AN ACT to amend the social services law and the elder law, in relation to prescription drug pricing for pharmacy reimbursement

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of subdivision 9 of
2 section 367-a of the social services law, as amended by section 4 of
3 part C of chapter 58 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:
4 (ii) if the drug dispensed is a multiple source prescription drug or a
5 brand-name prescription drug for which no specific upper limit has been
6 set by such federal agency, the lower of the estimated acquisition cost
7 of such drug to pharmacies, or the dispensing pharmacy's usual and
8 customary price charged to the general public. For sole and multiple
9 source brand name drugs, estimated acquisition cost means [the average
10 wholesale price of a prescription drug based upon the package size
11 dispensed from, as reported by the prescription drug pricing service
12 used by the department, less sixteen and twenty-five one hundredths
13 percent] *THE WHOLESALE ACQUISITION COST OF A PRESCRIPTION DRUG BASED*
14 *UPON THE PACKAGE SIZE DISPENSED FROM, AS REPORTED BY THE PRESCRIPTION*
15 *DRUG PRICING SERVICE USED BY THE DEPARTMENT, PLUS FIVE PERCENT* thereof,
16 and updated monthly by the department; or, for a specialized HIV pharma-
17 cy, as defined in paragraph (f) of this subdivision, acquisition cost
18 means [the average wholesale price of a prescription drug based upon the
19 package size dispensed from, as reported by the prescription drug pric-
20 ing service used by the department, less twelve percent] *THE WHOLESALE*
21 *ACQUISITION COST OF A PRESCRIPTION DRUG BASED UPON THE PACKAGE SIZE*
22 *DISPENSED FROM, AS REPORTED BY THE PRESCRIPTION DRUG PRICING SERVICE*
23 *USED BY THE DEPARTMENT, PLUS EIGHT PERCENT* thereof, and updated monthly
24 by the department. For multiple source generic drugs, estimated acquisi-
25 tion cost means the lower of the average wholesale price of a

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1 prescription drug based on the package size dispensed from, as reported
2 by the prescription drug pricing service used by the department, less
3 twenty-five percent thereof, or the maximum acquisition cost, if any,
4 established pursuant to paragraph (e) of this subdivision; or, for a
5 specialized HIV pharmacy, as defined in paragraph (f) of this subdivi-
6 sion, acquisition cost means the lower of the average wholesale price of
7 a prescription drug based on the package size dispensed from, as
8 reported by the prescription drug pricing service used by the depart-
9 ment, less twelve percent thereof, or the maximum acquisition cost, if
10 any, established pursuant to paragraph (e) of this subdivision.

11 S 2. Subparagraph (1) of paragraph b of subdivision 1 of section 250
12 of the elder law, as amended by section 1 of part A of chapter 58 of the
13 laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

14 (1) [Average wholesale price discounted by sixteen and twenty-five one
15 hundredths percent] WHOLESALE ACQUISITION COST PLUS FIVE PERCENT, plus a
16 dispensing fee as defined in paragraph (c) of this subdivision, or

17 S 3. Subdivision 2 of section 250 of the elder law is amended to read
18 as follows:

19 2. For purposes of determining the amount of reimbursement which shall
20 be paid to a participating provider pharmacy, the panel shall determine
21 or cause to be determined, through a statistically valid survey, the
22 quantities of each covered drug that participating provider pharmacies
23 buy most frequently. Using the result of this survey, the contractor
24 shall update every thirty days the list of [average wholesale prices]
25 WHOLESALE ACQUISITION COSTS upon which such reimbursement is determined
26 using nationally recognized and most recently revised sources. Such
27 price revisions shall be made available to all participating provider
28 pharmacies. The pharmacist shall be reimbursed based on the price in
29 effect at the time the covered drug is dispensed.

30 S 4. This act shall take effect September 26, 2009; provided, however,
31 that the amendments made to subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b) of subdivi-
32 sion 9 of section 367-a of the social services law by section one of
33 this act shall not affect the expiration of such paragraph and shall be
34 deemed to expire therewith.
