JOHNSON, SAVINO, SQUADRON -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Rules -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee -- recommitted to the Committee on Investigations and Government Operations in accordance with Senate Rule 6, sec. 8 -- reported favorably from said committee, ordered to first and second report, ordered to a third reading, substituted by Assembly Bill No. 6484-A, substitution reconsidered and vote reconsidered, restored to third reading, amended and ordered reprinted, retaining its place in the order of third reading

AN ACT to amend the public officers law, in relation to limiting the amount of time to appeal certain judgments regarding freedom of information violations

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 89 of the public officers law is
2 amended by adding a new paragraph (d) to read as follows:
3 (D) APPEAL TO THE APPELLATE DIVISION OF THE SUPREME COURT MUST BE MADE
4 IN ACCORDANCE WITH LAW, AND MUST BE FILED WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER
5 SERVICE BY A PARTY UPON THE APPELLANT OF A COPY OF THE JUDGMENT OR ORDER
6 APPEALED FROM AND WRITTEN NOTICE OF ITS ENTRY. AN APPEAL TAKEN FROM AN
7 ORDER OF THE COURT REQUIRING DISCLOSURE OF ANY OR ALL RECORDS SOUGHT
8 SHALL BE GIVEN PREFERENCE, SHALL BE BROUGHT ON FOR ARGUMENT ON SUCH
9 TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS THE PRESIDING JUSTICE MAY DIRECT UPON APPLICA-
10 TION OF ANY PARTY TO THE PROCEEDING, AND SHALL BE DEEMED ABANDONED WHEN
11 AN AGENCY FAILS TO SERVE AND FILE A RECORD AND BRIEF WITHIN SIX MONTHS
12 AFTER THE DATE OF THE NOTICE OF APPEAL.
13 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
