AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to Medicaid payments to free-standing clinics licensed pursuant to article thirty-one of the mental hygiene law

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (e) of subdivision 2-a of 1 section 2807 of the public health law, as amended by section 15 of part C of chapter 58 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

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4 (ii) Notwithstanding this subdivision and any other contrary provision 5 law, the commissioner may incorporate within the payment methodology of described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph payment for services 6 7 provided by facilities pursuant to licensure under the mental hygiene law, provided, however, that such APG payment methodology may be phased 8 9 into effect in accordance with a schedule or schedules as jointly deter-10 mined by the commissioner, the commissioner of mental health, the commissioner of alcoholism and substance abuse services, and the commis-11 sioner of mental retardation and developmental disabilities. 12 NOTWITH-13 STANDING ANY CONTRARY PROVISION OF LAW, ANY SUCH APG PAYMENT OR ANY OTHER NEW PAYMENT METHODOLOGY ESTABLISHED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE 14 OF THE CHAPTER OF THE LAWS OF TWO THOUSAND TEN THAT AMENDED THIS SUBPAR-15 16 AGRAPH, FOR FREE-STANDING CLINICS LICENSED PURSUANT TΟ ARTICLE THE MENTAL HYGIENE LAW SHALL INCLUDE ENHANCED REIMBURSE-THIRTY-ONE 17 OF 18 MENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED TO INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN WHO 19 SERIOUSLY EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED AND INDIVIDUALS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF ARE 20 AGE AND OLDER WHO HAVE A SERIOUS AND PERSISTENT MENTAL ILLNESS. INDIVID-21 UALS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN WHO ARE SERIOUSLY EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED INDIVIDUALS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER WHO HAVE A SERIOUS AND 22 AND PERSISTENT MENTAL ILLNESS SHALL MEAN 23 INDIVIDUALS WHO MEET CRITERIA 24 DEFINED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF MENTAL HEALTH IN REGULATION.

25 2. Paragraph (e) of subdivision 2-a of section 2807 of the public S 26 health law is amended by adding a new subparagraph (iii) to read as follows: 27

(III) THE COMMISSIONER OF MENTAL HEALTH, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 1 COMMISSIONER, SHALL PROVIDE INITIAL AND CONTINUING REPORTS TO THE GOVER-2 NOR, TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE, 3 4 SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, AND MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY ON THE 5 IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED APG PAYMENT METHODOLOGY OR ANY OTHER NEW PAYMENT METHODOLOGY ESTABLISHED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBPARA-6 7 GRAPH ON FREE-STANDING CLINICS LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE 8 OF THE MENTAL HYGIENE LAW.

(A) THE INITIAL REPORT SHALL BE PROVIDED PRIOR TO THE IMPLEMENTATION 9 10 OF ANY APG PAYMENT RATES OR ANY OTHER NEW PAYMENT METHODOLOGY ESTAB-LISHED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH FOR 11 FREE-STANDING CLINICS LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE OF THE 12 MENTAL HYGIENE LAW AND SHALL INCLUDE AN ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL IMPACT 13 14 ON SUCH CLINICS, INCLUDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT LOSSES AND GAINS FOR EACH CLINIC AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED APG PAYMENT METHODOLOGY AND THE 15 16 POTENTIAL IMPACT ON ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES BY PATIENTS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN WHO 17 18 ARE SERIOUSLY EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED AND INDIVIDUALS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF 19 AGE AND OLDER WHO HAVE A SERIOUS AND PERSISTENT MENTAL ILLNESS.

20 (B) AN ANNUAL REPORT SHALL BE PROVIDED ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 21 THIRTY-FIRST OF EACH YEAR THEREAFTER ON THE IMPACT OF THE APG PAYMENT 22 METHODOLOGY OR ANY OTHER NEW PAYMENT METHODOLOGY ESTABLISHED ON OR AFTER 23 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH ON FREE-STANDING CLINICS LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE OF THE MENTAL HYGIENE LAW. SUCH 24 25 REPORT SHALL INCLUDE AN ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL IMPACT ON SUCH CLIN-ICS, INCLUDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PAYMENT LOSSES AND GAINS FOR EVERY 26 INDIVIDUAL CLINIC AFFECTED BY THE APG PAYMENT METHODOLOGY, THE POTENTIAL 27 IMPACT ON ACCESS TO MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES BY PATIENTS, INCLUDING BUT 28 NOT LIMITED TO INDIVIDUALS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN WHO ARE SERIOUSLY 29 EMOTIONALLY DISTURBED AND INDIVIDUALS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER 30 WHO HAVE A SERIOUS AND PERSISTENT MENTAL ILLNESS, AND MEASUREMENT OF ANY 31 32 SHIFT OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES FROM FREE-STANDING CLINICS LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE OF THE MENTAL HYGIENE LAW TO HOSPITAL 33 34 EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS AND INPATIENT HOSPITAL SETTINGS.
