AN ACT requiring the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services  
to develop educational materials regarding screening for alcoholism  
and chemical dependency in women to health care providers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-  
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1.     As causes, symptoms, and effects of alcoholism and  
2 substance abuse may manifest differently in women and men, the commis-  
3 sioner of the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services, in  
4 consultation with the commissioner of the department of health, shall  
5 provide and publish, in electronic or other format, educational materi-  
6 als for health care providers, as defined in subdivision six of section  
7 two hundred thirty-eight of the public health law, regarding screening,  
8 assessment, and diagnosis of alcoholism and chemical dependency in  
9 women. Such educational materials may include, but shall not be limited  
10 to, information regarding symptoms of addiction, causes of addiction,  
11 evidence based instruments health care providers may use in screening,  
12 screening techniques, how alcoholism and chemical dependency affects  
13 women's health, a referral list for treatment, a list of educational  
14 websites regarding alcoholism and chemical dependency, and literature  
15 regarding treatment and recovery. Such educational materials shall be  
16 made available to health care providers through the official website of  
17 the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services and by any other  
18 means deemed appropriate by the commissioner of the office of alcoholism  
19 and substance abuse services.  
20     S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
