AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to use of certain titles,  
initials or abbreviations of names as signatures on absentee ballots

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY,  
DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivisions 6, 7, 8 and 9 of section 8-400 of the election  
2 law are renumbered subdivisions 7, 8, 9 and 10 and a new subdivision 6  
3 is added to read as follows:

4 6. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, THE USE OF TITLES, INITIALS OR  
5 CUSTOMARY ABBREVIATIONS OF GIVEN NAMES BY THE SIGNERS OF, OR WITNESSES  
6 TO, AN ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST LETTER, AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION  
7 FORM OR AN ABSENTEE BALLOT ENVELOPE, OR THE USE OF CUSTOMARY ABBREVI-  
8 ATIONS OF ADDRESSES OF SUCH SIGNERS OR WITNESSES, SHALL NOT INVALIDATE  
9 SUCH VOTER'S SIGNATURE OR WITNESS'S SIGNATURE ON AN APPLICATION FOR AN  
10 ABSENTEE BALLOT OR UPON CANVASS OR RECANVASS OF THE BALLOT PURSUANT TO  
11 THIS CHAPTER.

12 S 2. Subdivision 1 of section 8-506 of the election law, as amended by  
13 chapter 8 of the laws of 1978, is amended to read as follows:

14 1. During the examination of absentee, military, special federal and  
15 special presidential voters' ballot envelopes, any inspector shall, and  
16 any watcher or registered voter properly in the polling place may, chal-  
17 lenge the casting of any ballot upon the ground or grounds allowed for  
18 challenges generally, or (A) that the voter was not entitled to cast an  
19 absentee, military, special federal or special presidential ballot, or  
20 (B) that NOTWITHSTANDING THE PERMISSIVE USE OF TITLES, INITIALS OR  
21 CUSTOMARY ABBREVIATIONS OF GIVEN NAMES, the signature on the ballot  
22 envelope does not correspond to the signature on the registration poll  
23 record, or (C) that the voter died before the day of the election.

24 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-  
25 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
