AN ACT to amend the general business law and the economic development law, in relation to requiring travel consultants and travel promoters located or doing business in this state to be registered with the department of state; and to repeal article 10-A of the general business law relating to the truth in travel act

11 S 156. DOING BUSINESS WITHOUT REGISTRATION PROHIBITED. NO TRAVEL AGENT 12 SHALL OPERATE OR DO BUSINESS IN THIS STATE EXCEPT AS AUTHORIZED BY THIS 13 ARTICLE AND WITHOUT FIRST BEING REGISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

14 S 156-A. APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION. 1. APPLICATION FOR A REGISTRA-15 TION REQUIRED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE IN WRITING, UNDER OATH, AND IN 16 THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE SECRETARY, AND SHALL CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING:

17 A. THE EXACT NAME AND THE ADDRESS OF THE APPLICANT;

18 B. THE NAME AND THE BUSINESS AND RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS OF EACH PRINCIPAL 19 AND OFFICER OF THE APPLICANT;

C. THE COMPLETE ADDRESS WHERE THE BUSINESS OF THE APPLICANT IS TO BE CONDUCTED, SHOWING THE STREET AND NUMBER, IF ANY, POST OFFICE AND BUILD-ING AND ROOM NUMBER, IF ANY, THE OFFICE BUILDING AND ROOM NUMBER, IF ANY, AND THE MUNICIPALITY AND COUNTY;

D. IF THE APPLICANT HAS ONE OR MORE BRANCHES, SUBSIDIARIES OR AFFIL-IATES OPERATING IN THE STATE, THE COMPLETE ADDRESS OF EACH SUCH PLACE OF BUSINESS; AND

E. A COMPLETE SET OF TWO FINGERPRINT CARDS ON A STANDARD FINGERPRINT 27 28 CARD APPROVED BY THE DIVISION AND A FEE PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION EIGHT-A SECTION EIGHT HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, AND AMEND-29 OF MENTS THERETO, FOR THE COST OF THE DIVISION'S FULL SEARCH AND RETAIN 30 PROCEDURES, WHICH FEE SHALL BE REMITTED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO THE DIVI-31 32 SION FOR DEPOSIT BY THE COMPTROLLER INTO THE GENERAL FUND. BEFORE 33 APPROVING SUCH APPLICATION THE SECRETARY, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE, SHALL FORWARD ONE COPY OF SUCH FINGERPRINT CARD AND THE PROCESSING FEE TO THE 34 DIVISION UPON RECEIPT OF SUCH FINGERPRINTS. THE DIVISION SHALL FORWARD 35 TO THE SECRETARY A REPORT WITH RESPECT TO THE APPLICANT'S PREVIOUS CRIM-36 INAL HISTORY, IF ANY, OR A STATEMENT THAT THE APPLICANT HAS NO PREVIOUS 37 38 CRIMINAL HISTORY ACCORDING TO ITS FILES. IF ADDITIONAL COPIES OF FINGER-39 PRINTS ARE REQUIRED THE APPLICANT SHALL FURNISH THEM UPON REQUEST.

40 2. UPON ORIGINAL APPLICATION FOR A REGISTRATION TO OPERATE AS A TRAVEL 41 AGENT, THE APPLICANT SHALL PAY AN APPLICATION FEE OF ONE HUNDRED 42 DOLLARS. UPON APPLICATION FOR AN ANNUAL RENEWAL, THE REGISTRANT SHALL 43 PAY A RENEWAL PROCESSING FEE OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

44 156-B. CONDITIONS PRECEDENT TO REGISTRATION. UPON FILING OF AN S 45 APPLICATION FOR A REGISTRATION, IF THE SECRETARY SHALL BE SATISFIED OF THE GOOD CHARACTER, COMPETENCY AND INTEGRITY OF THE APPLICANT, AND OF 46 47 THE PRINCIPALS AND OFFICERS THEREOF ARE SUCH AS TO COMPLY WITH THE 48 PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE, HE OR SHE SHALL THEREUPON ISSUE A REGISTRA-49 TION IN DUPLICATE TO OPERATE AS A TRAVEL AGENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 50 PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE. THE SECRETARY SHALL TRANSMIT ONE COPY OF 51 SUCH REGISTRATION TO THE REGISTRANT AND FILE ANOTHER IN THE OFFICE OF DEPARTMENT. SUCH REGISTRATION SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT 52 THE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR UNLESS IT IS SURRENDERED BY THE REGISTRANT OR 53 54 REVOKED OR SUSPENDED AS PROVIDED IN THIS ARTICLE; IF THE SECRETARY SHALL 55 SO FIND, THE SECRETARY SHALL NOT ISSUE SUCH REGISTRATION AND THE NOT 56 SECRETARY SHALL NOTIFY THE APPLICANT OF THE DENIAL IN WRITING. THE 1 SECRETARY SHALL APPROVE OR DENY EVERY APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION WITH-2 IN NINETY DAYS FROM THE FILING THEREOF.

3 S 156-C. REGISTRATION. 1. EACH REGISTRATION ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS 4 ARTICLE SHALL STATE THE ADDRESS OR ADDRESSES AT WHICH THE BUSINESS IS TO 5 BE CONDUCTED, STATE FULLY THE NAME OF THE REGISTRANT, THE EXPIRATION 6 DATE OF THE REGISTRATION AND THE UNIQUE REGISTRATION NUMBER ASSIGNED TO 7 THE REGISTRANT. A COPY OF SUCH REGISTRATION SHALL BE PROMINENTLY POSTED 8 IN EACH PLACE OF BUSINESS OF THE REGISTRANT. SUCH REGISTRATION SHALL NOT 9 BE TRANSFERABLE OR ASSIGNABLE.

10 2. EVERY REGISTRANT SHALL INCLUDE IN EVERY COMMUNICATION, ADVERTISE-11 MENT AND CONTRACT OFFERED OR PROVIDED IN THE COURSE OF PROVIDING OR 12 OFFERING TRAVEL SERVICE, A NOTICE THAT HE, SHE OR IT IS REGISTERED 13 PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE AND THE NUMBER OF SUCH REGISTRATION. THE FAIL-14 URE TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL RESULT IN 15 MAKING THE PROVISIONS OF ANY CONTRACT AFFECTED THEREBY VOIDABLE, AT THE 16 OPTION OF THE CONSUMER.

3. IN THE EVENT THE LOCATION AT WHICH THE BUSINESS IS TO BE CONDUCTED
SHALL BE CHANGED, THE REGISTRANT SHALL FORTHWITH NOTIFY THE SECRETARY IN
WRITING, WHO SHALL THEREUPON, WITHOUT CHARGE ATTACH TO THE REGISTRATION
A RIDER SETTING FORTH SUCH CHANGED LOCATION.

4. IN THE EVENT THAT THERE SHALL BE ANY CHANGE IN THE REGISTRANT'S INFORMATION, THE REGISTRANT SHALL NOTIFY THE SECRETARY IN WRITING WITHIN TEN BUSINESS DAYS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH E OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX-A OF THIS ARTICLE.

25 5. A REGISTRATION GRANTED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE MAY BE REVIEWED BY THE DEPARTMENT UPON APPLICATION THEREFOR BY THE REGISTRANT, 26 27 IN SUCH FORM AS THE DEPARTMENT MAY PRESCRIBE, ACCOMPANIED BY THE NON-RE-FUNDABLE RENEWAL PROCESSING FEE PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION 28 ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX-A OF THIS ARTICLE. IN NO EVENT WILL RENEWAL BE 29 30 GRANTED MORE THAN SIX MONTHS AFTER THE DATE OF EXPIRATION OF A REGISTRA-TION. NO REGISTRANT SHALL CARRY ON ANY BUSINESS SUBJECT TO THIS ARTICLE 31 32 DURING ANY PERIOD WHICH MAY EXIST BETWEEN THE DATE OF EXPIRATION OF A REGISTRATION AND THE RENEWAL THEREOF. 33

6. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL POST AND MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC ON ITS 34 35 INTERNET WEBSITE A SEARCHABLE LISTING OF ALL TRAVEL AGENTS REGISTERED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE AND THEIR CORRESPONDING REGISTRATION NUMBERS. 36 SUCH LISTING SHALL BE IN BOTH ALPHABETICAL ORDER AND BY COUNTY. 37 THE PUBLIC SHALL BE ABLE TO SEARCH THE LISTING BY REGISTRANT, COUNTY, ZIP 38 CODE OR TRAVEL AGENT REGISTRATION NUMBER. ALSO, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 39 40 PROVIDE A REAL TIME UPDATE OF SUCH INFORMATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR CONSPICUOUS INCLUSION ON THE STATE MARKETING 41 INTERNET WEBSITE PURSUANT TO SECTION ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR OF THE 42 STATE 43 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT LAW AND FOR DISSEMINATION, UPON REQUEST, AT TOURISM FACILITIES OPERATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. 44

S 156-D. GROUNDS FOR DENIAL, SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION.
THE SECRETARY SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO SUSPEND OR REVOKE A REGISTRATION OR, IN LIEU THEREOF, TO IMPOSE A FINE NOT EXCEEDING ONE THOUSAND
DOLLARS PAYABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT, OR REPRIMAND ANY REGISTRANT OR DENY
AN APPLICATION FOR A REGISTRATION OR RENEWAL THEREOF UPON PROOF:

50 A. THAT THE APPLICANT OR REGISTRANT HAS VIOLATED ANY OF THE PROVISIONS 51 OF THIS ARTICLE OR THE RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED PURSUANT THERE-52 TO;

53 B. THAT THE APPLICANT OR REGISTRANT HAS PRACTICED FRAUD, DECEIT OR 54 MISREPRESENTATION;

1 C. THAT THE APPLICANT OR REGISTRANT HAS KNOWINGLY MADE A MATERIAL 2 MISSTATEMENT IN THE APPLICATION FOR OR RENEWAL OF HIS OR HER REGISTRA-3 TION; OR

4 D. THAT THE APPLICANT OR REGISTRANT HAS DEMONSTRATED INCOMPETENCE OR 5 UNTRUSTWORTHINESS IN HIS OR HER ACTIONS.

6 2. NO REGISTRATION SHALL BE REVOKED OR SUSPENDED EXCEPT AFTER WRITTEN
7 NOTICE AND A HEARING AS SET FORTH IN SUBDIVISIONS TWO, THREE, FOUR, FIVE
8 AND SIX OF SECTION SEVENTY-NINE OF THIS CHAPTER.

9 3. EVERY REGISTRATION ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE SHALL REMAIN IN 10 FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR UNLESS THE SAME SHALL 11 HAVE BEEN SURRENDERED, REVOKED OR SUSPENDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 12 PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE, BUT THE SECRETARY SHALL HAVE AUTHORITY TO 13 REINSTATE A SUSPENDED REGISTRATION OR TO ISSUE A NEW REGISTRATION TO A 14 REGISTRANT WHOSE REGISTRATION SHALL HAVE BEEN REVOKED IF NO FACT OR 15 CONDITION THEN EXISTS WHICH WOULD HAVE WARRANTED THE SECRETARY IN REFUS-16 ING ORIGINALLY TO ISSUE SUCH REGISTRATION UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

4. WHENEVER THE SECRETARY SHALL REVOKE OR SUSPEND A REGISTRATION ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE, THE SECRETARY SHALL FORTHWITH EXECUTE IN DUPLICATE A WRITTEN ORDER TO THAT EFFECT. THE SECRETARY SHALL FILE ONE COPY OF SUCH ORDER IN THE OFFICE OF THE DEPARTMENT AND SHALL FORTH-WITH SERVE THE OTHER COPY UPON THE REGISTRANT. ANY SUCH ORDER MAY BE REVIEWED IN THE MANNER PROVIDED BY ARTICLE SEVENTY-EIGHT OF THE CIVIL PRACTICE LAW AND RULES.

24 S 156-E. PREEMPTION. THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX, 25 FIFTY-SIX-A, ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX-B, ONE HUNDRED HUNDRED ONE 26 FIFTY-SIX-C AND ONE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX-D OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL EXCLUSIVE-27 LY GOVERN ALL TRAVEL AGENTS NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF ANY OTHER 28 LAW TO THE CONTRARY, AND FURTHERMORE, NO LOCAL LAW, CODE OR ORDINANCE SHALL BE ENACTED WHICH SHALL REOUIRE ANY FEE, LICENSE OR REGISTRATION 29 FOR THE LICENSURE OR REGISTRATION OF TRAVEL AGENTS. 30

31 S 156-F. REGULATIONS. THE SECRETARY IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED 32 TO MAKE SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER CONDUCT OF 33 THE BUSINESS AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE, AND NOT INCONSISTENT WITH 34 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.

35 TRAVEL AGREEMENTS. 1. WHEN A PERSON AGREES, IN RESPONSE TO A 157.
