Introduced by M. of A. KELLNER -- read once and referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations

AN ACT to amend the public officers law, in relation to requiring public disclosure of certain state agency materials; and to amend the state technology law, in relation to authorizing the office for technology to publish a technical standards manual for the publishing of records on the internet by state agencies

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Open New
2 York Act".

3 S 2. Section 86 of the public officers law is amended by adding four
4 new subdivisions 6, 7, 8 and 9 to read as follows:

5 6. "CONSENSUS" MEANS GENERAL AGREEMENT, BUT NOT NECESSARILY UNANIMITY,
6 AND INCLUDES A PROCESS FOR ATTEMPTING TO RESOLVE OBJECTIONS BY INTER-
7 ESTED PARTIES, AS LONG AS ALL COMMENTS HAVE BEEN FAIRLY CONSIDERED.

8 7. "TECHNICAL STANDARD" MEANS (A) THE COMMON AND REPEATED USE OF
9 RULES, CONDITIONS, GUIDELINES OR CHARACTERISTICS FOR PRODUCTS OR RELATED
10 PROCESSES AND PRODUCTION METHODS, AND RELATED MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS PRAC-
11 TICES AND (B) THE DEFINITION OF TERMS; CLASSIFICATION OF COMPONENTS,
12 DELINEATION OF PROCEDURES; SPECIFICATIONS OF DIMENSIONS, MATERIALS,
13 PERFORMANCE, DESIGNS OR OPERATIONS; MEASUREMENT OF QUALITY AND QUANTITY
14 IN DESCRIBING MATERIALS, PROCESSES, PRODUCTS, SYSTEMS, SERVICES OR PRAC-
15 TICES; TEST METHODS AND SAMPLING PROCEDURES; OR DESCRIPTIONS OF FIT AND
16 MEASUREMENTS OF SIZE OR STRENGTH.

17 8. "VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS STANDARDS" MEANS STANDARDS DEVELOPED OR
18 ADOPTED BY VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS STANDARDS BODIES, BOTH DOMESTIC AND
19 INTERNATIONAL. THESE STANDARDS INCLUDE PROVISIONS REQUIRING THAT OWNERS
20 OF RELEVANT INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AGREE TO MAKE SUCH INTELLECTUAL PROP-
21 ERTY AVAILABLE ON A NON-DISCRIMINATORY, ROYALTY-FREE OR REASONABLE
22 ROYALTY BASIS TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES.

23 9. "VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS STANDARDS BODIES" MEANS DOMESTIC OR INTERNA-
24 TIONAL ORGANIZATIONS WHICH PLAN, DEVELOP, ESTABLISH, OR COORDINATE
25 VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS STANDARDS USING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES.

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1 S 3. The opening paragraph of paragraph c of subdivision 1 of section
2 87 of the public officers law, as added by chapter 223 of the laws of
3 2008, is amended and a new subdivision 2-a is added to read as follows:

4 In determining the actual cost of reproducing a PHYSICAL COPY OF A
5 record, an agency may include only:

6 2-A. ALL RECORDS AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION
7 SHALL BE AVAILABLE IN ELECTRONIC FORM PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
8 SECTION AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN-A
9 OF THIS ARTICLE.

10 S 4. The public officers law is amended by adding a new section 87-a
11 to read as follows:

12 S 87-A. STATE INTERNET RECORDS POLICY. 1. (A) THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN
13 GOVERNMENT SHALL PROMULGATE RULES ESTABLISHING AN INTERNET RECORD POLICY
14 FOR THE STATE OF NEW YORK NO LATER THAN JANUARY THIRD, TWO THOUSAND
15 ELEVEN, FOR THE PURPOSES OF MAKING AGENCY RECORDS AVAILABLE ON THE
16 INTERNET AND ENSURING AGENCY COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
17 ARTICLE. SUCH POLICY SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, GUIDELINES TO
18 ASSIST AGENCIES IN CLASSIFYING THEIR RECORDS EITHER AS IMMEDIATE, PRIOR-
19 ITY, LEGACY OR EXEMPT PURSUANT TO THE AGENCY COMPLIANCE PLAN DESCRIBED
20 IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION.

21 (B) THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN GOVERNMENT SHALL CONSULT WITH THE OFFICE FOR
22 TECHNOLOGY REGARDING THE PREPARATION, PUBLICATION AND PERIODIC UPDATING
23 OF A TECHNICAL STANDARDS MANUAL FOR THE PUBLISHING OF RECORDS ON THE
24 INTERNET BY STATE AGENCIES AS PROVIDED IN SUBDIVISION TWELVE-C OF
25 SECTION ONE HUNDRED THREE OF THE STATE TECHNOLOGY LAW.

26 (C) EACH STATE AGENCY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE OFFICE FOR TECHNOLOGY
27 AND THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN GOVERNMENT, SHALL REVIEW ALL RECORDS UNDER ITS
28 CONTROL AND SHALL CLASSIFY THEM AS IMMEDIATE, PRIORITY, LEGACY OR EXEMPT
29 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION.

30 (D) EACH STATE AGENCY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE OFFICE FOR TECHNOLOGY
31 AND THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN GOVERNMENT, SHALL SUBMIT AN AGENCY COMPLIANCE
32 PLAN TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATURE NO LATER THAN JANUARY THIRD,
33 TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN. SUCH PLAN SHALL DESCRIBE HOW SUCH AGENCY INTENDS TO
34 ACHIEVE FULL COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION BY JULY
35 SEVENTH, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN, AND SHALL INCLUDE AN ACCOUNTING OF ALL
36 RECORDS UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE AGENCY AND HOW SUCH RECORDS HAVE BEEN
37 CLASSIFIED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION.

38 2. (A) EACH STATE AGENCY SHALL MAKE ITS RECORDS AVAILABLE FOR
39 INSPECTION BY THE PUBLIC ON THE INTERNET THROUGH A SINGLE WEB PORTAL
40 PURSUANT TO THE TIMETABLE ESTABLISHED BY THE AGENCY IN ITS AGENCY
41 COMPLIANCE PLAN.

42 (B) ALL RECORDS SHALL BE AVAILABLE ON A PERMANENT BASIS, IN
43 MACHINE-READABLE AND UNPROCESSED ELECTRONIC FORMAT AND IN THEIR COMPLETE
44 FORM, EXCEPT FOR THOSE RECORDS OR PORTIONS OF RECORDS CLASSIFIED AS
45 EXEMPT PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION.

46 (C) ALL RECORDS SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC WITHOUT ANY REGISTRA-
47 TION REQUIREMENT, LICENSE REQUIREMENT, FEES, OR RESTRICTIONS ON THEIR
48 USE UNLESS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY LAW.

49 3. STATE AGENCY RECORDS SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS FOLLOWS:

50 (A) IMMEDIATE: ANY RECORD IN POSSESSION OF AN AGENCY AS OF THE EFFEC-
51 TIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION AND ANY RECORD SUCH AGENCY ACQUIRES OR CREATES
52 AFTER SUCH EFFECTIVE DATE THROUGH JANUARY THIRD, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN,
53 THAT CAN BE MADE AVAILABLE ON THE INTERNET PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF
54 SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN OF THIS ARTICLE WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF THE AGENCY
55 ACQUIRING OR CREATING SUCH RECORD SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS IMMEDIATE.
56 AGENCIES SHOULD MAKE BEST EFFORTS TO CLASSIFY AS MANY RECORDS AS IMMEDI-

1 ATE AS IS POSSIBLE. ANY RECORD ACQUIRED OR CREATED AFTER JANUARY THIRD,
2 TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS IMMEDIATE, AND SHALL BE MADE
3 AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN OF THIS
4 ARTICLE IN AS CLOSE TO REAL-TIME AS POSSIBLE;

5 (B) LEGACY: ANY RECORD THAT, DUE TO ITS SIZE OR COMPLEXITY, OR DUE TO
6 TECHNOLOGY CONSTRAINTS, CANNOT BE MADE AVAILABLE ON THE INTERNET PURSU-
7 ANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN OF THIS ARTICLE BY JULY
8 SEVENTH, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN, SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS LEGACY. AGENCIES
9 SHALL MAKE BEST EFFORTS TO AVOID PLACING RECORDS INTO THE LEGACY CLASSI-
10 FICATION;

11 (C) PRIORITY: ANY RECORD THAT IS NOT CLASSIFIED AS IMMEDIATE, LEGACY
12 OR EXEMPT SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS PRIORITY; OR

13 (D) EXEMPT: ANY RECORD OR PORTION OF A RECORD WHICH IS NOT REQUIRED TO
14 BE DISCLOSED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION
15 EIGHTY-SEVEN OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS EXEMPT.

16 4. STATE AGENCY RECORDS SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE ON THE INTERNET
17 ACCORDING TO THE FOLLOWING SCHEDULE:

18 (A) RECORDS CLASSIFIED AS IMMEDIATE SHALL BE AVAILABLE NO LATER THAN
19 JULY FOURTH, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN;

20 (B) RECORDS CLASSIFIED AS PRIORITY SHALL BE AVAILABLE NO LATER THAN
21 JULY SECOND, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE;

22 (C) RECORDS CLASSIFIED AS LEGACY SHALL BE AVAILABLE NO LATER THAN JULY
23 SEVENTH, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN;

24 (D) RECORDS OR PORTIONS OF RECORDS SPECIFIED AS EXEMPT SHALL BE EXEMPT
25 FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

26 5. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (C) OF SUBDIVISION ONE
27 OF SECTION EIGHTY-SEVEN OF THIS ARTICLE, NO FEES MAY BE CHARGED FOR
28 PHYSICAL COPIES OF RECORDS:

29 (A) WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS IMMEDIATE ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONS OF
30 THIS SECTION AND WHICH ARE NOT AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO PROVISIONS OF THIS
31 SECTION ON OR AFTER JULY FOURTH, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN;

32 (B) WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS PRIORITY ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONS OF
33 THIS SECTION AND WHICH ARE NOT AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO PROVISIONS OF THIS
34 SECTION ON OR AFTER JULY SECOND, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE; OR

35 (C) WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS LEGACY ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
36 SECTION AND WHICH ARE NOT AVAILABLE PURSUANT TO PROVISIONS OF THIS
37 SECTION ON OR AFTER JULY SEVENTH, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN.

38 S 5. Section 103 of the state technology law is amended by adding a
39 new subdivision 12-c to read as follows:

40 12-C. IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN GOVERNMENT, TO
41 PREPARE AND PUBLISH A TECHNICAL STANDARDS MANUAL FOR THE PUBLISHING OF
42 RECORDS ON THE INTERNET BY STATE AGENCIES AS PROVIDED IN ARTICLE SIX OF
43 THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW NO LATER THAN JANUARY THIRD, TWO THOUSAND ELEV-
44 EN, AND SHALL BASE SUCH MANUAL ON TECHNICAL STANDARDS FOR WEB PUBLISHING
45 AND E-GOVERNMENT THAT HAVE BEEN DEVELOPED OR ADOPTED BY VOLUNTARY
46 CONSENSUS STANDARDS BODIES. SUCH MANUAL SHALL BE UPDATED BY THE OFFICE,
47 IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE COMMITTEE ON OPEN GOVERNMENT, AS NECESSARY. THE
48 OFFICE SHALL CONSULT WITH VOLUNTARY CONSENSUS STANDARDS BODIES AND
49 SHALL, WHEN SUCH PARTICIPATION IS FEASIBLE, IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND
50 IS COMPATIBLE WITH AGENCY AND DEPARTMENTAL MISSIONS, AUTHORITIES, PRIOR-
51 ITIES, AND BUDGET RESOURCES, PARTICIPATE WITH SUCH BODIES IN THE DEVEL-
52 OPMENT OF TECHNICAL STANDARDS.

53 S 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
