOR DISCHARGES ON AND AFTER THE FIRST OF APRIL, TWO THOUSAND TEN.
- 17 (C) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "PATIENTS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH 18 PROFICIENCY" MEANS PATIENTS WHOSE PRIMARY LANGUAGE IS NOT ENGLISH AND 19 WHO CANNOT SPEAK, READ, WRITE OR UNDERSTAND THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE AT A 20 LEVEL SUFFICIENT TO PERMIT SUCH PATIENTS TO INTERACT EFFECTIVELY WITH 21 HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND THEIR STAFF.
- 22 (D) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "INTERPRETATION SERVICES" 23 REFERS TO LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS WITH 24 PROVEN BILINGUAL SKILLS IN BOTH ENGLISH AND THE RELEVANT LANGUAGE TO

COMMUNICATE INFORMATION NECESSARY FOR THE PATIENT TO ACCESS SERVICES AND, IN THE CASE OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES PROVIDED DURING THE COURSE OF A CLINICAL ENCOUNTER, SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS TRAINED AND SKILLED IN MEDICAL INTERPRETING TECHNIQUES, ETHICS AND TERMINOLOGY.

- S 2. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 2807 of the public health law is amended by adding a new subparagraph (iii) to read as follows:
- 8 (III) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW, RULE OR REGULATION TO THE 9 CONTRARY, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADJUST RATES OF PAYMENT FOR GENERAL 10 HOSPITAL OUTPATIENT AND EMERGENCY SERVICES TO PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES 11 12 PATIENTS IN RECEIPT OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE WHO HAVE LIMITED ENGLISH SUCH ADJUSTMENT SHALL BE MADE FOR OUTPATIENT AND EMERGENCY 13 PROFICIENCY. 14 SERVICES PROVIDED ON AND AFTER APRIL FIRST, TWO THOUSAND 15 REIMBURSEMENT SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE 16 PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES AT ALL LOCATIONS DURING ALL TIMES 17 PATIENT CARE IS AVAILABLE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO HEALTH CARE, BILLING AND MAKING APPOINTMENTS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, 26 SERVICES" REFERS TO LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PROVIDED BY 27 INDIVIDUALS WITH SUFFICIENT FLUENCY IN BOTH ENGLISH AND THE RELEVANT LANGUAGE TO COMMUNICATE INFORMATION NECESSARY FOR THE PATIENT TO ACCESS 28 SERVICES AND, IN THE CASE OF INTERPRETATION PROVIDED DURING THE COURSE 29 A CLINICAL ENCOUNTER, SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS TRAINED AND 30 SKILLED IN MEDICAL INTERPRETING TECHNIQUES, SKILLS, ETHICS AND TERMINOL-31 32 OGY. HOSPITALS MUST USE A SKILLED INTERPRETER OR TRANSLATION SERVICE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS RULES AND REGULATIONS ARE PROMULGATED BY THE COMMIS-33 34 SIONER. AFTER SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS ARE PROMULGATED, HOSPITALS 35 INDIVIDUALS WHO MEET SUCH CRITERIA IN ORDER TO RECEIVE SHALL USE REIMBURSEMENT. NO REIMBURSEMENT SHALL BE PROVIDED WHEN A PATIENT 36 37 BEEN INFORMED IN HIS OR HER PRIMARY LANGUAGE OF THE AVAILABILITY OF 38 FREE INTERPRETATION AND TRANSLATION SERVICES REQUESTS THE USE OF FAMILY, 39 FRIENDS OR OTHERS WHO ARE NOT FORMALLY TRAINED IN TRANSLATION OR INTER-40 PRETATION.
 - S 3. Section 2807 of the public health law is amended by adding a new subdivision 20 to read as follows:
 - 20. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW, RULE OR REGULATION TO THE CONTRARY, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADJUST RATES OF PAYMENT FOR DIAGNOSTIC AND TREATMENT CENTERS LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE TO PROVIDE REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETA-SERVICES FOR PATIENTS IN RECEIPT OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE WHO HAVE LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY. SUCH ADJUSTMENTS SHALL BE MADE FOR SERVICES PROVIDED AT DIAGNOSTIC AND TREATMENT CENTERS LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE ON AND AFTER APRIL FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TEN. REIMBURSE-SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES AT ALL LOCATIONS DURING ALL TIMES THAT PATIENT CARE IS AVAILABLE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO HEALTH CARE, BILLING AND MAKING APPOINTMENTS. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT, THE PROVISION OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES MUST BE DOCUMENTED IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO ENABLE REPORTING TO AND AUDIT BY THE COMMISSIONER. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS

SUBDIVISION, "PATIENTS WITH LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY" MEANS PATIENTS WHOSE PRIMARY LANGUAGE IS NOT ENGLISH AND WHO CANNOT SPEAK, READ, WRITE OR UNDERSTAND THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE AT A LEVEL SUFFICIENT TO PERMIT INTERACT EFFECTIVELY WITH HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND THEIR STAFF. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "INTERPRETATION SERVICES" REFERS TO LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS WITH SUFFICIENT FLUENCY IN BOTH ENGLISH AND THE RELEVANT LANGUAGE TO COMMUNI-CATE INFORMATION NECESSARY FOR THE PATIENT TO ACCESS SERVICES AND, INTERPRETATION PROVIDED DURING THE COURSE OF A CLINICAL THE CASE OF ENCOUNTER, SERVICES PROVIDED BY INDIVIDUALS TRAINED AND SKILLED MEDICAL INTERPRETING TECHNIQUES, SKILLS, ETHICS AND TERMINOLOGY.

- S 4. Subdivision 8 of section 2807 of the public health law is amended by adding a new paragraph (g) to read as follows:
- (G) SUBJECT TO RECEIPT OF ALL NECESSARY FEDERAL APPROVALS, RATES OF PAYMENT COMPUTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE FURTHER ADJUSTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION TWENTY OF THIS SECTION.
- S 5. Subdivision 1 of section 368-a of the social services law is amended by adding a new paragraph (z) to read as follows:
- (Z) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, THE FULL AMOUNT EXPENDED FOR INTERPRETATION SERVICES PROVIDED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THIRTY-FOUR OF SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED SEVEN-C OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, OR SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF PARAGRAPH (G) OF SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED SEVEN OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, OR SUBDIVISION TWENTY OF SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED SEVEN OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, AFTER FIRST DEDUCTING THEREFROM FEDERAL FUNDS PROPERLY RECEIVED OR TO BE RECEIVED ON ACCOUNT OF SUCH EXPENDITURES.
- S 6. Notwithstanding any provision of law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the effectiveness of subdivisions 4, 7, 7-a, and 7-b of section 2807 of the public health law, and section 18 of chapter 2 of the laws of 1988, as they relate to time frames for notice, approval or certification of rates of payment, and to the requirement of prior notice of rates of payment, are hereby suspended and shall for purposes of implementing the provisions of this act be deemed to have been without any force and effect from and after February 1, 2010 for such rates effective for the period April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2011.

This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day 38 after it shall have become a law, provided that the commissioner of 39 health is immediately authorized and directed to promulgate, amend 40 and/or repeal any rules and regulations necessary to implement the 41 provisions of this act on its effective date.
