AN ACT to amend the multiple dwelling law and the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to clarifying certain provisions relating to occupancy of class A multiple dwellings

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 8 of section 4 of the multiple
2 dwelling law, as amended by chapter 562 of the laws of 1954, is amended
3 to read as follows:
4 a. A "class A" multiple dwelling is a multiple dwelling [which] THAT
5 is occupied[, as a rule,] for permanent residence purposes. This class
6 shall include tenements, flat houses, maisonette apartments, apartment
7 houses, apartment hotels, bachelor apartments, studio apartments, duplex
8 apartments, kitchenette apartments, garden-type maisonette dwelling
9 projects, and all other multiple dwellings except class B multiple
10 dwellings. A CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLING SHALL ONLY BE USED FOR PERMANENT
11 RESIDENCE PURPOSES. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS DEFINITION, "PERMANENT
12 RESIDENCE PURPOSES" SHALL CONSIST OF OCCUPANCY OF A DWELLING UNIT BY THE
13 SAME NATURAL PERSON OR FAMILY FOR THIRTY CONSECUTIVE DAYS OR MORE AND A
14 PERSON OR FAMILY SO OCCUPYING A DWELLING UNIT SHALL BE REFERRED TO HERE-
15 IN AS THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT. THE FOLLOWING USES
16 OF A DWELLING UNIT BY THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS THEREOF SHALL NOT BE
17 DEEMED TO BE INCONSISTENT WITH THE OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR
18 PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES:
19 (1) OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR FEWER THAN THIRTY CONSECUTIVE
20 DAYS BY OTHER NATURAL PERSONS LIVING WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD OF THE PERMA-
21 NENT OCCUPANT SUCH AS HOUSE GUESTS OR LAWFUL BOARDERS, ROOMERS OR LODG-
22 ERS; OR

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[] is old law to be omitted.

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(2) INCIDENTAL AND OCCASIONAL OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR FEWER THAN THIRTY CONSECUTIVE DAYS BY OTHER NATURAL PERSONS WHEN THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS ARE TEMPORARILY ABSENT FOR PERSONAL REASONS SUCH AS VACATION OR MEDICAL TREATMENT, PROVIDED THAT THERE IS NO MONETARY COMPENSATION PAID TO THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS FOR SUCH OCCUPANCY.

S 2. Section 67 of the multiple dwelling law is amended by adding a new subdivision 16 to read as follows:

16. A. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, WITHIN A DWELLING TO WHICH THIS SECTION IS APPLICABLE THE USE OF DWELLING UNITS AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES, AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH A OF SUBDIVISION EIGHT OF SECTION FOUR OF THIS CHAPTER, THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE PROHIBITED SHALL BE PERMITTED TO CONTINUE FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION PROVIDED THAT:

(1) SUCH DWELLING UNITS WERE USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE AND ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION AND FIFTY-ONE PERCENT OR MORE OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DWELLING UNITS IN SUCH DWELLING WERE USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON SUCH DATES;

(2) SUCH DWELLING WAS OCCUPIED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE;

(3) SUCH DWELLING IS OF FIREPROOF CONSTRUCTION AND WAS OF FIREPROOF CONSTRUCTION ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE;

(4) SUCH DWELLING UNITS USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES HAVE AT LEAST TWO LAWFUL MEANS OF EGRESS, INCLUDING EXIT STAIRS, FIRE TOWERS OR EXTERIOR STAIRS BUT EXCLUDING FIRE ESCAPES AND HAD SUCH LAWFUL MEANS OF EGRESS ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE;

(5) SUCH DWELLING HAS OPERATIONAL EXIT SIGNS AND A FIRE ALARM SYSTEM COMPLYING WITH THE PROVISIONS FOR EXISTING TRANSIENT OCCUPANCIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH LOCAL LAW AND HAD SUCH EXIT SIGNS AND FIRE ALARM SYSTEM ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE; AND

(6) SUCH DWELLING UNITS USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ARE REGISTERED WITH THE DEPARTMENT WITHIN ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION IN A FORM AND MANNER TO BE PROVIDED BY SUCH DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING A REQUIREMENT THAT THE APPLICANT SUBMIT CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH SUBPARAGRAPHS THREE, FOUR AND FIVE OF THIS PARAGRAPH, SIGNED AND SEALED BY A REGISTERED ARCHITECT OR LICENSED PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER IN GOOD STANDING UNDER THE EDUCATION LAW. THE DEPARTMENT MAY ASSESS FEES TO COVER ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SUCH REGISTRATION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY REFUSE TO REGISTER DWELLING UNITS OR MAY REVOKE SUCH REGISTRATION IF IT DETERMINES SUCH DWELLING UNITS OR DWELLING DO NOT COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS FOR REGISTRATION SET FORTH IN SUBPARAGRAPHS ONE THROUGH FIVE OF THIS PARAGRAPH.

B. THE OWNER SHALL OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY FOR THE USE OF REGISTERED DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION. UPON APPLICATION PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF SUCH TWO YEAR PERIOD, THE DEPARTMENT MAY, FOR GOOD CAUSE, EXTEND SUCH TIME FOR UP TO ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR BUT NO SUCH EXTENSION SHALL BE GRANTED UNLESS THE DEPARTMENT FINDS THAT:

(1) THE OWNER HAS OBTAINED THE NECESSARY PERMIT OR PERMITS FOR ALL WORK NECESSARY TO BRING SUCH DWELLING INTO COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER AND ALL LOCAL HOUSING, BUILDING AND FIRE CODES FOR THE USE OF DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES;

(2) ALL CONSTRUCTION AUTHORIZED BY SUCH PERMIT OR PERMITS HAS BEEN SUBSTANTIALLY COMPLETED; AND

(3) THERE ARE NO CONSIDERATIONS OF PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE THAT HAVE BECOME APPARENT SINCE THE ISSUANCE OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED PERMIT OR PERMITS THAT INDICATE AN OVERRIDING BENEFIT TO THE PUBLIC IN ENFORCING THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE APPLICANT OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY FOR THE USE OF REGISTERED DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION.

C. UPON APPLICATION PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF THE TIME FOR OBTAINING A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY, AS EXTENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH B OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE BOARD OF STANDARDS AND APPEALS MAY GRANT FURTHER EXTENSIONS OF TIME TO OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IN A CASE WHERE THERE ARE CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND THE APPLICANT'S CONTROL OR HARDSHIP IN THE WAY OF OBTAINING SUCH CERTIFICATE WITHIN THE TIME ALLOWED BY THE DEPARTMENT BUT NO MORE THAN TWO SUCH EXTENSIONS OF ONE YEAR EACH SHALL BE GRANTED FOR A BUILDING AND NO SUCH EXTENSION SHALL BE GRANTED UNLESS THE BOARD FINDS THAT THERE ARE NO OUTSTANDING BUILDING OR FIRE CODE VIOLATIONS OF RECORD AT THE PROPERTY.

D. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE SUCH CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY UPON PROOF THAT SAID DWELLING CONFORMS IN ALL RESPECTS TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER AND ALL LOCAL HOUSING, BUILDING AND FIRE CODES FOR THE USE OF DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES. IF NO SUCH CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IS ISSUED WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION OR, IF APPLICABLE, WITHIN THE TIME AS EXTENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR AS FURTHER EXTENDED BY THE BOARD OF STANDARDS AND APPEALS, ALL USE OF DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES SHALL THEREAFTER CEASE.

E. IF AFTER A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH D OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE USE OF SUCH DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES IS DISCONTINUED, NOTHING IN THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE APPLICATION OF THE LOCAL ZONING RESOLUTION WITH RESPECT TO SUCH DISCONTINUANCE.

S 3. Article 4 of the multiple dwelling law is amended by adding a new title 3 to read as follows:

TITLE 3
CERTAIN CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLINGS ERECTED PRIOR TO
DECEMBER 15, 1961

SECTION 120. USE OF DWELLING UNITS IN A CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLING FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES.

S 120. USE OF DWELLING UNITS IN A CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLING FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES. 1. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, WITHIN A CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLING TO WHICH THIS ARTICLE IS APPLICABLE THE USE OF DWELLING UNITS AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES, AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH A OF SUBDIVISION EIGHT OF SECTION FOUR OF THIS CHAPTER, THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE PROHIBITED SHALL BE PERMITTED TO CONTINUE FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION PROVIDED THAT:

A. SUCH DWELLING UNITS WERE USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE AND ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION AND FIFTY-ONE PERCENT OR MORE OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF DWELLING UNITS IN SUCH DWELLING WERE USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON SUCH DATES;

B. (1) SUCH DWELLING WAS INITIALLY CONSTRUCTED AS AND IDENTIFIED ON ITS INITIAL CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY AS "APARTMENT HOTEL" OR "CLASS A HOTEL" AND OCCUPIED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE

1 PURPOSES ON DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE OR, IF SUCH
2 DWELLING WAS UNDER CONSTRUCTION AND NOT YET COMPLETE ON SUCH DATE, WAS
3 OCCUPIED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES AT THE
4 TIME THE DWELLING WAS COMPLETED, OR (2) SUCH DWELLING IS IN ZONING
5 DISTRICT C5 AS DESIGNATED IN THE NEW YORK CITY ZONING RESOLUTION AND WAS
6 INITIALLY CONSTRUCTED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE
7 PURPOSES PRIOR TO DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE AND
8 OCCUPIED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES ON
9 DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE, OR (3) SUCH DWELLING (A)
10 IS WITHIN TWELVE HUNDRED FEET OF ZONING DISTRICT C5 AS DESIGNATED IN THE
11 NEW YORK CITY ZONING RESOLUTION, (B) WAS INITIALLY CONSTRUCTED AS A
12 HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES IN ACCORDANCE WITH A
13 PERMIT THAT WAS ISSUED PRIOR TO DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN HUNDRED
14 SIXTY-ONE, AND (C) WAS COMPLETED AFTER DECEMBER FIFTEENTH, NINETEEN
15 HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE AND WAS INITIALLY OCCUPIED AS A HOTEL FOR OTHER THAN
16 PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES;

17 C. SUCH DWELLING IS OF FIREPROOF CONSTRUCTION AND WAS OF FIREPROOF
18 CONSTRUCTION ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE;

19 D. SUCH DWELLING UNITS USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE
20 PURPOSES HAVE AT LEAST TWO LAWFUL MEANS OF EGRESS, INCLUDING EXIT
21 STAIRS, FIRE TOWERS OR EXTERIOR STAIRS BUT EXCLUDING FIRE ESCAPES AND
22 HAD SUCH LAWFUL MEANS OF EGRESS ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE;

23 E. SUCH DWELLING HAS OPERATIONAL EXIST SIGNS AND A FIRE ALARM SYSTEM
24 COMPLYING WITH THE PROVISIONS FOR EXISTING TRANSIENT OCCUPANCIES IN
25 ACCORDANCE WITH LOCAL LAW AND HAD SUCH EXIT SIGNS AND FIRE ALARM SYSTEM
26 ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE; AND

27 F. SUCH DWELLING UNITS USED FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE
28 PURPOSES ARE REGISTERED WITH THE DEPARTMENT WITHIN ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY
29 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION IN A FORM AND MANNER TO BE
30 PROVIDED BY SUCH DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING A REQUIREMENT THAT THE APPLICANT
31 SUBMIT CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH PARAGRAPHS D AND E OF THIS
32 SUBDIVISION, SIGNED AND SEALED BY A REGISTERED ARCHITECT OR LICENSED
33 PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER IN GOOD STANDING UNDER THE EDUCATION LAW. THE
34 DEPARTMENT MAY ASSESS FEES TO COVER ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SUCH
35 REGISTRATION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY REFUSE TO REGISTER DWELLING UNITS OR
36 MAY REVOKE SUCH REGISTRATION IF IT DETERMINES SUCH DWELLING UNITS OR
37 DWELLING DO NOT COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS FOR REGISTRATION SET FORTH IN
38 PARAGRAPHS A THROUGH E OF THIS SUBDIVISION.

39 2. THE OWNER SHALL OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY FOR THE USE OF
40 REGISTERED DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES
41 WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION. UPON APPLICA-
42 TION PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF SUCH TWO YEAR PERIOD, THE DEPARTMENT
43 MAY, FOR GOOD CAUSE, EXTEND SUCH TIME FOR UP TO ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR BUT
44 NO SUCH EXTENSION SHALL BE GRANTED UNLESS THE DEPARTMENT FINDS THAT:

45 A. THE OWNER HAS OBTAINED THE NECESSARY PERMIT OR PERMITS FOR ALL WORK
46 NECESSARY TO BRING SUCH DWELLING INTO COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS
47 OF THIS CHAPTER AND ALL LOCAL HOUSING, BUILDING AND FIRE CODES FOR THE
48 USE OF DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES;

49 B. ALL CONSTRUCTION AUTHORIZED BY SUCH PERMIT OR PERMITS HAS BEEN
50 SUBSTANTIALLY COMPLETED; AND

51 C. THERE ARE NO CONSIDERATIONS OF PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE
52 THAT HAVE BECOME APPARENT SINCE THE ISSUANCE OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED
53 PERMIT OR PERMITS THAT INDICATE AN OVERRIDING BENEFIT TO THE PUBLIC IN
54 ENFORCING THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE APPLICANT OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF
55 OCCUPANCY FOR THE USE OF REGISTERED DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMA-

1 NENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF
2 THIS SECTION.

3 3. UPON APPLICATION PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF THE TIME FOR OBTAINING
4 A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY, AS EXTENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO
5 SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION, THE BOARD OF STANDARDS AND APPEALS MAY
6 GRANT FURTHER EXTENSIONS OF TIME TO OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IN
7 A CASE WHERE THERE ARE CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND THE APPLICANT'S CONTROL OR
8 HARDSHIP IN THE WAY OF OBTAINING SUCH CERTIFICATE WITHIN THE TIME
9 ALLOWED BY THE DEPARTMENT BUT NO MORE THAN TWO SUCH EXTENSIONS OF ONE
10 YEAR EACH SHALL BE GRANTED FOR A BUILDING AND NO SUCH EXTENSION SHALL BE
11 GRANTED UNLESS THE BOARD FINDS THAT THERE ARE NO OUTSTANDING BUILDING OR
12 FIRE CODE VIOLATIONS OF RECORD AT THE PROPERTY.

13 4. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE SUCH CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY UPON PROOF
14 THAT SAID DWELLING CONFORMS IN ALL RESPECTS TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
15 CHAPTER AND ALL LOCAL HOUSING, BUILDING AND FIRE CODES FOR THE USE OF
16 DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES. IF NO SUCH
17 CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IS ISSUED WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE
18 DATE OF THIS SECTION OR, IF APPLICABLE, WITHIN THE TIME AS EXTENDED BY
19 THE DEPARTMENT OR AS FURTHER EXTENDED BY THE BOARD OF STANDARDS AND
20 APPEALS, ALL USE OF DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN PERMANENT RESIDENCE
21 PURPOSES SHALL THEREAFTER CEASE.

22 5. IF AFTER A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVI-
23 SION FOUR OF THIS SECTION, THE USE OF SUCH DWELLING UNITS FOR OTHER THAN
24 PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES IS DISCONTINUED, NOTHING IN THIS SECTION
25 SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE APPLICATION OF THE LOCAL ZONING RESOL-
26 UTION WITH RESPECT TO SUCH DISCONTINUANCE.

27 S 4. Subdivisions 1 and 16 of section 248 of the multiple dwelling
28 law, subdivision 1 as amended by chapter 116 of the laws of 1950, are
29 amended to read as follows:

30 1. It shall be unlawful to occupy any frame multiple dwelling for
31 single room occupancy. It shall be unlawful to occupy any other existing
32 class A dwelling or part thereof as a rooming house or furnished room
33 house or for single room occupancy unless such dwelling or part shall
34 conform to the provisions of this section and to such other provisions
35 of this chapter as were applicable to such dwelling before such conver-
36 sion. This section shall not be construed to prohibit the letting by a
37 family of one or more rooms within their apartment to not more than a
38 total of four boarders, roomers or lodgers provided, however, that every
39 room in such apartment shall have free and unobstructed access to each
40 required exit from such apartment as required by the provisions of para-
41 graphs a, b and c of subdivision four of this section. A dwelling occu-
42 pied pursuant to this section shall be deemed a class A dwelling AND
43 DWELLING UNITS OCCUPIED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL BE OCCUPIED FOR
44 PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES, AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH A OF SUBDIVISION
45 EIGHT OF SECTION FOUR OF THIS CHAPTER.

46 [16. It shall be unlawful to rent any room in any such dwelling for a

This occupancy shall include buildings or portions thereof containing sleeping units or more than two dwelling units that are occupied[, as a rule, for shelter and sleeping accommodation on a long-term basis for a month or more at a time] FOR PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES AS DEFINED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (A) OF PARAGRAPH EIGHT OF SUBDIVISION A OF SECTION 27-2004 OF THE NEW YORK CITY HOUSING MAINTENANCE CODE. Such occupancy shall be subject to the New York State Multiple Dwelling Law. This group shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

Adult homes or enriched housing with 16 or fewer occupants requiring supervised care on a 24-hour basis in the same building, provided that the number of occupants per dwelling unit does not exceed the definition of a family

Apartment houses

Apartment hotels (nontransient)

Class A multiple dwellings as defined in Section 27-2004 of the New York City Housing Maintenance Code and Section 4 of the New York State Multiple Dwelling Law, including the following:

1. Dwelling units where the resident of the unit provides custodial care to no more than four persons on less than a 24-hour basis and not overnight.

2. Dwelling units where the resident of the unit provides child custodial care as a family day care home registered with the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in accordance with the New York State Social Services Law with no more than six children between the ages of 2 and 13, or with no more than five children if any are under the age of 2, receiving supervised care on less than a 24-hour basis and not overnight.

Exception: Class A multiple dwellings classified in Group I-1.

Convents and monasteries with more than 20 occupants in the building

Student apartments

S 7. Subparagraph (a) of paragraph 8 of subdivision a of section 27-2004 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended to read as follows:

(a) A class A multiple dwelling is a multiple dwelling [which] THAT is occupied[, as a rule,] for permanent residence purposes. This class shall include tenements, flat houses, maisonette apartments, apartment houses, apartment hotels, bachelor apartments, studio apartments, duplex apartments, kitchenette apartments, garden-type maisonette dwelling projects, and all other multiple dwellings except class B multiple dwellings. A CLASS A MULTIPLE DWELLING SHALL ONLY BE USED FOR PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, "PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES" SHALL CONSIST OF OCCUPANCY OF A DWELLING UNIT BY THE SAME NATURAL PERSON OR FAMILY FOR THIRTY CONSECUTIVE DAYS OR MORE, AND A NATURAL PERSON OR FAMILY SO OCCUPYING A DWELLING UNIT SHALL BE REFERRED TO HEREIN AS THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT. THE FOLLOWING USES OF A DWELLING UNIT BY THE PERMANENT OCCUPANTS THEREOF SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO BE INCONSISTENT WITH OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR PERMANENT RESIDENCE PURPOSES:

(1) OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR FEWER THAN THIRTY CONSECUTIVE DAYS BY OTHER NATURAL PERSONS LIVING WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD OF THE PERMANENT OCCUPANT SUCH AS HOUSE GUESTS OR LAWFUL BOARDERS, ROOMERS OR LODGERS; OR

1 (2) INCIDENTAL AND OCCASIONAL OCCUPANCY OF SUCH DWELLING UNIT FOR
2 FEWER THAN THIRTY CONSECUTIVE DAYS BY OTHER NATURAL PERSONS WHEN THE
3 PERMANENT OCCUPANTS ARE TEMPORARILY ABSENT FOR PERSONAL REASONS SUCH AS
4 VACATION OR MEDICAL TREATMENT, PROVIDED THAT THERE IS NO MONETARY
