AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to
allowing qualified individuals with criminal records to be employed in
certain establishments that hold liquor licenses

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The opening paragraph of subdivision 2 of section 102 of
2 the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 340 of the
3 laws of 1972, is amended to read as follows:
4 No person holding any license hereunder, other than a license to sell
5 an alcoholic beverage at retail for off-premises consumption OR A
6 LICENSE OR SPECIAL LICENSE TO SELL AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE AT RETAIL FOR
7 CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES WHERE SUCH LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE SALE OF
8 LIQUOR, BEER AND/OR WINE ON THE PREMISES OF A CATERING ESTABLISHMENT,
9 HOTEL, RESTAURANT, CLUB, OR RECREATIONAL FACILITY, shall knowingly
10 employ in connection with his business in any capacity whatsoever, any
11 person, who has been convicted of a felony, or any of the following
12 offenses, who has not subsequent to such conviction received an execu-
13 tive pardon therefor removing any civil disabilities incurred thereby, a
14 certificate of good conduct or other relief from disabilities provided
15 by law, or the written approval of the state liquor authority permitting
16 such employment, to wit:
17 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
