AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to peace/conflict resolution centers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Legislative intent. Peace/conflict resolution centers already in operation at Luperon and Heritage High Schools in Washington Heights have demonstrated that mediation of disputes can reduce violence schools, reduce the number of suspensions, and promote constructive conflict management. Peer mediation develops leadership skills among pupils and enables them to apply those skills immediately in their 7 schools. This legislation requires every school district in the state to 8 maintain a peace/conflict resolution center.
- 9 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 1504-a to 10 read as follows:
- 1504-A. PEACE/CONFLICT RESOLUTION CENTERS. 1. ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS 11 ARE HEREBY REQUIRED TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A PEACE/CONFLICT RESOL-12 13 UTION CENTER.
 - 2. SUCH PEACE/CONFLICT RESOLUTION CENTERS SHALL:
 - (A) PROVIDE FOR THE SUPERVISED PEER MEDIATION OF CONFLICTS;
- (B) DEVELOP PUPIL LEADERSHIP SKILLS; AND 16

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- 17 (C) PROMOTE PEACEFUL ATMOSPHERES IN SCHOOLS AND THE SURROUNDING COMMU-18 NITIES.
- 19 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
